govern

bias

cure-all

 a remedy or treatment for all diseases and problems, regardless of their causes or symptoms

synonym: panacea, universal remedy, magic bullet

Some people view meditation as a **cure-all** for stress and anxiety.

imbalance

 a situation in which two or more things are not equal or equally treated

synonym: inequality, asymmetry, instability

abuse

- n. the use of something in an incorrect or harmful manner synonym: misuse, misconduct, vilification

arrangement

n. a plan or preparation for the future event; the action or process of placing things in a particular order

inherit

v. to receive money, property, or a title from someone after they have died

creep

reimagine
