berserk

leak

lifespan

 the length of time for which a person, animal lives, or thing exists

ancestral

adj. related to or connected with members of your family from the past

illegal

adj. not allowed by law

synonym: banned, prohibited, illicit

(1) illegal drugs, (2) child of illegal immigrants

grave

n. a place where a dead body is buried, typically marked by a headstone or other memorial; a very serious, solemn, or important matter; (verb) to carve, cut, or etch a design, inscription, or mark onto a hard surface, such as stone or metal; (adjective) serious, solemn, or weighty in nature

synonym: tomb, crypt, sepulcher

Since independence, the area has been completely ignored.

decidedly

adv. in a manner that is beyond doubt or question; in a way that is clear and unmistakable; in an emphatic or determined manner

synonym: definitely, absolutely, positively

(1) decidedly unfriendly, (2) decidedly different

She was **decidedly** unimpressed with his latest attempt at a joke.

scatter

- to cause to separate and go in different directions *synonym*: disperse, spread, bestrew
- (1) **scatter** seeds, (2) **scatter** around the internet The hunter's approach **scattered** the geese.

eerily

adv. in a strange, weird, or unsettling manner; suggesting the presence of supernatural or mysterious elements

synonym: spookily, strangely, creepily

(1) **eerily** accurate, (2) **eerily** atmospheric

The abandoned house was **eerily** silent as if someone was watching from within.

silent

adj. without any or little sound synonym: quiet, hushed, mute

(1) **silent** reading, (2) give **silent** consent

The politician remained **silent** despite intense media scrutiny.

charm

- the power or quality of pleasing or fascinating people synonym: allure, appeal, beauty
- (1) masculine charm, (2) charm against bad luck These are significantly more exquisite than typical **charm** bracelets.

bucolic

adj. relating to or characteristic of the pleasant aspects of the countryside or rural life; having a rustic, idyllic, or pastoral quality

synonym: rural, pastoral, idyllic

bulldoze

to level or clear an area of land using a bulldozer (= a large, heavy vehicle with a blade on the front); to use force or the threat of force to make them do something or to get them to move out of the way

vestige

- a trace, mark, or evidence of something that once existed but has now disappeared or diminished

tragedy

- n. an event or situation causing great loss, misfortune, or destruction; a play or literature that deals with a severe and sad event and often ends with the death of the main character

- (1) a **tragedy** during work, (2) the aftermath of this **tragedy** Macbeth is a famous **tragedy** by Shakespeare.

resident

- a person who lives in a particular place or has their home in a place
- *synonym*: dweller, inhabitant, inhabitant

demographic

- a statistic characterizing that describes people or groups of people based on their age, sex, income, etc.

isolate

- v. to physically or socially separate someone or something from other people or things
- *synonym*: separate, sequester, insulate
- isolate a compound, (2) isolate a patient

chimney

 a vertical structure that channels smoke or gas from a fire or furnace out of a building; a hollow column or tube that facilitates air or fluid flow throughout a system

synonym: flue, smokestack, stack

(1) smoke chimney, (2) chimney sweep

The **chimney** in the factory was constantly emitting dark smoke.

declare

v. to say, state, or announce something clearly, officially, or publicly

synonym: announce, state, affirm

(1) **declare** independence, (2) **declare** my love Foreign goods from abroad must be **declared** to customs when entering a country.

obvious

adj. easy to see, discover or understand synonym: apparent, conspicuous, evident

(1) **obvious** reasons, (2) his conclusion was **obvious** There are **obvious** differences between the two wine-producing regions.

scare

- v. to frighten a person or animal, or to become frightened synonym: frighten, spook, intimidate
- (1) **scare** off her attacker by screaming, (2) **scare** the birds away

We hit the ground to **scare** out the rabbits.

starvation

 a severe lack of food that leads to malnutrition and, ultimately, death

synonym: hunger, malnutrition, emaciation

(1) die of **starvation**, (2) **starvation** wages

The drought led to widespread **starvation** in the region.

survive

- v. to live or exist despite a dangerous event or period synonym: endure, persist, stay

atrocity

- n. brutal act; an extremely wicked or cruel actsynonym: evil, horror, iniquity
- (1) commit atrocity, (2) cold-blooded atrocityThe atrocity of the war left many children orphaned.

enforce

v. to make sure that people obey a particular law, rule, or situation

synonym: execute, implement, administer

(1) **enforce** the law, (2) **enforce** a contract

Governments make rules, and police **enforce** them.

famine

 a severe shortage of food, often caused by drought, war, or economic reasons

synonym: hunger, starvation, drought

(1) famine relief, (2) coal famine

The severe **famine** caused by the drought has left many people without food.

slash

v. to cut with a sharp object using a quick and robust movement

synonym: cut, gash

(1) slash a person with a knife, (2) price slash

The government had to **slash** national defense spending due to the recession.

rap

 a type of music characterized by a strong, repetitive beat and lyrics that often focus on social and political issues; a reproach for some lapse or misdeed

synonym: hip-hop, emceeing, MCing

(1) rap music, (2) get a rap

The new **rap** album is getting a lot of attention.

labor

 productive work, especially physical work done for wages; the people who do manual or physical work in a country or company for wage; (verb) to work hard or to strive and make an effort to reach a goal

synonym: toil, moil, donkeywork

(1) seasonal labor, (2) manual labor

In several countries, child **labor** is a serious social problem.

