dreadful

nail

ethics

topic

exterminate

swallow

tadpole

cough

hiccup

spray

biology

excite

lab

tissue

 an ensemble of similar cells of the animal or plant that together carry out a specific function

synonym: structure, texture, anatomy

freezer

 a device that keeps food, beverages, or other perishable items at low temperatures to maintain their freshness or preserve them for later use

synonym: refrigerator, icebox, cooler

degree

 a unit of measurement for angles, temperature, or level of proficiency or achievement; a rank or level of academic or professional attainment

centigrade

jar

 a cylindrical container, typically made of glass, metal, or pottery, with a wide mouth and a screwed or sealed lid, used for storing food, liquids, and other materials

exciting

cryoprotectant

intact

transplant

inactivate

nucleus

the central and most important part of something;

ultraviolet

embryo

 an animal organism in the early stages of growth, either in its mother's womb or in an egg, or a plant that is developing in a seed

synonym: fetus, seed, origin

announce

v. to make something known or officially inform people about something

synonym: disclose, declare, broadcast

(1) **announce** candidacy, (2) **announce** the award winners. The third season of the anime show has been **announced**.

publicly

adv. in a manner accessible to or observable by the public;by the government

synonym: candidly, openly, honestly

(1) **publicly** accessible record, (2) **publicly** financed schools

She **publicly** denounced the government's mishandling of the economic crisis.

hop

v. to jump lightly and quickly on one foot or both feet; to move rapidly from one place to another; to travel using an aircraft, bus, etc.

synonym: jump, bounce, skip

(1) **hop** on one foot, (2) **hop** from one place to another The rabbit **hopped** over the fence.

applause

 a demonstration of approval or praise by clapping the hands together

synonym: clapping, cheering, acclaim

stripe

 a long, narrow band of a different color or texture than the surface on which it appears

synonym: line, band, streak

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(1) a white **stripe**, (2) **stripe** texture

The plates have a blue **stripe** around the edge.

marsupial

adj. relating to or characteristic of mammals of the order Marsupialia, which typically carry their newborn offspring in a pouch on their abdomen; referring to animals such as kangaroos, koalas, and opossums

synonym: pouched, kangaroo-like

(1) unique **marsupial** physiology, (2) **marsupial** species The **marsupial** pouch provides a convenient and secure space for the young ones to grow.

pouch

 a small bag or container with a drawstring or zipper used to carry small items; a small sac or pocket within an organ or tissue in the body

koala

nation

 a large organized community of people living in a particular country or region and having a particular culture

synonym: country, state, sovereign entity

geography

- n. a field of science devoted to the study of the lands, features, inhabitants, and phenomena of the Earth synonym: landscape, terrain, topography

fossil

 any preserved remains, impression, or trace of any once-living thing that has become hard and turned into rock

synonym: relic, remnant, antediluvian

deposit

dingo

 a wild dog native to Australia, known for its distinctive howl and for being a pest to farmers

archaic

adj. old and no longer used or applicable; of or seeming to belong to an ancient period in history

compete
