rot

v. to decay, or cause something to decay, naturally and gradually

synonym: perish, decay, corrode

(1) begin to rot, (2) rot with age

Please refrigerate the meat, or it will **rot**.

savannah

n. a mixed forest and grassland ecosystem where the trees are far enough apart that the canopy doesn't closesynonym: grassland, plain

(1) savannah region, (2) tropical savannah

The birds live in tropical forests, **savannahs**, and arid semi-desert environments.

nourish

v. to provide a person, an animal, or plant with food to make them grow and stay healthy

synonym: feed, sustain, nurture

(1) **nourish** damaged skin, (2) **nourish** hope

The mother used her breast milk to **nourish** the baby.

photosynthesis

- n. the process through which plants and other organisms transform light energy into chemical energy, which is then released through cellular respiration to power the organism's activities.

In **photosynthesis**, plants use carbon dioxide to feed themselves.

digestive

- adj. relating to or capable of causing or promoting digestion of food

detritus

 waste or debris of any kind, particularly organic matter that has decayed or broken off from larger organisms; figuratively, a collection of disorganized or discarded material or ideas synonym: debris, waste, garbage

The beach was littered with **detritus** and trash left behind by careless visitors.

expel

v. to officially force someone to leave a school, organization, or country

synonym: deport, oust, dislodge

microbe

 a tiny living thing that can only be seen with a microscope and that may cause disease

mushroom

synonym: bullhead, mudcat, cobbler

by-product

synonym: derivative, spin-off, secondary product
