#### responsible

adj. answerable or accountable for something within one's power, control, or management

synonym: accountable, answerable, liable

#### plot

 a secret plan or scheme to achieve a specific goal; the plan or main story of a literary work; (verb) to plan secretly, usually something illegal

synonym: scheme, plan, design

The **plot** of the novel centers around a group of friends who uncover a conspiracy to control the world's water supply.

#### statistics

- n. the discipline that concerns the collection, organization, analysis, interpretation, and presentation of data
- (1) statistics for cancer, (2) official statistics

The **statistics** demonstrate that poverty and unemployment are genuine problems.

#### combine

- to join or merge to form a single thing or group synonym: coalesce, cohere, blend
- (1) **combine** chemically with another substance,
- (2) **combine** augmented reality

Hydrogen and oxygen **combine** to form water.

### arresting

adj. attracting attention or interest; striking or impressive in appearance or effect; halting or stopping the movement or progress of something

synonym: striking, impressive, captivating

(1) an arresting image, (2) an arresting sight

The painting's **arresting** beauty made it difficult to look away.

### corruptible

adj. capable of being made to do something dishonest or immoral

synonym: bribable, dishonest, venal

(1) **corruptible** officials, (2) **corruptible** judges

Bureaucracies are more **corruptible** than other systems or organizations.

### politician

a person who is a member of a government or law-making organization, especially as an elected member of parliament, etc.

synonym: congressperson, lawmaker, legislator

- (1) a **politician** in the ruling party, (2) a corrupt **politician** The **politician** lost his position in the end due to the scandal.
- a group of people who organize and engage in criminal activity

synonym: crew, posse, group

(1) a motorcycle gang, (2) gang member

The street **gang** was known for its violent behavior.

#### crooked

adj. not straight or aligned; bent or curved to one side; not honest or fair; characterized by deception, fraud, or wrongdoing; irregular, uneven, or jagged in shape or form

synonym: bent, curved, twisted

The table leg was **crooked**, causing all the cups to slide to one side.

elect

v. to choose someone for a specific position by voting for them; to decide or choose to do something

*synonym*: select, choose, prefer

(1) **elect** the school board, (2) **elect** death

Every five years, the provincial governors are **elected**.

pursue

v. to do something or attempt to attain something over time; to follow or seek someone or something, especially in trying to catch them

synonym: seek, hunt, chase

(1) pursue a goal, (2) pursue freedoms

She intends to **pursue** a political career.

consume

v. to spend something, especially fuel, energy, or time, in a large amount

synonym: absorb, ingest, use up

(1) **consume** a large of alcohol, (2) **consume** electricity

A smaller car will **consume** less fuel.

bureau

 an office or agency that specializes in a particular type of work, often related to collecting or compiling data or information

synonym: agency, department, office

(1) bureau of statistics, (2) travel bureau

I went to the **bureau** of motor vehicles to renew my driver's license.

domestic

adj. relating to or inside a particular country, not foreign or international

*synonym*: endemic, private, household

(1) domestic airline, (2) a domestic animal

GDP stands for gross **domestic** product.

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#### terrorism

- n. the use of violence to attain political or religious goals or to compel a government to act
- (1) **terrorism** against civilians, (2) anti- **terrorism** bill Democracy is utterly opposed to any form of **terrorism**.

#### fraud

 the crime of gaining money or financial benefits by deceiving people; a person who makes deceitful pretenses

synonym: trickery, deceit, blackmail

get money by fraud, (2) victim of fraud
 The police arrested them for committing insurance fraud.

### corruption

 dishonest, harmful, or illegal behavior, especially of people in positions of power

synonym: depravity, bribery, degeneration

(1) **corruption** accusation, (2) federal **corruption** charges Rampant **corruption** led to a loss of trust in the government.

#### tradition

 a belief, custom, or way of doing something that has been passed down from generation to generation within a group or society

synonym: custom, practice, ritual

a tradition of a culture, (2) against tradition
 a tradition in many families to have a big Thanksgiving dinner with all their relatives.

