exaggeration

synonym: hyperbole, overstatement, embellishment

dogmatic

adj. characterized by strong and unwavering opinions or beliefs that are often expressed with force and without consideration for alternative viewpoints or evidence

synonym: authoritative, doctrinal, opinionated

The company's old **dogmatic** policies were the cause of its downfall.

conflate

bombard

to attack a place with bombs or gunshots continuously;

synonym: bomb, shoot, blitz

Overprotective parents often **bombard** their children with messages reinforcing their lack of mastery.

hail

v. to call out to someone to get their attention, often from a distance; to greet or welcome someone, especially with enthusiasm or admiration; (noun) precipitation in the form of small balls or lumps of ice that fall from the sky

synonym: greet, salute, welcome

(1) **hail** the victorious team with cheers, (2) **hail** forecast People in the area were forced to **hail** a taxi due to the lack of public transportation options.

greet

synonym: welcome, salute, acknowledge

acclaim

 praise or admiration that is expressed publicly; (verb) to praise or admire someone or something publicly

synonym: praise, admiration, welcome

(1) **acclaim** the winner, (2) treated with royal **acclaim**The actor's performance in the play earned her widespread **acclaim** from the theater community.

enthusiastically

adv. in a way that shows intense and eager enjoyment, interest, or approval

synonym: fervently, eagerly, passionately

(1) **enthusiastically** applauded, (2) discuss **enthusiastically**

The study participants **enthusiastically** participated in the discussion, showing genuine interest.

toolbox

 a container or storage unit for tools, typically characterized by a handle and one or more compartments for organizing and storing various tools and equipment

synonym: tool chest, tool kit, tool bag

rummage

timbre

prosody

n. the patterns of rhythm and sound in language, including the study of meter, rhyme, and intonation; the study of versification and poetic structure; the way in which speech sounds, stress patterns, and intonation are used in poetry and formal speech

synonym: meter, rhythm, verse

meta
