wright

tinker

v. to make repairs, adjustments, or improvements to something, especially in an experimental or makeshift way

synonym: fiddle, play, fix

(1) **tinker** with the bill, (2) **tinker** with the settings He spent the afternoon **tinkering** with his car engine.

statesman

 a man who is a respected leader or politician in national or international affairs

synonym: solon, politician, legislator

(1) a woman **statesman**, (2) international **statesman**. This statue honors a distinguished **statesman**.

underlie

synonym: govern, control, determine
