### intensify

v. to increase or make something increase in extent or strength

synonym: amplify, boost, strengthen

(1) **intensify** diplomatic efforts, (2) **intensify** a good relationship

Rebels have pledged to **intensify** the armed struggle against the dictatorship.



### imaginable

adj. capable of being imaginedsynonym: conceivable, plausible, possible

(1) easily **imaginable**, (2) worst **imaginable** case This is the only **imaginable** strategy.

ache

 to experience a dull, persistent pain or discomfort, typically of moderate or low intensity; to feel a continuous dull pain

synonym: hurt, throb, smart

(1) ache abominably, (2) ache all the timeI ache all over after running a marathon yesterday.

### nociceptor

- a sensory nerve ending that is capable of detecting harmful stimuli, such as heat, cold, pressure, or tissue damage, and transmitting this information to the brain
- (1) thermal **nociceptor**, (2) **nociceptor** fiber

  The **nociceptors** in the skin are activated by heat, cold, and pressure.

#### neuron

- a cell that is specialized to carry information within the brain and between the brain and other parts of the body
   synonym: nerve cell
- (1) excite the **neurons**, (2) **neuron** cell body

  Our body transfers information along each **neuron** using an electrical impulse.

# glia

 a type of brain cell that supports and insulates neurons, provides nutrients to them, and helps to regulate their activity

synonym: astrocyte, microglia, oligodendrocyte

(1) neural glia, (2) glia function

The human brain contains both neurons and glia cells.

# superhighway

- n. a large, wide road designed for high-speed traffic synonym: expressway, motorway, artery
- (1) six-lane **superhighway**, (2) a tollgate of a **superhighway**

The University provides a wireless Internet **superhighway** to its students.

#### interconnect

v. to connect similar things

synonym: interlink, complect, annex

(1) directly **interconnect** with those systems, (2) human activities **interconnect** with the environment

Our system can now **interconnect** with other databases.

#### salience

the quality of being prominent, significant, or relevant;
 the degree to which something stands out or is noticeable

synonym: prominence, importance, significance

(1) the **salience** of the topic, (2) emotional **salience**The **salience** of the issue was highlighted in the national news.

#### modulate

v. to change the key, style, loudness, etc., of something in music to create a particular effect; to fix or adjust the time, amount, degree, or rate of something

synonym: regulate, inflect, adjust

(1) **modulate** the function, (2) **modulate** from one key to another

These chemicals **modulate** the effect of metabolism.

### endorphin

 a natural hormone-like substance that is produced by the body and that acts on the nervous system to reduce pain and induce a feeling of well-being

synonym: pain reliever, mood elevator

(1) beta- endorphin, (2) endorphin rush

The release of **endorphins** during exercise can provide a natural high and help to relieve stress.

# enkephalin

 a type of peptide molecule that acts as a neurotransmitter in the brain and is involved in pain relief and other physiological processes

*synonym*: endorphin, endomorphin

# (1) **enkephalin** receptor, (2) opioid **enkephalin**

The level of **enkephalin** in the brain can be affected by certain drugs.

#### determinant

 a factor, circumstance, or condition that contributes to the shaping, influencing, or determining of a particular outcome or result

synonym: cause, factor, element

(1) environmental **determinant**, (2) a **determinant** of crop yields

One **determinant** of success is having a positive attitude and a strong work ethic.

#### medicinal

adj. of or relating to the treatment or cure of diseasesynonym: curative, therapeutic, healing

(1) **medicinal** chemistry, (2) traditional **medicinal**The **medicinal** properties of this herb have been known to help with various ailments.

#### anesthetic

n. a substance that is administered to a person or an animal to produce a loss of sensation or consciousness so that medical or surgical procedures can be performed without causing pain

synonym: sedative, anesthesia, painkiller

(1) anesthetic injection, (2) local anesthetic

The dentist administered an **anesthetic** to numb the patient's mouth before the procedure.
