### bat

 a nocturnal animal with wings that flies and feeds at night, similar to a mouse; a piece of wood with a handle used for hitting the ball in sports including baseball, cricket, and table tennis

### monastery

 a building or complex of buildings in which members of a male religious community, called monks, live and worship

#### monk

 a member of a religious community of men living under vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience

### celebrate

#### architecture

the art and science of designing and constructing buildings

#### festival

 a celebration or event, usually marking a particular religious or cultural occasion, often involving processions, music, dancing, and the performance of plays or other artistic works synonym: fair, holiday, celebration

### pride

 a feeling of deep pleasure or satisfaction derived from one's achievements

### precious

### insist

### provision

 the act of providing or supplying something; a clause in a document or law that specifies a particular requirement or condition

### empower

### impeach

#### retire

v. to withdraw from one's position or occupation, especially because of age

### retirement

- n. the fact or act of stopping working and leaving one's job synonym: resignation, withdrawal, retreat

### peak

 n. the point to which something or someone is at its strongest, best, or most successful; the pointed top of a mountain

### biodiversity

- the number and variety of plants and animals that exist in a particular area or the world and make a balanced environment

### hotspot

### negative

### oxide

- a chemical compound that contains at least one oxygen atom and one other element
- (1) silver **oxide**, (2) combined **oxide**

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The blood's red coloring comes from iron **oxide**.

### sequester

v. to take temporary possession of someone's property until a debt is paid.

synonym: isolate, set apart, segregate

sink

v. to submerge or go down below the surface of a liquid or substance; to decline or deteriorate; to cause something to go down into a liquid substance or sink into something else

export

v. to send goods or services to another country for sale; to transfer electronic data out of a database or document in a format that other programs can use

synonym: ship, send, transfer

(1) export goods, (2) export the data

The country **exports** a large amount of agricultural products.

#### renewable

adj. capable of being renewed, extended, or replaced synonym: sustainable, replaceable

renewable energy, (2) renewable subscriptions
 The production of renewable fuels requires massive volumes

of fresh water.

## electrify

 to make a machine or system work by using electricity;
 to make someone extremely enthusiastic about or interested in something

synonym: wire, amaze, astonish

(1) **electrify** the audience, (2) **electrify** a manufacturing process

The product developed through years of research continues to **electrify** the market.

#### offset

v. to compensate for or counterbalance one influence against an opposing influence

synonym: balance, cancel out, countervail

(1) **offset** deposits and withdrawals, (2) **offset** a loss Strong growth in core business **offsets** losses in other business segments.

#### harness

v. to control and exploit the power of something, especially natural resources that produce energy; (noun) a set of narrow pieces of leather and metal that are used to control or hold in place a person, animal, or object

synonym: rein in, control, (noun) belt

(1) **harness** a horse to a carriage, (2) put a **harness** on my pet

People have been exploring ways to **harness** natural forces and resources since ancient times.

### hydropower

 n. electricity generated from the energy of moving water, usually using turbines and dams in rivers or other bodies of water

synonym: hydroelectricity, waterpower, hydro

(1) **hydropower** plant, (2) **hydropower** energy Many countries around the world have built dams to harness the power of **hydropower** for their energy needs.

glacier

 a slowly moving mass of ice formed from snow on mountains or near the North Pole or the South Pole synonym: iceberg, ice floe

melt

v. to turn from something solid into something soft or liquid as a result of heating

flash

a sudden intense burst of radiant energy; a momentary brightness

synonym: sparkle, gleam, glimmer

flood

a large amount of water flowing beyond its normal limits;
 an overwhelming number or amount

synonym: deluge, downpour, overflow

These heavy rains caused flash **floods** on several islands.

### landslide

 a large, sudden movement of a mass of rock, earth, or other material down a slope

synonym: avalanche, mudslide, rockfall

(1) landslide victory, (2) prevent a landslide

The massive **landslide** buried the small village under a thick layer of rock and dirt.

disaster

 an unexpected event or series of events that cause widespread damage, destruction, or loss of life

*synonym*: catastrophe, calamity, tragedy

(1) global **disaster**, (2) **disaster** recovery

The **disaster** response team worked around the clock to aid those affected by the earthquake.

### widespread

adj. existing or happening in various places or among many people

*synonym*: across-the-board, overall, general

(1) widespread use, (2) widespread fear of nuclear war In medieval times, death punishment was widespread and socially accepted.

