equator

disparate

adj. very different or distinct from something else and is not connected or comparable in any way

synonym: different, distinct, separate

(1) **disparate** impact, (2) physically **disparate** location The organization worked to bring together **disparate** groups in the community.

turbulence

 a state of great disturbance, confusion, or uncertainty, often accompanied by violent or disruptive activity or behavior, such as air turbulence during a flight

synonym: choppiness, tumult, agitation

(1) financial **turbulence**, (2) emotional **turbulence**The ride on the rollercoaster was full of dips and turns, creating a feeling of **turbulence**.

tranquility

 a state of calmness or peacefulness; absence of agitation, disturbance, or turbulence; a peaceful or serene environment

synonym: calmness, serenity, peace

(1) the **tranquility** of the environment, (2) feeling of **tranquility**

She found **tranquility** by meditating in the garden.

devastation

 the act of causing great destruction or damage, often on a large scale

synonym: destruction, ruin, havoc

(1) financial **devastation**, (2) **devastation** to life
The economic recession caused **devastation** in the housing market, with many people losing their homes.

dedicate

to give all of your energy, time, etc., entirely to a specific person, activity, or cause; to set apart for a particular purpose or use

synonym: consecrate, devote, commit

(1) **dedicate** a few hours, (2) **dedicate** a chapter to the subject

He **dedicated** his life to helping others.

illuminating

adj. making something clear or easy to understand;providing light

synonym: enlightening, informative, clarifying

(1) **illuminating** light, (2) an **illuminating** answer The lecture was **illuminating** and gave me a new perspective on the topic.

pastel

 a soft and pale shade of a color, often used in art or fashion design; a type of crayon or pencil made of powdered pigment and binder, used for drawing or coloring

synonym: chalk, crayon, color stick

(1) **pastel** drawing, (2) **pastel** palette
Her artwork features soft **pastel** colors and dreamy landscapes.

cringe

 to move back or away from someone or something because you are afraid or shocked; to shrink as in fear, disgust, or embarrassment

synonym: shrink, cower, quiver

(1) **cringe** with fear, (2) **cringe** at the thought of an accident The dog **cringed** at its master voice.

iceberg

a large piece of ice floating in the sea, detached from a glacier

synonym: glacier, ice mass, floe

(1) hit an iceberg, (2) iceberg melting

The ship encountered a series of **icebergs** and had to change its course.

glassy

adj. resembling glass in appearance or texture; smooth, shiny, and hard

synonym: shiny, smooth, reflective

(1) glassy texture, (2) glassy appearance

The **glassy** surface of the lake reflected the colorful autumn leaves.

crayon

n. a stick of colored wax, charcoal, chalk, or other material used for drawing or coloring; (verb) to draw or color with crayons, which are sticks of colored wax, chalk, or charcoal used for drawing or coloring

synonym: chalk, pastel, (verb) draw

(1) crayon drawing, (2) crayon her coloring books

The teacher handed out several different colored **crayons** to each student.

propel

v. to move, drive or push something forward or in a particular direction, often with a lot of force

synonym: drive, push, move

(1) **propel** growth, (2) **propel** the ship

An increase in employment helps **propel** economic growth.

mushy

adj. soft and pulpy in texture or consistency, often describing food; emotionally sentimental or overly romantic in a way that can be seen as insincere or sickly sweet

synonym: sappy, sentimental

(1) mushy romance, (2) mushy peas

The cake was **mushy** because I accidentally added too much milk to the batter.

sled

 a vehicle used for traveling over snow or ice, typically consisting of a flat-bottomed frame mounted on runners, sometimes pulled by dogs or horses

synonym: sleigh, toboggan, sledge

(1) pull a **sled**, (2) **sled** dog

We used a **sled** to slide down the hill in the snow.

waver

fragility

synonym: delicacy, weakness, frailty

The **fragility** of the glass required careful handling during shipping.

grandeur

 the quality of being impressive or magnificent in appearance, size, or scope; the state of being majestic, impressive, or awe-inspiring

synonym: splendor, majesty, greatness

(1) natural grandeur, (2) lost in grandeur

The castle's **grandeur** was breathtaking, with its towering turrets and sweeping arches.

unseasonably

adv. in a way that is not usual, customary, or expected for a particular season; occurring at a time that is not typical or appropriate for the current season

synonym: unexpectedly, oddly, unusually

(1) unseasonably warm, (2) unseasonably mild

The **unseasonably** cold weather that arrived in the middle of spring affected the farmers' crops.

diminish

v. to reduce or be reduced in size, extent, or importance; to make something smaller, weaker, etc.

synonym: decline, dwindle, lessen

(1) diminish a reputation, (2) diminish swelling

As people get old, their energies may diminish.

glacier

 a slowly moving mass of ice formed from snow on mountains or near the North Pole or the South Pole

synonym: iceberg, ice floe

(1) glacier retreat, (2) glaciers move tardily

The **glaciers** of the ice age have shaped Fjord.

drown

v. to die or cause to die by being unable to breathe underwater

synonym: douse, drench, overwhelm

(1) **drown** in a bath, (2) I was **drowned** in work Floods have the potential to **drown** any subsurface animals easily.

scatter
