## supercomputer

 a computer with a high level of computing power and speed, typically used for scientific or engineering computations that require immense amounts of data processing

synonym: high-performance computer, mainframe, giant computer

(1) **supercomputer** performance, (2) **supercomputer** technology

China has developed one of the world's fastest **supercomputers** for its space program.

## smuggle

- v. to import or export something or someone without paying appropriate customs duties, often illegally
- (1) **smuggle** drugs, (2) **smuggle** herself out of a country He was able to **smuggle** a gun inside the prison.

## intrigue

v. to make someone interested, especially by being strange, unusual, or mysterious; to make a secret plan with other people to harm someone

synonym: attract, captivate, charm

(1) **intrigue** him, (2) **intrigue** against his rival The artist's innovative style of work **intrigues** me.

#### reconnaissance

 a preliminary survey or exploration of an area, usually done to gather information or intelligence; a military mission to observe an enemy's activities and gather information

synonym: exploration, survey, examination

(1) aerial **reconnaissance**, (2) do **reconnaissance** work

The **reconnaissance** mission revealed the enemy's position.

## grandchild

- n. a child of someone's son or daughtersynonym: offspring, descendant, progeny
- (1) **grandchild-grandparent** relationship, (2) **grandchild** development

The grandparents take care of their **grandchild** while the parents are at work.

## infrequent

- adj. occurring rarely or irregularly; happening at long intervals; not happening often or in large numberssynonym: rare, sporadic, uncommon
- (1) **infrequent** showers, (2) **infrequent** meetings

  Traveling to remote villages can be difficult due to **infrequent** transportation.

## cram

v. to force or try to fit a large amount of information into a short time, especially in preparation for an examination; to force or try to fit a large amount of something into a small space

synonym: stuff, pack, jam

(1) **cram** more circuits into chips, (2) **cram** five people into a car

She had to **cram** for the final exam and stayed up all night studying.

## anecdotal

adj. based on personal accounts or stories that may not be verifiable or representative of a larger population; characterized by anecdotes or casual observations rather than scientific data or empirical evidence

synonym: hearsay, informal, unreliable

(1) **anecdotal** evidence, (2) **anecdotal** example

My friend shared an **anecdotal** story about her experience in customer service.

## visualize

v. to form a mental image or concept of something; to make something visible

*synonym*: imagine, picture, envision

(1) **visualize** data, (2) **visualize** flying through space She tried to **visualize** the layout of the new house in her mind.

## sparsely

adv. occurring, existing, or situated at wide intervals; in a scattered or thinly populated manner; with a low density or concentration

*synonym*: rarely, thinly

(1) **sparsely** attended, (2) **sparsely** decorated The town was **sparsely** populated, with only a few houses scattered around the area.

## dataset

- a structured collection of data that is compiled and processed in a computer system or program, typically for analysis, research, or machine learning purposes
   synonym: data array, database
- (1) **dataset** analysis, (2) publicly available **dataset**The scientist analyzed the large **dataset** to conclude the experiment.

## doe

 a mature female of mammals of which the male is called a buck, such as a deer or a rabbit

synonym: rabbit, bunny, hare

doe rabbit, (2) buck and doe
 Hunters use a whistle that makes the doe sound to lure stags.

## jumbo

n. an extremely large or heavy object; an African elephant that was exhibited in a circus in the late 19th century and early 20th century and became widely known as

"Jumbo"

*synonym*: elephantine, mammoth, giant

(1) jumbo jet, (2) jumbo shrimp

I need to buy a **jumbo-sized** bag of dog food for my large-breed puppy.

#### hitchhike

to obtain a ride in a passing vehicle by signaling to the driver or waving one's thumb; to travel by getting a free ride in someone else's vehicle

synonym: thumb a ride, bum a ride

(1) **hitchhike** a ride, (2) **hitchhike** across the country

She had to **hitchhike** to the nearest gas station when her car broke down.

#### unearth

v. to discover or bring to light something that is in the ground or was previously hidden or unknown

synonym: discover, uncover, expose

(1) **unearth** burial mound, (2) **unearth** a mystery The detective **unearthed** a critical clue that led to the suspect's arrest.

## cramped

adj. not having enough space for the people in it; uncomfortably small or restricted

synonym: congested, overcrowded, narrow

(1) feel **cramped**, (2) a **cramped** house She writes a **cramped** hand.

#### alto

 the second-highest vocal range in choral music, typically sung by the second-highest singers in a choir; a type of saxophone

synonym: contralto, countertenor, soprano

(1) alto saxophone, (2) an alto solo

The **alto** singer had a unique and powerful voice.

#### dictate

v. to state or give order with total authority; to say or read aloud for somebody else to write down or to be recorded

synonym:

## read out, prescribe, order

(1) **dictate** a letter to secretary, (2) **dictate** to the associate The allies **dictated** the terms of surrender to the country.

#### constrain

 to restrict or limit someone or something's freedom or ability to do something

synonym: restrict, limit, confine

- (1) **constrain** his freedom, (2) **constrain** information flow The political situation **constrained** the country's economic growth and foreign relations.
- a faint or indistinct image or sound; something that is not clear or distinct; (verb) to become unclear; to lose clear vision

synonym: smudge, smear, fuzz

(1) blur image, (2) motion blur

The camera's focus was off, and the image was a **blur** of colors and shapes.

## trade-off

 a balance achieved between two desirable but incompatible features; an exchange that occurs as a compromise

synonym: compromise, balance, exchange

(1) **trade-off** problem, (2) environmental **trade-off**There was a **trade-off** between speed and accuracy in the task.

#### traverse

- v. to cross or move through a land or water area synonym: cross, pass through, travel over
- (1) **traverse** the region, (2) **traverse** a vast extent of sea Approximately 1000 automobiles **traverse** the bridge every day.

## goggle

to look at someone or something with amazement; to look stupidly; (noun, plural) tight-fitting spectacles that are worn to prevent particulates, water, or chemicals from striking the eyes

blur

synonym: gaze, gawk, gape

(1) **goggle** his eyes, (2) infrared **goggles**The software company bought the VR **goggles**manufacturer.

### recombine

- v. to combine or put together again or differently; to cause genetic recombination (= the process by which genetic material is broken and joined to other genetic material)
- (1) **recombine** at the surface, (2) ability to **recombine**Some scientists argue that the genes in food should not be artificially **recombined**.

### constellation

 a group of stars that form a recognizable pattern and have a name; a group of related or similar ideas, things, or people

synonym: asterism, array, pattern

(1) the stars of the Scorpion **constellation**, (2) northern **constellation** 

Navigators still use the Little Bear constellation at sea.
