#### fender

a barrier that surrounds the wheels of a vehicle to block splashing water or mud; a cushion-like device that reduces shock due to an impact

synonym: cover, bumper, cushion

(1) front **fender**, (2) vehicle **fender** 

He had a **fender** bender last night.

#### obsession

the state in which a person's mind is filled with thoughts of one single object or particular person

synonym: compulsion, fixation, enthusiasm

(1) **obsession** with character, (2) national **obsession** Gambling became an **obsession** for him, and he eventually lost everything.

#### overwhelm

to defeat someone or something by using a great deal of force; to have a strong emotional effect on somebody

*synonym*: conquer, crush, dominate

(1) he was **overwhelmed** with gratitude, (2) **overwhelm** opponents by numbers

Too much variety may **overwhelm** and confuse viewers.

#### sibling

a brother or sister; member of a family born to the same parents

a person who cannot stop using or doing something as a

synonym: brother, sister, relative

habit, especially something harmful

synonym: devotee, buff, freak

#### addict

#### edgy

adj. being tense, nervous, or irritable; nervous, jittery behavior; having a provocative, unconventional, or avant-garde style or mentality

synonym: tense, nervous, anxious

#### stimming

n. a behavior often exhibited by individuals on the autism spectrum characterized by repetitive bodily movements or sounds, such as hand flapping or rocking, often used as a form of self-regulation or sensory stimulation

synonym: self-stimulation, repetitive behaviors

(1) autistic **stimming**, (2) **stimming** therapy

Autistic children may engage in **stimming** behaviors, such as rocking or hand flapping, to self-regulate.

#### craving

- a strong desire of wanting something
- synonym: desire, appetite, longing
- (1) craving for revenge, (2) curb our cravingsI have a craving for nicotine.

### proliferate

v. to grow or increase rapidly in number; to reproduce or spread rapidly, especially in an uncontrolled manner

synonym: multiply, spread, propagate

(1) proliferate cells, (2) proliferate weeds
