#### envision

v. to imagine or expect what a situation will be like in the future

*synonym*: anticipate, foresee, picture

#### poetic

 adj. of or relating to poetry (= a piece of writing that emphasizes the expression of feelings and ideas); using language in an imaginative and expressive way

synonym: literary, verse-like, rhythmic

(1) poetic genius, (2) poetic justice

The sunset was so beautiful it looked like a **poetic** scene from a movie.

# pessimism

 a tendency to see the worst in things and anticipate adverse outcomes; a belief that the world is generally bad or that something will go wrong more often than it will go right

synonym: negativity, defeatism, cynicism

(1) deep **pessimism**, (2) sense of **pessimism** 

The CEO's constant **pessimism** about the company's future affected employee morale.

### optimist

n. a person who tends to expect the best in all things and to be hopeful and confident about the futuresynonym: positive thinker, dreamer, idealist

(1) **optimist** by nature, (2) excessive **optimist**She is a confident **optimist** who always looks on the bright side.

rev

 a measure of the rate at which an engine or motor rotates, often expressed in revolutions per minute (RPM); (verb) to increase the number of rotations per minute

synonym: revolution, RPM, speed

(1) low- **rev** engine, (2) **rev** up the crowd He stepped on the gas pedal, and the engine released a loud **rev**.

### uncanny

adj. strange or mysterious, often in a way that is unsettling synonym: arcane, astonishing, eerie

(1) in an **uncanny** manner, (2) **uncanny** resemblance She has an **uncanny** sense of who is telling a lie.

### hallucinate

- v. to experience a seemingly real perception of something that does not actually exist, usually as a result of a mental illness or drug use
- (1) start to **hallucinate**, (2) **hallucinate** with drug Sleep-deprived people gradually lose their concentration and may **hallucinate**.

# conjure

v. to call forth by magic; to create or bring about through the imagination

synonym: summon, evoke, call forth

(1) **conjure** evil spirits away, (2) **conjure** a vision The magician **conjured** up a rabbit out of thin air.

#### unreal

*adj.* imaginary; not existing in fact *synonym*: false, fake, fictitious

(1) have an unreal feeling, (2) unreal situation

The idea of winning the lottery seemed so **unreal** that he didn't even bother buying a ticket.

#### translucent

 adj. allowing light to pass through but scattering it so that objects behind cannot be seen clearly; partially transparent

*synonym*: semi-transparent, see-through

(1) translucent glass, (2) translucent skin

The sunlight shone through the **translucent** curtains, casting a warm glow in the room.

# jellyfish

 a marine creature with a soft, jelly-like body and tentacles for stinging

synonym: medusa, sea nettle, moon jelly

(1) spineless jellyfish, (2) jellyfish sting

The beach was filled with hundreds of **jellyfish**, so swimming was not recommended.

# otherworldly

adj. supernatural, other than worldly; not of this world synonym: celestial, ethereal, unearthly

(1) **otherworldly** experience, (2) **otherworldly** creature The **otherworldly** landscape was filled with strange, glowing plants.

# augment

v. to increase the size, extent, quantity, etc. of something by adding something to it

synonym: boost, increase, expand

(1) **augment** the reality, (2) **augment** immunity Economic factors and monetary policy **augmented** inflation.

tau

- the 19th letter of the Greek alphabet, transliterated as "t"; (of physics, tau particle) a fundamental particle known as the tau lepton that is an elementary particle with a negative electric charge and a spin of 1/2
- (1) **tau** particle, (2) the symbol of **tau**The **tau** protein has been found to play a role in the

development of Alzheimer's disease and other neurological disorders.

#### curate

 a clergyman who is in charge of a parish; a person in charge of a museum, gallery, or church, responsible for the care and display of its collections and exhibitions; (verb) to carefully select, organize, and maintain items in a collection, exhibition, or presentation

synonym: minister, caretaker, (verb) arrange

(1) perpetual **curate**, (2) **curate** an art website The art museum has hired a **curate** to select and display pieces from its collection.

# symbolize

v. to represent or stand for something else, particularly an abstract concept or idea; to be an emblem or sign of something

synonym: represent, signify, emblemize

(1) **symbolize** hope, (2) **symbolize** freedom In many cultures, the color white **symbolizes** purity and innocence.

# fleeting

*adj.* brief or temporary, lasting only a short time *synonym*: temporary, brief, transitory

(1) for a **fleeting** moment, (2) **fleeting** opportunity
She savored the **fleeting** happiness she felt during the vacation.

# opacity

 the quality or state of being opaque (= not allowing light to pass through); a lack of transparency or clarity in a person's behavior, motives, or communication

synonym: translucency, cloudiness, opaqueness

(1) light opacity, (2) opacity level

The **opacity** of the company's financial statements raised suspicions of fraud.

sect

 a group of people who follow a particular religious or philosophical belief system, especially one that is regarded as outside the norm or mainstream

*synonym*: group, faction, cult

(1) sect beliefs, (2) secret sect

The minority **sect** believed in a set of unconventional religious practices.

liken

v. to compare something or someone to something or someone else to emphasize similarity or likeness; to describe or represent something as being like something else in some way

synonym: compare, equate, analogize

(1) liken to a flower, (2) liken to a bird

Some people **liken** meditation to a mental shower, refreshing and rejuvenating the mind.

glaze

to cover or coat with a thin layer of film, particularly a shiny or glossy layer, such as a layer of protective material on ceramics or a top coat of paint on a surface; to apply a thin, glossy coating to food, often using a sauce or syrup

synonym: coat, enamel, varnish

(1) **glaze** a window, (2) **glaze** over eyes

The baker used a brush to **glaze** the donuts with a sweet, shiny coating.

homage

 a show of respect or honor, often by performing an act of reverence or by paying tribute

*synonym*: respect, deference, reverence

(1) paying homage to tradition, (2) vassal homage

The crowd gave a standing ovation as a sign of **homage** to the retiring athlete.

brace

 a device, typically one of a pair, for holding something in position or for strengthening an object; (verb) to support or hold steady and make steadfast

*synonym*: support, clamp, (verb) strengthen

(1) brace for impact, (2) brace my energies

She wore a **brace** on her leg to support her injured ankle.

# fingertip

- n. the end or tip of a finger
- (1) apply **fingertip** pressure, (2) burn my **fingertip**The archaeologist ran his **fingertips** along the pattern of the tombstones.
