Multiple genes may influence behavioral **traits** concurrently.

## budge

 to move or shift slightly, particularly with effort or resistance; to make or cause a slight change in something

synonym: move, shift, nudge

(1) **budge** an inch, (2) **budge** the shelf

No matter how hard I tried, I couldn't **budge** the heavy couch from its place in the room.

#### astute

adj. having the ability to assess situations or people accurately and to act accordingly; mentally sharp or clever; showing practical wisdom or shrewdness

synonym: perceptive, shrewd, keen

(1) **astute** decision-making, (2) **astute** businessman His **astute** observation allowed him to catch the mistake before anyone else did.

#### clinician

 a practitioner, especially of medicine or psychology, who has direct contact with patients

*synonym*: psychiatrist, therapist, doctor

(1) experienced **clinician**, (2) from a **clinician's** perspective Some **clinicians** believe that psychological characteristics alone may cause mental disorders.

#### resilient

adj. able to withstand or recover quickly from difficult conditions

synonym: robust, sturdy, tough

synonym: drop, plunge, fall

The stock prices have **plummeted** in the last hour, causing concern for investors.

## decipher

synonym: interpret, decode, translate

#### institutionalize

#### authorship

synonym: writing, composing, penning

### crowdsourcing

#### medicinal
