resonate

- ν . to be filled with a deep echoing sound
- *synonym*: echo, reverberate, resound
- (1) deeply **resonate** with the consumers, (2) **resonate** in the same frequency

The sound **resonates** well in this theater.

hurdle

- n. a barrier or obstacle that must be overcome
- synonym: obstacle, barrier, challenge
- (1) overcome hurdles, (2) hurdle race

The company faced several **hurdles** in the development of its new product.

stereotype

- a fixed and unvarying idea or image that people have about what someone or something is like, but which is often not true in reality and may cause hurt and offense
- avoid stereotype,
 negative stereotypes
 changing stereotypes about LGBTQ requires considerable effort.

assertive

adj. characterized by a confident and forceful personality; expressing one's opinions or desires directly and positively; standing up for oneself in a firm but non-aggressive manner

synonym: confident, self-assured, decisive

(1) **assertive** behavior, (2) an **assertive** approach She was **assertive** and confident in her negotiation tactics during the business meeting.

trait

n. a particular feature of your nature

synonym: attribute, feature, quality

(1) chemical trait, (2) personality traits

Multiple genes may influence behavioral traits concurrently.

opportune

adj. suitable or happening at a time that is suitable or convenient for a particular purpose

synonym: suitable, timely, practical

(1) opportune occasion, (2) an opportune remark

The phone rang at the most **opportune** time.

doe

 a mature female of mammals of which the male is called a buck, such as a deer or a rabbit

synonym: rabbit, bunny, hare

(1) doe rabbit, (2) buck and doe

pimp

synonym: pandar, procurer, hustler

quo

 the existing state or condition of something, especially in relation to a particular situation or issue

synonym: status, condition, state

(1) status quo politician, (2) quo warranto

The company has been successful in maintaining the status **quo**.

Latina

 a female person of Latin American origin or descent; a term used to refer to women from Latin American countries or with Latin American heritage

synonym: Hispanic woman

(1) Latina community, (2) Latina actress

She is the first **Latina** senator in the country's history.

stagnate

 to remain still, inactive, or without growth or development; to become stale or foul-smelling due to a lack of circulation or movement

synonym: stall, halt, idle

(1) **stagnate** economy, (2) **stagnate** due to problems If you don't exercise regularly, your fitness levels may **stagnate**.
