disengage

synonym: withdraw, separate, detach

reimburse

- v. to pay someone back for money that they have spent synonym: compensate, repay, refund
- (1) **reimburse** expenses, (2) **reimburse** money
 The insurance company will **reimburse** the cost of the damage caused by the storm.

frail

adj. weak, delicate, and easily broken or worn out; lacking physical, mental, or emotional strength

synonym: weak, delicate, fragile

(1) frail body, (2) frail condition

My grandfather's health has declined, and he is now quite frail.

improvisation

 the act of making something up on the spot or creating or performing something without preparation

synonym: spontaneity, ad-lib, extemporization

fascinate