### destruction

- n. the act of causing so much damage to somethingsynonym: devastation, annihilation, ruin
- (1) path of **destruction**, (2) cyclonic **destruction**The extinction of several subspecies has been linked to climate change and habitat **destruction**.

### stunning

- adj. causing a strong emotional reaction of admiration,surprise, or shock due to its beauty, rarity, or excellencesynonym: beautiful, breathtaking, magnificent
- (1) **stunning** beauty, (2) **stunning** disclosure The **stunning** sunset took everyone's breath away.

### solid

- adj. hard or firm; characterized by good substantial qualitysynonym: stable, reliable, hard
- (1) **solid** ally, (2) **solid** employment measures The **solid-state** of water is called ice.

### breach

 a break or opening, often in a wall or barrier, which enables passage or entry; a violation or infraction of a law, agreement, or duty, often resulting in legal action or punishment

synonym: violation, infraction, trespass

(1) security **breach**, (2) **breach** of privacy
The company's data **breach** compromised thousands of customers' personal information.

dam

 a wall constructed over a river to block the flow of water, mainly used to generate energy

synonym: barricade, barrier, embankment

(1) **dam-building** program, (2) **dam** collapsing The break in the **dam** threatened the valley.

wreak

v. to cause or bring about something, often as a result of harmful or destructive actions or events

synonym: cause, inflict, bring about

(1) wreak a lot of changes, (2) wreak further damage

The virus has **wreaked** havoc on the healthcare system, overwhelming hospitals and causing shortages of supplies.

#### havoc

 widespread destruction or devastation, often caused by natural disasters, war, or other violent events

synonym: destruction, devastation, ruin

(1) cause havoc, (2) play havoc in the mind

The storm wreaked **havoc** on the town, causing widespread damage and power outages.

### valley

 a long depression on the surface of the land, which typically contains a river

synonym: canyon, gorge, dale

The **valley** had received a mild snowfall the previous week.

#### contend

- v. to struggle to win or surmount something synonym: compete, oppose, argue

### contribute

#### brunt

### consequence

*n.* the outcome of a particular action or event, especially relative to an individual

*synonym*: result, impact, outcome

### landlocked

adj. referring to a country or region that is surrounded by land with no direct access to the sea or ocean

synonym: trapped, enclosed

(1) landlocked lake, (2) landlocked region

The **landlocked** country needed more access to ports and trade routes.

### government

 the group of people with authority to control a country or state

synonym: administration, regime, state

(1) **government** bureaucracy, (2) **government** funding The federal **government** is planning to increase taxes for the next fiscal year.

### argue

v. to express differing opinions or points of view, often in a heated or contentious manner; to present a case or reasoning to persuade or convince others

synonym: debate, dispute, quarrel

(1) argue a case, (2) argue passionately

The couple began to **argue** over which restaurant to go to for dinner.

#### blame

- v. to think or say that someone or something did something wrong or is responsible for something badsynonym: condemn, rebuke, find fault with

We **blamed** our impeded progress on lack of money.

#### announce

 to make something known or officially inform people about something

synonym: disclose, declare, broadcast

(1) **announce** candidacy, (2) **announce** the award winners The third season of the anime show has been **announced**.

### reiterate

v. to repeat something, typically for emphasis or clarity; to say or do something again and again

synonym: repeat, iterate, restate

(1) **reiterate** a point, (2) **reiterate** their commitment I need to **reiterate** the importance of submitting your report by the deadline.

### committed

adj. willing to put in a lot of effort, time, and energy into something; firmly believing in something

synonym: devoted, faithful, attached

(1) in a **committed** relationship, (2) strong and **committed** sales staff

Our company is strongly **committed** to meeting customers' needs.

### greenhouse

- n. a building with walls and roof made chiefly of transparent material, such as glass, for growing plants in synonym: conservatory
- (1) exotic plants in a **greenhouse**, (2) emissions of **greenhouse** gases

The **greenhouse** effect is a phenomenon that happens naturally.

#### emission

- n. the act of production or sending out gas, heat, light, etc.synonym: emanation, radiation, discharge
- (1) global **emissions** of greenhouse gases, (2) the **emission** of light

There are five distinct **emissions** at five unique wavelengths.

#### convention

 a large formal assembly of people who do a particular job or have a similar interest or of a political party; something regarded as a normative example

#### intent

 a strong determination or attention to do or achieve something; (adjective) having a strong determination to do or achieve something

#### commitment

 a promise or firm decision to do something or to behave in a certain way

synonym: burden, obligation, promise