#### criminal

- n. a person who has committed a crimesynonym: offender, lawbreaker, delinquent
- (1) wanted **criminal**, (2) **criminal** investigation The police are searching for the **criminal** who stole the jewels.

### prosecution

n. the act of bringing legal charges against someone for a crime they are accused of committing; the legal team responsible for presenting the case against the defendant in a criminal trial

synonym: trial, lawsuit, legal action

#### conclude

v. to come to an end or close; to reach a judgment or opinion by reasoning

#### marathon

- n. a long-distance race of 42.195 kilometers synonym: endurance, race, event

#### bomb

 a weapon that explodes and is used to kill or injure people or to cause damage to something

synonym: missile, explosive, ammunition

(1) atomic **bombs**, (2) disarm the **bomb**The use of cluster **bombs** is strictly prohibited by international law.

#### brag

v. to say something in a boastful manner, to impress others, or make oneself feel superior

synonym: boast, swagger, vaunt

foil

n. a thin and flexible sheet of metal, such as aluminum, used for wrapping or covering items; a literary device in which a character's actions or words are used to contrast or highlight the actions or words of another character; (verb) to prevent someone from succeeding in their plans or actions

synonym: enhancer, transparency, (verb) curb

#### arrest

- v. to take into custodysynonym: capture, detain, imprison
- (1) arrest the thief, (2) arrest the progressA police officer has the authority to arrest a criminal.

### aggressive

- adj. behaving in an angry, energetic, or threatening way towards another person; tending to spread quicklysynonym: assertive, combative, threatening
- (1) an **aggressive** war, (2) an **aggressive** tumor An **aggressive** tide wrecked the ship.

#### undercover

- adj. carried out or conducted in secret, with one's true identity or purpose concealed; disguised, incognitosynonym: covert, hidden, stealthy
- (1) **undercover** operation, (2) **undercover** journalist The **undercover** police officer was able to gather crucial evidence without being detected.

### sting

v. to cause a sharp, painful sensation or injury with a poison, venom, or other substance or by a physical action such as a bite or prick

synonym: bite, prick, poke

(1) **sting** me on the arm, (2) **sting** his face
Bees **sting** as a defense mechanism when they feel threatened.

#### opportune

- adj. suitable or happening at a time that is suitable or convenient for a particular purpose
- synonym: suitable, timely, practical
- (1) **opportune** occasion, (2) an **opportune** remark The phone rang at the most **opportune** time.

#### economical

- adj. providing a satisfactory return on the money, time, or effort; not using more money, fuel, etc. than necessarysynonym: frugal, thrifty, parsimonious
- (1) **economical** use of her time, (2) an **economical** meal It is more **economical** to wash your plastic bottle and reuse it.

### desperate

- adj. feeling or showing a lack of hope and a willingness to do anything because of the problematic situationsynonym: anguish, frantic, hopeless
- (1) her **desperate** screams, (2) **desperate** attempt He was **desperate** when he lost all his money by gambling.

#### edict

- n. an official order or command issued by a ruler or government; a formal or authoritative proclamationsynonym: decree, order, command
- (1) religious **edict**, (2) royal **edict**The **edict** issued by the king had to be obeyed by all his subjects.

#### soil

- n. the top layer of Earth in which plants grow synonym: earth, ground, mud
- (1) **soils** retentive of moisture, (2) parched **soil Soil** moisture is another significant component controlling soil respiration.

#### strike

- v. to wallop somebody or something with the hand, fist, or weapon; to have an emotional or cognitive impact upon synonym: hit, impact, influence
- strike up a conversation, (2) strike a blow
   we strike to achieve more wages and safer working conditions.

#### recruit

v. to persuade someone to work for a company; to find new members for an organization, the armed forces, etc.synonym: raise, enroll, enlist (1) recruit a good worker, (2) recruit a new hire

The colonial government **recruited** militia support when civil war broke out.

