synonym: bogus, counterfeit, fraudulent

neurological

adj. of or relating to the science of neurology or the nervous system

synonym: nervous, neural, brain-related

(1) fever with **neurological** signs, (2) **neurological** symptoms

The patient was diagnosed with a **neurological** disorder affecting their motor skills.

educe

v. to bring out or develop something, especially information or ideas, from a source

synonym: extract, deduce, derive

(1) educe information, (2) educe meaning

Through careful analysis, the detective could d **educe** the truth from the witness.

neuron

 a cell that is specialized to carry information within the brain and between the brain and other parts of the body

synonym: nerve cell

callosum

- a large bundle of nerve fibers that connects the two hemispheres of the brain
