#### mindset

 the established set of attitudes or fixed ideas held by someone

synonym: attitude, ethos, mentality

#### insecure

adj. not firm or firmly fixed; likely to fail or give way, or not assured of safety

synonym: uncertain, unsure, unconfident

#### drastic

adj. radical and extreme; likely to have a significant or far-reaching impact

synonym: extreme, fierce, radical

#### buzzword

 a word or phrase that is fashionable or popular within a particular industry, field, or culture, often used to convey a sense of innovation or sophistication

synonym: cant, catchphrase, trendy word

#### sleazy

 adj. marked by low moral standards or questionable ethics;

## pandemic

 an outbreak of a disease that affects many people over a very wide area

skit