#### nationwide

adj. extending throughout an entire nation synonym: countrywide, national

(1) **nationwide** strike, (2) **nationwide** network

This is a **nationwide** campaign to recruit women into trade unions.

con

 an argument opposed to a proposal; a swindle in which you cheat at gambling or persuade a person to buy worthless property; (verb) to be against or opposed to something

synonym: oppose, objection, deception

(1) telemarketing **cons**, (2) the pros and **cons** 

The **con** artist convinced the older woman to give him her life savings.

spy

 a person who is employed or trained to observe or gather information in secret, often for military or political purposes; a person who secretly or illegally gathers information about a private individual or organization

synonym: agent, undercover operative

(1) **spy** cameras, (2) digital **spy** tools

The government recruited a **spy** to gather information on a suspected terrorist cell

communal

adj. belonging to or used by a group rather than individuals;for common use

synonym: collaborative, combined, collective

(1) **communal** swimming pool, (2) **communal** combination of funds

**Communal** elections were held in several European countries.

nab

v. to catch someone in the act of doing something wrong or illegal

*synonym*: catch, apprehend, arrest

(1) **nab** traffic offender, (2) **nab** the opportunity

The police were able to **nab** the thief before he could escape.

huff

 a fit of anger, annoyance, or resentment; a state of irritation or sulking; (verb) to exhale forcefully or audibly in a show of annoyance, anger, or frustration

*synonym*: miff, tantrum, indignation

huff and puff upstairs, (2) give a huff of relief
 She let out a huff of frustration after the difficult workout.

gasoline

 a volatile flammable liquid obtained from petroleum, used mainly as a fuel in car engines, etc.

synonym: gas, petrol, fuel

(1) lead-free **gasoline**, (2) small **gasoline** engine Luxury cars often require high-octane **gasoline** as fuel.

attempt

an act or effort of trying to do something, especially something difficult

synonym: endeavor, effort, try

(1) the **attempt** to rescue the hostages, (2) a reckless **attempt** 

The third attempt was far more successful.

suicide

n. the act of killing yourself intentionallysynonym: self-destruction, self-annihilation, felo-de-se

(1) commit suicide, (2) suicide attack

In an economically prosperous country, most male **suicide** is due to child support problems.

schizoaffective

adj. of or relating to a mental disorder characterized by a combination of schizophrenia symptoms, such as hallucinations, delusions, or disorganized thinking, and mood disorder symptoms, such as depression or mania

synonym: psychotic, mood disorder, mental illness

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(1) treatment for **schizoaffective**, (2) **schizoaffective** symptoms

**Schizoaffective** disorder is a mental illness characterized by symptoms of both schizophrenia and mood disorders.

#### disorder

 an untidy state or a lack of organization; a physical condition or illness that causes problems with how a section of the body or brain functions

synonym: chaos, disturbance, disease

(1) the files are in complete **disorder**, (2) people with bipolar **disorder** 

The doctor prescribed some medicine for the mental **disorder**.

### distinguish

v. to notice or understand the difference between two people or things

synonym: determine, differentiate, characterize

(1) **distinguish** these two things, (2) **distinguish** man from the other animals

This study **distinguished** four different ways to run a business.

### fantasy

a fiction with a large amount of imagination in it; a
pleasant situation that you imagine but that is unlikely to
happen

synonym: fiction, illusion, fabrication

(1) **fantasy** novel, (2) confuse **fantasy** with reality Composition by artificial intelligence is no longer a **fantasy**.

### conspire

v. to plan or plot together secretly, especially with an evil or unlawful purpose

synonym: plot, scheme, collude

(1) **conspire** his ruin, (2) **conspire** to corner the market The group of friends **conspired** to pull a prank on their teacher.

### military

adj. relating to or characteristic of members of the armed forces; of or relating to war or warfare

synonym: armed, martial, warlike

(1) a **military** operation, (2) a **military** leader

The **military** academy was known for its strict discipline and training.

#### convict

- v. to prove or declare someone to be guilty of a crime; (noun) a person serving a sentence in a jail or prison synonym: condemn, sentence, judge
- (1) **convict** him of manslaughter, (2) **convict** in a jail He was **convicted** on fraud charges and sentenced to five years in prison.

### rap

 a type of music characterized by a strong, repetitive beat and lyrics that often focus on social and political issues; a reproach for some lapse or misdeed

synonym: hip-hop, emceeing, MCing

(1) rap music, (2) get a rap

The new rap album is getting a lot of attention.

