#### daredevil

 a person who takes unnecessary risks, especially involving physical feats or dangerous activities, often for entertainment or thrill-seeking purposes; someone who is fearless and daring

synonym: adventurer, risk-taker, hothead

(1) reckless daredevil, (2) daredevil acrobat

The **daredevil's** death-defying stunt left the audience in awe.

## lobotomy

a surgical procedure in which a section of the brain is removed or disconnected from the rest of the brain, often used as a treatment for mental illness in the past synonym: brain surgery, prefrontal lobotomy, psychosurgery

(1) **lobotomy** procedure, (2) prefrontal **lobotomy Lobotomy** surgery was once a common treatment for mental illness, but it is now considered unethical.

## psychotic

adj. relating to or characterized by a loss of touch with reality; exhibiting or suffering from a severe mental disorder characterized by delusions, hallucinations, or disordered thinking

synonym: deranged, unstable, certifiable

## hippocampus

- a major component of the brain of humans and other vertebrates that is part of the limbic system and is vital for memory
- (1) involvement of the **hippocampus**, (2) neurons in the **hippocampus**

The **hippocampus** is crucial for learning and memory storage.

#### limbic

- adj. of or relating to the system of the brain that supports a variety of functions, including emotion, behavior, long-term memory, and olfaction
- (1) limbic cortex, (2) limbic epilepsy

The **limbic** brain region responded readily to negative or sad sounds.

### improvisation

n. the act of making something up on the spot or creating or performing something without preparation

synonym: spontaneity, ad-lib, extemporization

(1) **improvisation** on stage, (2) jazz **improvisation** He created a beautiful piece of music using only **improvisation**.

#### redefine

v. to change the meaning or interpretation of something; to make people think about something in a new or different way

*synonym*: reconsider, reformulate, alter

(1) **redefine** customer experience, (2) **redefine** our role The video telephony application has **redefined** the way we work.

#### monolithic

adj. characterized by massiveness, rigidity, and uniformity synonym: massive, monumental, hulking

(1) **monolithic** block, (2) **monolithic** system

Big technology companies try to integrate customers' data into **monolithic** applications.

#### transcribe

- v. to copy or reproduce something in written or printed form; to translate spoken language into written text synonym: copy, record, transliterate

#### neuron

- a cell that is specialized to carry information within the brain and between the brain and other parts of the body
   synonym: nerve cell

electrical impulse.

#### cortical

- adj. relating to or located in the outer layer of an organ or body structure, particularly the cortex of the brain
- (1) cortical neurons, (2) cortical activity

The MRI showed activity in the **cortical** region of the patient's brain.

## synapse

- the fact or state of failing to finish an activity and of stopping using, making, or doing it
- synapse circuit, (2) end at a synapse
   Animals transmit nerve impulses through synapses.

#### erode

v. to gradually wear away or break down (rock, soil, or other material) through the action of wind, water, or other natural agents; to gradually weaken or undermine (something) over time

synonym: wear away, deteriorate, corrode

(1) **erode** coast, (2) **erode** trust

The ongoing budget cuts have **eroded** the quality of education in many schools.

#### scrawl

v. to write or draw something in a careless or untidy way, often with difficulty or haste

synonym: scribble, scratch, squiggle

#### concentric

adj. having a common center, with circles or spheres that share a common center point; having shapes or forms that are aligned or nested within one another

synonym: homocentric, nested, circular

#### declarative

adj. relating to or functioning as a statement or assertion; making a declaration or assertion

*synonym*: assertive, conclusive, indicative

#### basal

adj. forming or belonging to a bottom layer or base of something

*synonym*: beginning, rudimental, introductory

## ganglion

 a group of nerve cells located outside the brain and spinal cord, often forming a swelling or knot; responsible for controlling certain bodily functions or movements

#### cerebellum
