### complicated

adj. involving a lot of different things or parts in a way that is difficult to understand or analyze

### comprise

v. to include or consist of something; the act of making up or forming something

### precise

adj. sharply exact or accurate or delimited

### machinery

 a group of large machines or the components of a machine that make it work; social institution functions or structure for doing something

synonym: apparatus, appliance, equipment

### opposition

the act of disagreeing or resisting; the state of strong disagreement

synonym: resistance, hostility, antagonism

### interaction

- n. the act of connecting with someone, mainly when working, playing, or spending time with them
- synonym: dealings, exchange, relations

#### coherent

adj. logical and consistent; (noun) the quality of being clear and easy to understand

### emergent

### predict

### pinwheel

### grade

### slightly

adv. in a small degree or extent; a little synonym: barely, narrowly, scarcely

#### vision

 the ability to think about or see the future with imagination and intelligence; the faculty of being able to see

synonym: sight, image, concept

### confuse

 to mistake one thing for another; to make somebody hard to understand

synonym: confound, obscure, disorient

(1) **confuse** the listener, (2) **confuse** fantasy with reality Her remarks **confused** the debate.

### destroy

v. to ruin or damage severely or completely; to eradicate or eliminate completely

synonym: demolish, ruin, obliterate

(1) **destroy** the ecosystem, (2) **destroyed** evidence The building was **destroyed** in the fire and had to be rebuilt.

#### subtle

adj. not readily apparent or visible synonym: slight, nuanced, exquisite

(1) subtle changes, (2) a subtle poison

A famous artist painted the room in a **subtle** pink hue.

### absolutely

adv. without restriction or limitation; completely or utterly synonym: completely, utterly, definitely

(1) **absolutely** against, (2) **absolutely** obsessed with the girl

I am **absolutely** opposed to his idea because of morality.

### unexpected

*adj.* not anticipated or regarded as likely to happen *synonym*: surprising, unanticipated, incredible

(1) an **unexpected** visitor, (2) some **unexpected** events The **unexpected** rainstorm caused the collapse of the corral.

#### decide

v. to make up someone's mind about something; to come to a conclusion or judgment after considering options

synonym: choose, determine, settle

(1) **decide** a question, (2) **decide** on a course of action She couldn't **decide** whether to order the pizza or the pasta for dinner.

### kingdom

n. the country ruled by a king or queen

synonym: empire, realm, land

(1) establish his **kingdom**, (2) a subordinate **kingdom** By remaining neutral, this **kingdom** continued to exist.

bat

 a nocturnal animal with wings that flies and feeds at night, similar to a mouse; a piece of wood with a handle used for hitting the ball in sports including baseball, cricket, and table tennis

roost

 a place where birds rest or sleep, typically on a branch or in a birdhouse or coop

#### maternal

adj. relating to or characteristic of a mother; having feelings that are typical of a caring mother towards her child

#### colony

 a country or an area that is governed by a more powerful country that is often far away

#### hibernation

 a state of inactivity and metabolic depression in animals during the winter

rear

adj. at, toward, or near the back part of something; (verb) to look after a child until it is an adult

chip

association

 a people or groups of people who have joined in a single organization together for a particular purpose; a social or business connection or relationship

### subgroup

n. a smaller group within a larger groupsynonym: subset, division, segment

### split

v. to divide, or to make something divide into two or more parts, especially along a particular line

synonym: break, divide, break apart

#### erratic

 adj. characterized by lack of consistency, regularity, or predictable behavior; unpredictable or inconsistent in movement, behavior, or quality

synonym: unpredictable, irregular, unstable

The stock market has been behaving in an **erratic** manner, making it difficult for investors to predict future trends.

#### fission

n. the splitting of an atomic nucleus into two or smaller nuclei, releasing a large amount of energy; the process of breaking something into smaller parts or pieces

Nuclear **fission** is the process of splitting an atom into two smaller ones.

### **fusion**

the process of combining two or more things to form a single entity

Nuclear **fusion** is a process in which atomic nuclei combine to form heavier nuclei.

### dynamics

n. the branch of mechanics that deals with the motion of bodies under the action of forces, including the particular case in which a body remains at rest; forces that produce or stimulate movement, growth, or change

synonym: mechanics, kinetics, kinematics

(1) **dynamics** of group, (2) **dynamics** of economy

The relationship **dynamics** between the two countries were complex and constantly changing.

### regularly

adv. at regular intervals or times

synonym: repeatedly, routinely, usually

(1) **regularly** arranged, (2) post **regularly** to a blog

This site **regularly** shares high-quality academic materials.

### merge

 to combine or integrate things, or to cause this to happen

synonym: combine, join, coalesce

(1) **merge** into a new party, (2) **merge** those systems into a new one

This consulting firm decided to **merge** the two companies into one.

#### extract

n. a short passage taken from a book, piece of music, etc.; a substance obtained from something through a specific process; (verb) to obtain from something or to remove something by effort or force

synonym: excerpt, quote, distillation

(1) a brief **extract** from the book, (2) botanical **extract** Anesthetize the gum before **extracting** the teeth.

technique

a particular way or art of doing something that needs skill

*synonym*: approach, procedure, strategy

(1) a **technique** in martial arts, (2) the **technique** applied to construction

Jockey's superior technique brought him victory.