unwilling

adj. not ready or wanting to do something synonym: disinclined, involuntary, reluctant

(1) unwilling look, (2) in an unwilling voice

They were **unwilling** to take any risks.

flee

 to leave by running away, especially out of fear or danger

synonym: exit, escape, run away

(1) **flee** their homes, (2) **flee** abroad

It is a basic instinct to **flee** from a dangerous situation.

invisible

adj. impossible or nearly impossible to see *synonym*: hidden, imperceptible, unseen

(1) an invisible asset, (2) invisible stars

The phenomenon is **invisible** at optical wavelengths.

logic

 a way of thinking or reasoning conducted or evaluated by strict validity principles; the study of correct reasoning or good arguments

synonym: reasoning, reason, ratiocination

(1) an indisputable **logic**, (2) a demonstration in **logic** There's no **logic** in his description.

stick

v. to put something, usually a sharp object, into something; to restrict yourself to doing or using one certain thing and not change; (noun) a thin piece of wood or other material

synonym: pierce, adhere, stay

(1) stick a key in a lock, (2) fire stick

You **stick** a bill in the change machine, and the coins pop out.

outskirt

n. the part of a town or city away from the center, typically the suburbs; the fringe or border of something.

synonym: suburb, periphery, edge

(1) the **outskirt** of the forest, (2) on the western **outskirts** The **outskirt** of the city was quieter and more peaceful than the busy downtown area.

separate

- v. to force, take, or pull apart; mark as different synonym: disunite, isolate, ramify
- (1) **separate** video into chapter, (2) **separate** cream from milk

We need to **separate** the aspect of his personality from the part of his competence when making an investment decision.

whisper

v. to speak very quietly to somebody using the breath rather than the voice so that only those close to you can hear you

synonym: murmur, rumor, mutter

(1) answer in a **whisper**, (2) the **whisper** of the leaves He took me aside and **whispered** in my ear.

stork

- a very tall, long-legged bird with white and black plunge and a long beak that walks around in the water to find its food
- (1) have a visit from the **stork**, (2) the **stork's** bill A **stork** flew slowly past.

environment

 the natural world such as air, water, and land in which humans, animals, and plants live

synonym: atmosphere, surroundings, climate

(1) **environment** affairs, (2) chaotic **environment** Every human is responsible for taking care of the Earth's **environment**.

devastation

 the act of causing great destruction or damage, often on a large scale

synonym: destruction, ruin, havoc

(1) financial devastation, (2) devastation to life

The economic recession caused **devastation** in the housing market, with many people losing their homes.

boar

n. a wild pig, especially a male with tusks

synonym: wild pig, sow, hog

(1) wild boar, (2) boar's head

The hunter tracked the **boar** through the forest for a good shot.

lynx

 a wild cat with tufted ears, native to Eurasia and North America

synonym: feline, wildcat, bobcat

moose

 a large deer native to the northern forests of North America and Eurasia

synonym: elk, deer, antelope

The antlers of a bull **moose** can grow up to 6 feet in width and weigh over 60 pounds.

negative

adj. having the quality of something bad or harmful; expressing refusal

synonym: minus, adverse, pessimistic

trump

- a playing card with a picture of a trumpeter on it, used in certain card games
- (1) trump card, (2) choose trump

The **trump** suit in the game of bridge is determined at the beginning of each hand.

upside

 the positive aspect or potential of something; the upper side of something

synonym: advantage, benefit, top

(1) have no **upside**, (2) market **upside**

Many people see the **upside** of traveling as an opportunity to experience new cultures and broaden their horizons.

mass

 a large amount of a substance with no definite shape or form; a large number of people or things grouped or crowded together

synonym: abundance, crowd, mob

(1) a mass of molten rock, (2) critical mass

The **mass** of people who do not own property is politically impotent.

exodus

 a situation in which a large number of people leave or escape from a place at the same time

synonym: emigration, evacuation, departure

heroic

 adj. courageous and daring; having or displaying qualities appropriate for legendary figures that is courage and daring

synonym: brave, courageous, daring

resilient

adj. able to withstand or recover quickly from difficult conditions

synonym: robust, sturdy, tough

plain

adj. without being decorated in any way; (Noun) a vast expanse of flat land with few trees

synonym: basic, straight, bare

pragmatist

 a person who practically approaches situations and problems; someone who prioritizes usefulness and functionality over abstract principles or ideals

synonym: realist, practical person, utilitarian

midnight

the middle point of the night, usually defined as 12:00
 AM or the start of a new day

bucket

 an open container with a handle made of metal or plastic, often used for carrying liquids

synonym: pail, tub, can

mess

- n. a state of confusion, dirtiness, or untidiness; (verb) to fail to do something or to make something dirty or untidy
 synonym: disarray, confusion, predicament

homemade

adj. made at home rather than in a factory or workshop synonym: self-made

(1) homemade article, (2) homemade bread

I prefer **homemade** cookies over store-bought ones.

vodka

 a distilled alcoholic beverage made from fermented grains or potatoes, typically with high alcohol content and little or no added flavoring

synonym: spirit, liquor, distilled beverage

patina

 a thin layer that forms on the surface of an object as a result of natural aging or exposure to environmental factors often valued for its aesthetic or historical significance

The antique dealer valued the piece higher due to its rich **patina** and aged appearance.

defiance

 behavior characterized by an open refusal to obey someone or something

hardy
