# **Session 1: Word List**

### apartheid

n. a system of racial segregation and discrimination that was enforced in South Africa from 1948 to 1994; any similar system of discrimination or segregation based on race, ethnicity, or other factors

synonym: segregation, discrimination, oppression

(1) apartheid system, (2) apartheid policies

The South African government enforced **apartheid** laws that segregated people based on race.

## emigrate

- v. to leave one's country or region to settle in another synonym: migrate, relocate, move
- (1) **emigrate** to a new country, (2) **emigrate** for better opportunities

Many people **emigrated** from Ireland to America during the Great Famine.

#### shambles

 a state of complete disorder, chaos, or ruin; an utter mess or failure

synonym: disorder, chaos, mess

(1) financial **shambles**, (2) organizational **shambles**After the party, the house was in **shambles** and needed much cleaning.

#### resilient

adj. able to withstand or recover quickly from difficult conditions

synonym: robust, sturdy, tough

(1) a hard and **resilient** steel, (2) **resilient** population She is a **resilient** person and has always bounced back from setbacks.

#### dedicate

v. to give all of your energy, time, etc., entirely to a specific person, activity, or cause; to set apart for a particular purpose or use

*synonym*: consecrate, devote, commit

(1) **dedicate** a few hours, (2) **dedicate** a chapter to the subject

He **dedicated** his life to helping others.

# judiciary

- n. persons who administer or enforce justice synonym: tribunal, bench, court
- (1) independence of the **judiciary**, (2) member of the **judiciary**

The **judiciary** of the case was inexperienced and lacked locally educated attorneys.

#### **Senate**

a legislative body, especially the upper house of a parliament

synonym: upper house, council, assembly

(1) **Senate** hearing, (2) **Senate** Finance Committee

The **Senate** majority leader announced plans to bring the bill to the floor for a vote.

# impeach

 to bring formal charges against a public official for misconduct in office

synonym: charge, accuse, claim

(1) **impeach** him with an error, (2) **impeach** official The House of Representatives **impeached** the president for abuse of power.

### improvisation

- n. the act of making something up on the spot or creating or performing something without preparationsynonym: spontaneity, ad-lib, extemporization
- (1) **improvisation** on stage, (2) jazz **improvisation** He created a beautiful piece of music using only **improvisation**.

#### creditor

- n. a person, company, etc. to whom a debtor owes money(1) the creditor's claims, (2) bankrupt creditor
- I asked the lawyer to initiate **creditor** negotiations for voluntary liquidation.

#### havoc

- widespread destruction or devastation, often caused by natural disasters, war, or other violent events
- synonym: destruction, devastation, ruin
- (1) cause **havoc**, (2) play **havoc** in the mind The storm wreaked **havoc** on the town, causing widespread damage and power outages.

### stereotype

- n. a fixed and unvarying idea or image that people have about what someone or something is like, but which is often not true in reality and may cause hurt and offense
- avoid stereotype,
   negative stereotypes
   changing stereotypes about LGBTQ requires considerable effort.

#### stabilize

- v. to become or cause to become steady or unlikely to give way
- synonym: brace, steady, secure
- (1) **stabilize** prices, (2) **stabilize** blood sugar levels
  The raising of interest rates **stabilizes** the inflation rate.

#### opportune

- adj. suitable or happening at a time that is suitable or convenient for a particular purpose
- *synonym*: suitable, timely, practical
- (1) **opportune** occasion, (2) an **opportune** remark

The phone rang at the most **opportune** time.

### quitter

a person who gives up easily or does not have the determination to finish what they have started

synonym: coward, deserter, surrender

(1) easy quitter, (2) serial quitter

He was labeled as a **quitter** after he abandoned the project halfway.

#### ransom

- n. a large amount of money that is paid for being made to secure the release of a person being held captivesynonym: blackmail, release, exchange
- (1) ransom money, (2) ransom demand

The kidnappers demanded a **ransom** for the release of the victim.

## groom

to clean, brush, and care for the fur or feathers of an animal; to prepare oneself or someone else for a special event or occasion; to make something neat; (noun, also "bridegroom") a man who is about to be married or has recently been married

synonym: brush, comb, neaten

(1) **groom** duties, (2) **groom** a horse

I need to **groom** my dog before his fur gets too long.

#### cultivate

- v. to prepare and foster land for growing crops or plants synonym: boost, foster, nurture
- (1) **cultivate** a field, (2) **cultivate** relationships University is a great place to **cultivate** our minds and expertise.

ivy

- an evergreen climbing or ground-creeping woody plant that often grows up trees or buildings
- (1) poison ivy, (2) ivy plant

The overgrown **ivy** cleaved to the ruined castle walls.

#### blossom

n. the reproductive structure on a flowering plant that consists of usually colorful petals and a typically green calyx (merging of sepals); the state or time of flowering; the peak of a person's or thing's development or success

synonym: flower, bloom, bud

(1) apple **blossom**, (2) **blossom** garden
The cherry **blossom** trees in the park were in full bloom, creating a beautiful sight.
