lottery

trap

conventional

assume

 to think or accept something to be true without having proof of it; to take or begin to have power; to begin to exhibit a specific quality or appearance

synonym: guess, presume, suppose

(1) **assume** a lousy attitude to his boss, (2) **assume** an important role

The following example **assumes** that the capacity of each battery is the same.

flexible

adj. able to change or be changed to suit new conditions or situations; able to bend easily

synonym: adaptable, elastic, pliable

economy

n. the system by which a country or region produces manages, and distributes goods and services, including the money and finances involved in these activities; (of an airline) the lowest-priced, most basic option for seating in commercial travel

opposition

the act of disagreeing or resisting; the state of strong disagreement

intent

exposed

mist

threat

rap

denial

obvious

bust

incentive

threaten

 to utter intentions of injury or punishment against someone

synonym: endanger, terrorize, intimidate

confident

adj. feeling sure about your abilities or qualities or having trust in people, plans, or the future

synonym: certain, sure, convinced

prohibition

n. the act of not allowing something, or an order that does so, especially by law or authority

synonym: banning, forbidding, restriction

detection

 the act of discovering or identifying the presence of something

stack

 a pile of something arranged or laid one on top of another; a large tall chimney through which combustion gases and smoke can be evacuated

synonym: accumulation, heap, pile

vicious

adj. having or showing a desire to cause harm to others; having the nature of vice

synonym: malicious, spiteful, malevolent

patch

 a small piece of material or fabric used to repair or reinforce a tear, hole, or damaged area; a small plot of land used for cultivation or a specific purpose

normally

adv. usually; under normal conditions

descry

v. to catch sight of or discover something, especially something that is difficult to see or perceive

pimp

 a person, typically a man, who lives off the earnings of a prostitute or sex worker

oxygen

- the chemical element with the symbol O that is present in air and water and is necessary for people, animals, and plants to live

abusive

 adj. involving or characterized by harmful or offensive treatment, language, or behavior; using physical, emotional, or verbal force to control or harm someone else

withhold

decision

 the act or process of making up someone's mind about something; a choice or judgment reached after considering options

afford

- v. to have enough money or time to be able to buy or do something
- (1) **afford** to buy a new car, (2) **afford** a high travel cost He cannot **afford** a holiday.

commerce

the activity of buying and selling things, especially on a large scale

synonym: trade, transaction, dealings

designate

v. to indicate, specify, or name someone or something for a particular purpose or job; to give a name or title to something

 a location or place where an event or activity takes place; a place where something happens or is performed
