#### mastery

 complete control or power of something to dominate or defeat; great skill or knowledge in a particular subject or activity

synonym: proficiency, aptitude, domination

#### mindset

 the established set of attitudes or fixed ideas held by someone

*synonym*: attitude, ethos, mentality

# edgy

adj. being tense, nervous, or irritable; nervous, jittery behavior; having a provocative, unconventional, or avant-garde style or mentality

synonym: tense, nervous, anxious

(1) edgy haircut, (2) edgy fashion

I always feel **edgy** when I have to give a speech in front of a large crowd.



#### shepherd

a person who tends and guards sheep, especially in a rural area

synonym: herder, flock-keeper, sheepdog

(1) **shepherd** boy, (2) sheep without a **shepherd**The **shepherd's** dog helped keep the sheep in line and protect them from predators.

### exponent

n. a person who supports and promotes a particular theory, idea, or scheme; a numerical expression usually written as a superscript that indicates the number of times a given number or expression is to be multiplied by itself

*synonym*: advocate, representative, exponent

(1) **exponent** function, (2) the **exponent** of the free market The CEO is an **exponent** of innovation and encourages employees to think outside the box.

# logarithm

n. a mathematical function that indicates the power to which a fixed number (the base) must be raised to produce another given number expressed as an exponent

synonym: mathematical function, exponent, power

(1) **logarithm** function, (2) **logarithm** table

To solve this equation, you must take both sides' **logarithms**.

# trigonometry

n. a branch of mathematics that deals with the relationships and properties of triangles, including the angles and sides, as well as the calculations and measurements involving trigonometric functions such as sine, cosine, and tangent

synonym: math, geometry, calculation

(1) **trigonometry** principles, (2) solve **trigonometry** problems

In computer graphics, **trigonometry** functions are often used to calculate angles and distances between points.

# disengage

v. to withdraw or separate oneself from a situation or relationship

synonym:

## withdraw, separate, detach

disengage the clutch, (2) disengage socially
disengaged from the conversation and walked away.

#### constrain

grit

 to restrict or limit someone or something's freedom or ability to do something

synonym: restrict, limit, confine

- (1) **constrain** his freedom, (2) **constrain** information flow The political situation **constrained** the country's economic growth and foreign relations.
- very small pieces of stone or sand; mental toughness and determination or perseverance in the face of challenges or obstacles

synonym: determination, fortitude, courage

(1) **grit** determination, (2) **grit** washer She has a lot of **grit** and determination to succeed.

#### perseverance

 steadfastness in doing something despite difficulty or delay in achieving success

synonym: persistence, tenacity, determination

(1) unwavering **perseverance**, (2) dogged **perseverance**Despite facing numerous setbacks and obstacles, his **perseverance** and determination led him to success.

# skeptic

 a person who doubts or questions the truth of specific claims, beliefs, or doctrines, especially those in religion or the supernatural

synonym: doubter, disbeliever, questioner

(1) an ingrained **skeptic**, (2) climate **skeptic**He was a **skeptic** who doubted the existence of supernatural phenomena.

# impractical

adj. not sensible or useful for practical purposes; not likely to be effective in achieving an intended outcomesynonym: impracticable, unrealizable, unfeasible

### pessimistic

adj. tending to see the worst aspect of things or expecting the worst possible outcome

synonym: cynical, defeatist, despairing

She was unduly **pessimistic** about her future.

- n. a scientist who specializes in the field of physics

# bureaucracy

 a system of government in which most of the important decisions are made by state officials rather than by elected representatives

synonym: administration, government, system

(1) government **bureaucracy**, (2) arbitrary **bureaucracy**The bumbling **bureaucracy** made it difficult to get the permits we needed.

# aspiration

 a strong desire to achieve something; the action or process of drawing breath

synonym: ambition, inhalation, intake

(1) no **aspiration** for fame, (2) **aspiration** into the lungs He has an **aspiration** to become a doctor.

invert

to turn something upside down, inside out; to reverse the position, order, or relationship of something

synonym: turn upside down, reverse, flip

(1) invert a glass, (2) invert position

He decided to **invert** his investment portfolio, shifting from stocks to bonds.

# utopian

adj. ideal and perfect; relating to or resembling a utopia (= an ideal and perfect society)

synonym: idealistic, perfectionistic, unrealistic

(1) utopian society, (2) utopian goal

He had a utopian vision of a world without war.