#### molest

v. to harass, bother, or annoy someone, often sexually; to touch or handle someone in an unwelcome or inappropriate way

synonym: harass, harm, abuse

(1) **molest** a woman on a train, (2) sexually **molest** his stepchild

The organization campaigns for stricter penalties for those who **molest** children.

flee

v. to leave by running away, especially out of fear or danger

synonym: exit, escape, run away

(1) **flee** their homes, (2) **flee** abroad

It is a basic instinct to **flee** from a dangerous situation.

#### murder

- n. the crime of killing somebody intentionally synonym: slaying, killing
- (1) **murder** in the second degree, (2) attempted **murder** This intriguing **murder** mystery remains unsolved.

### synagogue

n. (also "shul") a Jewish house of worship, typically consisting of a hall for prayer and study and often containing a sanctuary, a social hall, and a collection of administrative offices

synonym: temple, shul, tabernacle

(1) reconstructed **synagogue**, (2) historical **synagogue** We attended services at the local **synagogue** during the High Holidays.

#### defendant

 a person or party who is accused of a crime or who is being sued in a court of law

synonym: accused, prisoner, litigant

(1) **defendant** in court, (2) the **defendant's** testimony The **defendant's** lawyer argued that his client was not responsible for the crime.

### employee

- n. a person who is hired to work for a business or organization in exchange for wages or salary; a worker synonym: worker, staff, personnel
- (1) **employee** benefits, (2) **employee** evaluation
  The **employee** handbook outlines the rules and regulations that all employees must follow.

### participate

- v. to take part in somethingsynonym: take part, partake, enter
- (1) **participate** fully in conversation, (2) **participate** in the program

The majority of students actively **participated** in the college's intramural sports program.

### intercept

v. to stop and catch someone or something to prevent them from continuing to a destination

synonym: ambush, block, prevent

(1) **intercept** an enemy force, (2) **intercept** X rays It is illegal to **intercept** police radio.

#### involve

v. to include or affect someone or something as a necessary part of something else

synonym: implicate, include, engage

(1) **involve** a lot of paperwork, (2) **involve** a high degree of risk

The investigation **involves** several government agencies and is expected to take several months.

#### nonetheless

adv. in spite of what has just been said or done; nevertheless synonym: nevertheless, regardless, still

(1) we are **nonetheless** confident, (2) love him **nonetheless** 

They each choose **nonetheless** to battle.

#### introduction

a preliminary explanation or remarks given before the start of a text, performance, or event; the act of bringing something new into existence or introducing something to a wider audience or new market

synonym: initiation, preamble, prologue

- (1) introduction education, (2) self- introduction
  The introduction to the new class was informative and engaging.
- v. to present a risk, problem, or other issues that must be addressed

synonym: present, put, position

(1) **pose** a significant threat to my company, (2) **pose** a challenge

The chemicals **pose** a massive health risk.

lure

pose

v. to tempt or persuade someone to do something synonym: tempt, entice, attract

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(1) **lure** prey, (2) **lure** foreign investment

The salesperson used a special offer to **lure** customers into buying the product.

blur

 a faint or indistinct image or sound; something that is not clear or distinct; (verb) to become unclear; to lose clear vision

synonym: smudge, smear, fuzz

(1) blur image, (2) motion blur

The camera's focus was off, and the image was a **blur** of colors and shapes.

equip

 to provide a person or a place with the things that are needed for a particular purpose or activity

*synonym*: prepare, furnish, provide

(1) **equip** an army, (2) **equip** our children with some special skills

The construction company **equipped** the building with an earthquake-resistant device.

farce

 a type of comedy that relies on ridiculous situations, improbable coincidences, and exaggerated characters to provide humor

synonym: comedy, parody, spoof

(1) sports **farce**, (2) theatrical **farce** 

The political scandal was like a **farce** straight out of a TV sitcom.

judge

 a person who makes decisions in a court of law; (verb) to determine the result of or form a critical opinion of something

synonym: arbiter, justice, (verb) deduce

(1) judge a competition, (2) an associate judge

The strict judge ruled in favor of the plaintiff in the case.

conversation

*n*. an informal talk between two or more people to exchange their views, ideas, information, etc.

synonym: chat, discussion, dialogue

(1) **conversation** in English, (2) a friendly **conversation** Your **conversation** reflects your thoughts.

