inject

 to put a liquid such as a drug or other substance into a person's or an animal's body using a needle and syringe (= small tube)

counterintuitive

adj. contrary to what common sense would suggest *synonym*: unreasonable, paradoxical, nonsensical

parachute

- n. a device used to slow the motion of people or objects through an atmosphere consisting of a large piece of thin cloth that is attached to them and opens out in the air

catheter

 a thin, flexible tube that is inserted into a body cavity, duct, or vessel to drain fluid, inject medication, or perform a medical procedure

synonym: tube, drainage tube, pipe

After the surgery, the patient was required to wear a **catheter** for several days.

metastatic

adj. used to describe cancer cells that have spread from the primary site of origin to other parts of the body through the bloodstream or lymphatic system

synonym: spreading, invasive, secondary

biodegrade
