industrious

adj. hardworking, diligent, and persistent in effort synonym: diligent, hardworking, assiduous

(1) **industrious** worker, (2) **industrious** student He was known to be very **industrious** and would often work late into the night.

philanthropy

the practice of voluntarily helping the poor, especially by giving money

synonym: altruism, benevolence, generosity

(1) **philanthropy** organization, (2) private **philanthropy** Tech billionaires often spend the majority of their time on **philanthropy**.

mobilize

v. to make something ready for action or use; to organize people or resources for a particular purpose

synonym: activate, rally, marshal

(1) **mobilize** cooperation, (2) **mobilize** a stiff joint The military **mobilized** troops to the border.

societal

adj. relating to society or social relationships

(1) **societal** norms, (2) **societal** expectations

synonym: social, communal, cultural

The **societal** pressure to conform is strong in this community.

daunting

 adj. looking challenging to manage in prospect; making someone anxious and less confident about carrying out something

synonym: intimidating, stunning, disheartening

(1) face the **daunting** reality, (2) seem like a **daunting** task My homework was **daunting** and complex, but it was also intriguing.

intractable

adj. difficult to manage or control; stubborn or obstinate *synonym*: obstinate, stubborn, unyielding

(1) **intractable** pain, (2) **intractable** situation The **intractable** problem defied a solution.

philanthropic

adj. characterized by a desire to promote the welfare of others, especially by donating money or providing charitable aid; of or relating to the practice of philanthropy

synonym: charitable, benevolent, generous

(1) **philanthropic** donation, (2) **philanthropic** mission

The **philanthropic** organization donated millions of dollars to fund medical research.

scarcity

the state of being in short supply; a small and inadequate amount

synonym: lack, absence, dearth

(1) fuel **scarcity**, (2) **scarcity** of capital

Some research says that a relative decline in teacher salaries is causing labor **scarcity**.

institutionalize

to establish or make something a part of an institution (= a place such as a university, hospital, etc.)

synonym: formalize, establish, regularize

(1) **institutionalize** a system, (2) **institutionalize** customary laws

The new policy aims to **institutionalize** the use of renewable energy sources.

trade-off

 a balance achieved between two desirable but incompatible features; an exchange that occurs as a compromise

synonym: compromise, balance, exchange

(1) **trade-off** problem, (2) environmental **trade-off**There was a **trade-off** between speed and accuracy in the task.

pollute

v. to make an area or substance, such as land, air, water, etc., dirty or harmful to living things by adding waste

matter or harmful chemicals

synonym: contaminate, corrupt, degrade

(1) **pollute** the air, (2) **pollute** the thread

We should do our best not to **pollute** the environment.

simplistic

adj. oversimplified or lacking in complexity or depth; characterized by an attempt to explain something complex or multifaceted with overly vague or simple terms

synonym: basic, uncomplicated, elementary

(1) simplistic approach, (2) simplistic design

The politician's solution to the problem was too **simplistic** to solve the underlying issue.

synergy

drip

 the interaction of elements that, when combined, produce a total effect that is greater than the sum of the individual elements

synonym: cooperation, collaboration, partnership

- (1) **synergy** collaboration, (2) **synergy** between businesses The new software program was designed to increase productivity by promoting employee **synergy**.
- v. to fall in drops or make it fall in drops; (noun) liquid or moisture that falls in drops

synonym: drop, drizzle, trickle

(1) **drip** liquid, (2) **drip** from the vicious wound Water is **dripping** from the faucet.

eucalyptus

 a genus of flowering trees and shrubs native to Australia that are known for their aromatic leaves and medicinal properties

synonym: gum tree, Australian tree

(1) eucalyptus oil, (2) eucalyptus leaves

The scent of **eucalyptus** is often used in aromatherapy to promote relaxation.

hectare

- n. a unit of area equal to 10,000 square meters
- (1) **hectare** land, (2) housing per **hectare** The farm spans over 100 **hectares** of land.

opportune

adj. suitable or happening at a time that is suitable or convenient for a particular purpose

synonym: suitable, timely, practical

disseminate

v. to spread or distribute widely, especially information or ideas; to scatter or disperse

synonym: spread, circulate, propagate