#### sealed

adj. closed or secured with synonym: closed, impenetrable

(1) **sealed** orders, (2) **sealed** jar

We packed and shipped the product in **sealed** containers.

### transcript

 a written or printed version of something, especially a dictated or recorded speech, interview, or conversation; an official record of a student's coursework and grades at a school or university

*synonym*: record, certificate, report

(1) academic **transcript**, (2) official **transcript**The court reporter was responsible for creating a **transcript** of the trial proceedings.

### squad

- n. a small group of people organized for a particular purpose, especially a military one or a sports team synonym: team, unit, group
- (1) a bomb-disposal **squad**, (2) antiriot **squad**The police department assembled a special **squad** to handle the situation.

### supervisor

- n. a person who oversees or directs the work of otherssynonym: manager, boss, overseer
- supervisor of elections, (2) immediate supervisor
   have to check with my supervisor before making any changes.

#### would-be

adj. indicating a person who aspires or attempts to be something but has not yet achieved that status or position

synonym: aspiring, wannabe, potential

(1) **would-be** actor, (2) **would-be** entrepreneur

The **would-be** burglar was caught on the security camera and arrested by the police.

#### retarded

adj. (considered derogatory) delayed or impeded in intellectual or emotional development; slow to learnsynonym: delayed, impeded, slow

(1) retarded growth, (2) retarded child

The project was delayed due to some technical problems, and it was considered **retarded**.

#### ambition

- n. a strong wish to do or achieve somethingsynonym: purpose, aim, endeavor
- (1) an **ambition** for political power, (2) boundless **ambition** Greed and **ambition** composed his personality.

### wishy-washy

adj. lacking firmness or clarity; indecisive or uncertain; weak or ineffective in character, resulting in a lack of conviction or clear direction

synonym: indecisive, namby-pamby, undecided

(1) **wishy-washy** response, (2) a **wishy-washy** policy The politician's **wishy-washy** stance on the issue left voters feeling uncertain.

#### scenario

- n. a description of possible actions or events in the future;a written outline of a play, film, or literary worksynonym: plan, scheme, procedure
- (1) the worst case **scenario**, (2) number of different **scenarios**

The president prepared several possible **scenarios** for an enemy attack.

### martyrdom

n. the act or experience of suffering or dying for a cause, belief, or principle, which often implies sacrifice and is associated with individuals who endure persecution or hardship due to their convictions

synonym: calvary, sacrifice, self-sacrifice

(1) martyrdom stories, (2) religious martyrdom

Many individuals have died as a result of their **martyrdom** for their beliefs.

cab

 a taxi or other vehicle that can be hired for transportation; the compartment from which a vehicle, such as a train or truck, is driven

synonym: taxi, hack, cabriolet

(1) taxi cab, (2) yellow cab

I hailed a **cab** to take me to the airport.

### government

 the group of people with authority to control a country or state

synonym: administration, regime, state

(1) **government** bureaucracy, (2) **government** funding The federal **government** is planning to increase taxes for the next fiscal year.

#### terror

- intense fear; a state of intense fear or alarmsynonym: fear, alarm, horror
- (1) **terror** attack, (2) **terror** group

The bomb blast spread **terror** among the people.

#### nation

 a large organized community of people living in a particular country or region and having a particular culture

synonym: country, state, sovereign entity

(1) nation-state, (2) a seafaring nation

The **nation** of Japan is known for its unique culture and advanced technology.

### unwitting

adj. without purpose or intent

synonym: unknowledgeable, inadvertent, unintended

(1) **unwitting** victims, (2) an **unwitting** mistake

His rudeness was **unwitting**, not intentional.

### choreograph

v. to compose a sequence of dance steps, often to music

(1) **choreograph** a stage performance, (2) exquisitely **choreographed** 

He had **choreographed** the dance in this play himself.

