injury

 n. harm done to a person's or an animal's body caused by an accident or an attack

disability

- a physical or mental condition that makes it difficult for someone to do some things that other people do
 synonym: impairment, disadvantage, restriction
- (1) a **disability** pension, (2) a learning **disability**Listening to music at a high volume may lead to a hearing **disability**.

norm

- *n.* something that is regarded as usual, typical, or standard *synonym*: criterion, mean, standard
- (1) **norm** of action, (2) cultural **norm**The systems we have developed has accepted as industry **norms**.

react

v. to take action in response to something

synonym: respond, reply, oppose
