The new smartphone has a **whopping** 1TB of storage space.

#### diminish

v. to reduce or be reduced in size, extent, or importance; to make something smaller, weaker, etc.

synonym: decline, dwindle, lessen

(1) diminish a reputation, (2) diminish swelling

As people get old, their energies may **diminish**.

#### abundantly

adv. in large quantities; plentifully

synonym: plentifully, copiously, lavishly

(1) abundantly clear, (2) abundantly available

The policy change resulted in an **abundantly** positive outcome for the company.

#### barb

a sharp projection or point, often on a plant or animal; a cutting remark or criticism that is meant to hurt or insult; a type of fishing lure that has small hooks and a brightly colored feather or hair

synonym: spine, barbed remark, sting

(1) barb wire, (2) aim a barb

The politician's words were full of **barbs** designed to hurt his opponent.

#### industrious

adj. hardworking, diligent, and persistent in effort

synonym: diligent, hardworking, assiduous

#### gorilla

 a large, powerful, and intelligent primate found in the forests of central Africa, with coarse black or brown fur and a distinctive face

synonym: ape, chimpanzee, orangutan

(1) gorilla habitat, (2) endangered gorilla The **gorilla** at the zoo impressed visitors with its size and strength.

#### pretension

the act of claiming or asserting something, especially without good reason or without evidence; an unfounded or excessive claim or ambition

*synonym*: presumption, pretense, affectation

- (1) **pretension** to authority, (2) baseless **pretension** His **pretensions** of being a gourmet were quickly exposed when he could not identify basic herbs and spices.

synonym: covet, resent, grudge

#### smartphone

- a mobile phone that functions as a computer and connects to the Internet

synonym: promote, persuade

envy

#### escalator

#### belie

 to contradict or show to be false or untrue; to give a false impression or disguise the true nature of something

synonym: disprove, refute, contradict

The peaceful surroundings **belied** the danger lurking just around the corner.

#### barista

- a person who works in a coffee shop or café, typically making and serving coffee and other hot beverages
  synonym: coffee maker, coffee expert, espresso artist
- (1) **barista** skills, (2) professional **barista**The **barista** at my favorite coffee shop always makes the perfect latte.

#### underemployed

 adj. employed in a job that does not fully utilize one's skills, education, or experience; employed in a job that is below one's qualifications or aspirations

synonym: underutilized, unemployed, idle

(1) **underemployed** population, (2) **underemployed** graduates

The **underemployed** worker was grateful for any job opportunities that came their way

#### exorbitant

adj. excessively high or unreasonable, often referring to prices or fees

synonym: excessive, extravagant, overpriced

#### downright

#### cynical

adj. believing that people are motivated by self-interest; distrustful of human sincerity or integrity

synonym: skeptical, mistrustful, doubtful

He was very **cynical** and didn't believe anything anyone said unless he saw evidence for himself.

#### medicinal

adj. of or relating to the treatment or cure of diseasesynonym: curative, therapeutic, healing
