monologue

 a solo speech or performance given by one person, typically in a theatrical or storytelling context, and often used to reveal aspects of the speaker's thoughts, feelings, or backstory

synonym: soliloquy, speech, address

commonplace

adj. occurring very often; lacking originality or interest synonym: ordinary, routine, mundane

apathetic

adj. lacking interest, enthusiasm, or concern; indifferent or unconcerned, often in situations where one might be expected to be emotionally engaged or invested

slogan

 a short, catchy phrase or motto that is used by a person, organization, or company to promote a particular product, cause, or idea

synonym: catchphrase, tagline, motto

The company spent months researching and testing different brand **slogans** before finally settling on 'Just Do It' as their new tagline.

agitation

a state of anxiety, excitement, or disturbance that is
 often associated with restlessness, agitation, or
 nervousness; the act of stirring or moving something in a

synonym: excitement, restlessness, turmoil

The crowd's **agitation** grew as the politician failed to answer their questions.

pernicious

adj. causing harm or destruction, often in a subtle or gradual way

synonym: harmful, malicious, destructive

The **pernicious** influence of the corrupt officials had a detrimental effect on the town.

overthrow

v. to defeat or remove a leader or a government from a position of power by force

synonym: defeat, destroy, conquer

authoritarian

freedoms or individual rights

facto

motto
