#### conceal

synonym: hide, keep secret, camouflage

(1) **conceal** my identity, (2) **conceal** a close relationship Despite the intense verbal abuse, she **concealed** her anger well.

#### drown

 to die or cause to die by being unable to breathe underwater

synonym: douse, drench, overwhelm

(1) **drown** in a bath, (2) I was **drowned** in work Floods have the potential to **drown** any subsurface animals easily.

### nutshell

n. the hard, outer covering or protective casing that encloses the kernel or fruit of certain types of nuts, such as walnuts or acorns; a concise and condensed summary or explanation of something

synonym: summary, essence, covering

(1) move into a **nutshell**, (2) **nutshell** version Can you explain your argument in a **nutshell?** 

#### bombard

to attack a place with bombs or gunshots continuously;
 to address with continuously or persistently, as if with a barrage

synonym: bomb, shoot, blitz

(1) **bombard** him with questions, (2) **bombard** a fort with heavy shells

Overprotective parents often **bombard** their children with messages reinforcing their lack of mastery.

# disparate

adj. very different or distinct from something else and is not connected or comparable in any way

synonym: different, distinct, separate

(1) **disparate** impact, (2) physically **disparate** location The organization worked to bring together **disparate** groups in the community.

# quitter

n. a person who gives up easily or does not have the determination to finish what they have started

synonym: coward, deserter, surrender

(1) easy quitter, (2) serial quitter

He was labeled as a **quitter** after he abandoned the project halfway.

rib

 each of a series of curved bones that are connected to the spine and surround the chest; (adjective) subject to laughter or ridicule

synonym: costa

(1) brake a rib, (2) rib cage

The accident caused a cracked rib.

slang

 informal or non-standard language that is often used within a specific group or culture and may not be considered appropriate in a professional or formal context

synonym: lingo, jargon, vernacular

(1) slang phrases, (2) Internet slang

A lot of **slang** words and phrases were popularized by hip-hop music.

jargon

n. specialized language or vocabulary used by a particular group or profession that is often difficult for outsiders to understand; language that is full of technical slang or obscure terms and is often used to obscure or confuse rather than clarify

synonym: lingo, vernacular, slang

(1) business jargon, (2) scientific jargon

The financial industry is notorious for using complicated **jargon** that confuses consumers.

disturb

v. to interrupt someone who is trying to work, sleep, etc. synonym: agitate, bother, intrude

(1) disturb the peace, (2) disturb his sleep

Tourists frequently **disturb** the island's delicate natural

balance.

jolt

v. to move or cause to move with a sudden jerky motion; to disturb someone's composure); (noun) a sudden, sharp movement or shock

synonym: shock, jar, bump

(1) **jolt** entire social systems, (2) **jolt** of excitement The news of the unexpected announcement **jolted** the stock market.

massacre

n. the brutal and indiscriminate killing of a large number of people; a violent and bloody event that typically results in the death of many individuals

*synonym*: slaughter, bloodbath, butchery

(1) **massacre** in the village, (2) animal **massacre**The **massacre** of innocent civilians in the war zone was a tragic event.

stubborn

 adj. refusing to change one's mind or behavior despite persuasion or evidence to the contrary; unyielding; difficult to move or change

synonym: persistent, obstinate, determined

(1) **stubborn** attitude, (2) **stubborn** stains

He was so **stubborn** about his beliefs that he refused to listen to any other points of view.

obsess

 to fill the mind of someone continually so that one can't think of anything else

*synonym*: torment, beset, engross

(1) **obsess** over her weight, (2) he is **obsessed** with the fear

He's utterly **obsessed** with his promotion.

stun

ν. to make a person or an animal unconscious or dizzy, especially by hitting them on the head; to make someone surprised or shocked greatly

synonym: shock, amaze, astound

# (1) **stun** fish, (2) **stun** an audience

This sprinter **stunned** the world with his speed.

#### overvalue

v. to value or estimate something too high; to assign too much worth or importance to something; to assess or appraise something beyond its actual market or intrinsic value

synonym: overestimate, inflate, exaggerate

(1) overvalue stocks, (2) overvalue assets

It is important not to **overvalue** material possessions, as they do not bring true happiness.

### undervalue

- v. to assign too low a value to something synonym: underrate, underestimate, devalue
- (1) **undervalue** his contribution, (2) **undervalue** the potential

He **undervalued** the importance of teamwork and struggled to succeed.

## workaround

 a temporary or unconventional solution to a problem or issue that enables progress or completion of a task despite obstacles or limitations

synonym: alternative, temporary fix, quick-fix

(1) **workaround** solution, (2) software **workaround** When the software crashed, I had to devise a quick **workaround** to save my progress.

### resourceful

adj. showing creativity and ability to find quick and practical solutions to problems

*synonym*: inventive, imaginative, clever

(1) **resourceful** thinker, (2) **resourceful** cook in town
She was **resourceful** and found a solution to the problem on her own.

entitle

v. to give someone the right to have or do something; to give a title to someone or something

synonym: allow, permit, enable

(1) **entitle** him to a pension, (2) **entitle** the company to use the logo

The employee was **entitled** to a week of vacation time.

## freeway

 a major highway designed for high-speed traffic, with no stoplights or grade crossings and having interchanges or access roads to other highways

synonym: highway, expressway, motorway

(1) freeway exit, (2) expanded freeway

We got stuck in a traffic jam on the **freeway** for over an hour.

# opportune

adj. suitable or happening at a time that is suitable or convenient for a particular purpose

synonym: suitable, timely, practical

(1) **opportune** occasion, (2) an **opportune** remark The phone rang at the most **opportune** time.

#### tweet

 a short, high sound made by a small bird; a message sent using Twitter, the social media application

synonym: peep, chirp, post (on Twitter)

(1) a chick's **tweet**, (2) his latest **tweets** 

We could hear the **tweet** of baby birds.

#### totalitarian

adj. of or relating to a system of government in which a single political party has complete control and power

synonym: dictatorial, authoritarian, oppressive

(1) totalitarian ideology, (2) totalitarian state

The government was criticized for having a **totalitarian** regime.