#### accusation

 a statement or claim alleging that someone has committed a crime, offense, or wrongdoing; a charge or indictment made against someone

synonym: charge, indictment, imputation

(1) criminal accusation, (2) false accusation

The **accusation** of theft was unfounded, and the suspect was eventually cleared of all charges.

### grant

v. to agree to give or allow somebody

synonym: allocate, authorize, give

(1) grant a new license, (2) grant a land

The chairperson **granted** him the right to speak.

### investigate

v. to conduct a systematic or formal inquiry to identify and evaluate the facts of a crime, problem, statement, etc. to establish the truth

synonym: examine, analyze, look into

(1) **investigate** the matter, (2) **investigate** a data leak The committee **investigated** several apparent inconsistencies.

#### assistant

someone who helps or supports someone else to do a job

synonym: aide, helper, associate

(1) an unwilling **assistant**, (2) **assistant** professor

An executive **assistant** director administers each branch.

#### database

- n. a large amount of data stored in a computer system in such a way that it can be searched and updated easily
- (1) **database** administrator, (2) employee **database**Each country's officials can access the central **database**.

### provocateur

 a person who deliberately behaves in a way to provoke or challenge others, often to incite strong reactions or controversy

synonym: inciter, agitator, instigator

(1) political **provocateur**, (2) social media **provocateur** The movie director is considered a **provocateur** for his controversial films that often address taboo subjects.

#### submit

v. to give or offer a document, proposal, etc. to a decision-maker for examination or consideration

synonym: hand in, present, propose

(1) agree to **submit** the bill, (2) **submit** an application Please **submit** the assignment to me.

### journalism

 the profession or activity of writing or reporting news for publication or broadcast

synonym: reporting, news media, writing

(1) **journalism** ethics, (2) tabloid **journalism**She plans to study **journalism** in college and become a reporter.

#### cofounder

- one of several people who establishes an organization or starts a business
- (1) cofounder of the university, (2) late cofounderHe is the cofounder and chairman of this tech company.

#### lever

 a handle used to operate a vehicle or a machine; a rigid bar resting on a pivot so that one end of it can be pushed or pulled easily

synonym: lifter, crowbar, bar

(1) a gear change lever,(2) lever for reformThis initiative will be a lever for increasing company sales.

leak

to allow liquid or gas to get in or out from a hole or crack in a pipe or container

synonym: outflow, divulge, disclose

(1) leak data, (2) leak a classified memo

He **leaked** serious accounting irregularities that only people in the company's executive could know.

#### claim

v. to assert that something is true; to demand or request something as one's own; to lay legal or moral right to something; (noun) a demand or assertion of a right or something that one believes to be true

synonym: assert, declare, maintain

(1) claim responsibility, (2) false claim

He wants to **claim** ownership of the abandoned property.

#### release

- v. to set free or allow to escape from confinement synonym: free, let go, discharge
- (1) **release** a prisoner, (2) **release** CO2 into the air The animal rights group worked to **release** the dolphins back into the wild.

### irreparable

adj. not able to be repaired or fixed; beyond repair or remedysynonym: irreversible, permanent, unfixable

(1) **irreparable** harm, (2) **irreparable** loss Unfortunately, the damage to the car was **irreparable**, and it

had to be scrapped.

### damage

v. to harm or cause injury to something or someone, often resulting in decreased value or functionality; to impair or negatively affect something, such as a reputation or relationship; (noun) harm or injury that is caused to a person, thing, or entity

synonym: harm, impair, injure

(1) **damage** a relationship, (2) **damage** assessment During the surgery, the doctor had to be extremely cautious not to **damage** a blood vessel.

#### enforcement

n. the act of ensuring that rules, regulations, or laws are obeyed or implemented; the act of applying force or pressure to compel compliance with rules or laws

synonym: implementation, application, execution

(1) **enforcement** action, (2) **enforcement** officer

The **enforcement** of the new traffic laws led to a decrease in accidents.

#### strategy

 a detailed plan of action designed to achieve a long-term or overall goal.
