subordinate

synonym: inferior, secondary, subservient

proficient

adj. having a high level of skill or knowledge in a particular area

synonym: expert, skilled, adept

v. to say or speak (a word or words) correctly or in a particular way

synonym: articulate, enunciate, voice

hemisphere

converse

- a cell that is specialized to carry information within the brain and between the brain and other parts of the body synonym: nerve cell

synapse

- the fact or state of failing to finish an activity and of stopping using, making, or doing it
- (1) synapse circuit, (2) end at a synapse Animals transmit nerve impulses through **synapses**.

Alzheimer

- a neurodegenerative disease that causes memory loss, cognitive decline, and behavioral issues; is the most common cause of dementia in older adults
- synonym: dementia, memory loss, cognitive decline
- (1) Alzheimer's brain, (2) Alzheimer's risk factors My grandmother has **Alzheimer's** disease requires special care and attention from her caregivers.

dementia

- a severe decline in cognitive function, especially memory, as a result of disease or injury synonym: cognitive decline, memory loss, Alzheimer's disease
- (1) dementia patients, (2) probably have dementia The study found that regular exercise can help to prevent the onset of **dementia** in older age.

dorsolateral

- adj. relating to or situated on the back and side of something, particularly a body part, such as the dorsolateral prefrontal cortex, which is a region of the brain involved in higher cognitive functions synonym: side, lateral, flanking
- (1) dorsolateral pathway, (2) dorsolateral approach The **dorsolateral** prefrontal cortex is responsible for executive functions such as decision-making and

problem-solving.
