synonym: ambulance, air ambulance, medical evacuation

The injured hiker was airlifted to the hospital by a **medevac** helicopter.

medic

 a person trained to provide medical care, especially in an emergency

synonym: paramedic, medical professional

gunshot

n. the sound or act of firing a gun or other firearm, usually accompanied by a loud explosion and a projectile that is propelled toward the target

instruct

seize

spontaneously
