synonym: bet, venture, wager

#### enthusiast

- n. a person having a strong liking for somethingsynonym: buff, aficionado, devotee
- (1) classic car **enthusiasts**, (2) an **enthusiastic** response The country's economic situation has improved markedly due to reform **enthusiasts**.

#### **Jovian**

adj. relating to Jupiter or its characteristicssynonym: Jupiter, giant planet

(1) **Jovian** satellites, (2) **Jovian** planet
The **Jovian** moon Europa is believed to have an ocean beneath its icy surface.

sift

 to put flour, sugar, etc. through a sieve (= a utensil consisting of a wire or plastic mesh in a frame) to remove lumps or large particles

synonym: filter, go through, sieve

# asymmetric

 adj. lacking symmetry or balance; not corresponding in size, shape, or degree; characterized by an uneven or unequal distribution or arrangement

synonym: uneven, lopsided, unbalanced

(1) **asymmetric** warfare, (2) **asymmetric** information

The **asymmetric** design of the building made it stand out in the city skyline.

# superimpose

v. to place, layer, or overlay one thing on top of another, typically in such a way that both are still visible; to add or combine something additional into an existing structure, design, or system

synonym: overlay, impose, place over

(1) superimpose image, (2) superimpose text

The graphic designer will **superimpose** the logo over the image in the brochure.

#### astrophysics

- n. the branch of physics concerned with the study of the properties and behavior of celestial objects and the physical processes that govern the behavior and evolution of the universe
- (1) **astrophysics** research, (2) neutrino **astrophysics**He was studying **astrophysics** in an attempt to understand the origins of the universe.

#### firsthand

adv. from the source; directly; (adjective) received directly from a source

*synonym*: direct

The manager tried to hear customers' voices firsthand.

#### collide

to hit something violently when moving

synonym: clash, slam, contradict

(1) collide head-on, (2) collide in midair

The interests of the two countries **collide**.

#### swarm

 a group of many things, such as insects, fishes, etc., in the air or water or on the ground

*synonym*: horde, hive, throng

(1) a swarm of mosquitoes, (2) locust swarmA swarm of angry bees attacked because we had

approached the hive.

#### comet

 a celestial object consisting of a nucleus of ice and dust that goes around the sun

synonym: meteor, asteroid, meteoroid

(1) the surface of the **comet**, (2) **comet** Halley

The **comet's** bright tail could be seen in the night sky.

#### elliptical

adj. having the shape of an oval (= a closed plane curve);
 using a word or expression that is ambiguous or vague,
 especially to mislead or avoid committing oneself

synonym: oval, egg-shaped, oblong

The satellite's **elliptical** orbit made it appear to change its distance from earth.

#### contrived

### catchy

*adj.* pleasing and easy to remember; likely to attract attention *synonym*: captivating, haunting, memorable

#### acronym

 a word formed from the first letter of each word in a phrase, such as NASA (National Aeronautics and Space Administration) or AIDS (Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome)

synonym: abbreviation, initialism, shortcut

# wright

a person who makes or repairs something, especially a craftsman or artisan who works with wood or metal

synonym: builder, constructor, craftsman

She was a skilled **wright**, able to craft intricate pieces of furniture.

# tabby

 a type of domestic cat with a distinctive coat pattern of dark stripes or spots on a lighter background; (adjective) describing someone who is short and fat, plump, or round in shape

#### extraterrestrial

### observatory

- *n*. a building designed and equipped to observe the planets, the stars, the weather, etc.

## ginormous