#### structure

 n. the way of construction of something and the arrangement of its parts, or a complex thing constructed of many parts

synonym: construction, architecture, establishment

(1) the **structure** of a machine, (2) **structure** and function of the brain

The organizational **structure** of start-ups is often flat and straightforward.

nod

 to lower and raise one's head, sometimes several times, as to show approval, agreement, greeting, or confirmation

synonym: respond, acknowledge, greet

nod at each other, (2) nod courteously
 She nodded quietly in response to the question.

bond

 a close emotional connection between two or more people; a certificate of debt that a government or corporation issues to raise money

synonym: bind, adhesion, attachment

(1) **bond** as a family, (2) global **bond** market They had formed a friendship **bond**.

communal

adj. belonging to or used by a group rather than individuals; for common use

synonym: collaborative, combined, collective

(1) **communal** swimming pool, (2) **communal** combination of funds

**Communal** elections were held in several European countries.

cryptic

adj. having a hidden or obscure meaning or message;mysterious or puzzling in nature

synonym: enigmatic, mysterious, obscure

(1) cryptic language, (2) cryptic crossword

The message was so **cryptic** that I had no idea what it meant.

#### hibernate

v. to spend the winter in a state of rest, often in a sheltered place such as a cave or den

synonym: sleep, slumber, nap

(1) **hibernate** in the adult stage, (2) **hibernate** for months Bears usually **hibernate** during the winter months to conserve energy and stay warm.

### separate

- v. to force, take, or pull apart; mark as different synonym: disunite, isolate, ramify
- (1) **separate** video into chapter, (2) **separate** cream from milk

We need to **separate** the aspect of his personality from the part of his competence when making an investment decision.

#### brain

 the organ inside the head that is responsible for one's movement, thought, memory, and feeling

synonym: intellect, mind, encephalon

(1) basic **brain** function, (2) permanent **brain** damage X-rays revealed a small tumor in his **brain**.

#### peanut

 a type of legume that grows underground and is widely cultivated and consumed as a food source

*synonym*: nut, groundnut, earthnut

(1) **peanut** butter, (2) the seed of a **peanut**Some people have severe allergies to **peanuts** and must avoid them completely.

#### maintain

v. to continue to uphold or sustain; to keep in a particular state or condition; to assert or declare something to be true

*synonym*: preserve, uphold, sustain

(1) **maintain** order, (2) **maintain** good health I need to **maintain** my car regularly to prevent any major mechanical issues.

#### individualize

 to make something personal or more personal to suit the needs of a particular person, place, etc. synonym: personalize, differentiate

(1) **individualize** each patient, (2) **individualize** dosages Our schools offer **individualized** education by excellent teachers.

### primate

any mammal of the order Primates, which includes monkeys, apes, and humans

*synonym*: ape, monkey, lemur

(1) **primate** species, (2) **primate** sanctuary

Many scientists study **primate** behavior and intelligence.

### dolphin

 a marine mammal that typically has a beaklike snout, a streamlined body, and flippers and that feeds on fish and squid

synonym: porpoise, cetacean, marine mammal

(1) dolphin show, (2) dolphin-watching tour

The large group of **dolphins** swam gracefully in the ocean, jumping out of the water now and then.

#### stable

adj. firm and steady; not easily moved, disturbed, or changed

synonym: sturdy, unmoving, durable

(1) in **stable** condition, (2) have a **stable** job

Relations between the two countries have been relatively **stable** due to the summit meeting.

### cognitive

adj. of or relating to mental processes of understanding synonym: perceivable, mind, mental

(1) improve **cognitive** function, (2) research on **cognitive** psychology

His **cognitive** faculties were getting worse because of a lack of sleep.

#### virtual

adj. being actually such in almost every respect; existing in essence or effect though not in actual fact

*synonym*: practical

(1) a <b>virtual</b> image,	(2) trading of <b>virtual</b> currencies					
She is the <b>virtual</b> president of the company.						

#### nutshell

n. the hard, outer covering or protective casing that encloses the kernel or fruit of certain types of nuts, such as walnuts or acorns; a concise and condensed summary or explanation of something

synonym: summary, essence, covering

(1) move into a **nutshell**, (2) **nutshell** version Can you explain your argument in a **nutshell?** 

#### cohesive

adj. causing cohesion; bringing people or things together synonym: sticky, close-knit, well-integrated

(1) **cohesive** ability, (2) highly **cohesive** group

He skillfully combines these fragments into a **cohesive** whole.

#### survive

- v. to live or exist despite a dangerous event or period synonym: endure, persist, stay
- (1) **survive** a blizzard, (2) **survive** a plane crash These birds can only **survive** in temperate climates.

#### thrive

- v. to grow vigorously; to make steady progress synonym: bloom, flourish, prosper
- (1) **thrive** in a society, (2) **thrive** on pressure Without investment, a business cannot **thrive**.

### simplicity

n. the quality or condition of being natural and plain or easy to understand or do

synonym: easiness, plainness, modesty

### resilient

adj. able to withstand or recover quickly from difficult conditions

synonym: robust, sturdy, tough

#### dramatic

adj. very sudden, very excellent, or full of action and excitement

synonym: striking, theatrical, breathtaking

#### incredible

adj. unbelievable; enormous

synonym: unbelievable, fantastical, inconceivable

#### desert

- arid land with little or no vegetation often covered with sand or rocks
- (1) **desert** basin, (2) oasis in the **desert** This region is predominantly **desert**.

#### meerkat

- a small carnivorous mammal that lives in southern
   Africa, known for its distinctive upright stance and curious and social behavior, often living in underground burrows in groups
- (1) meerkat colony, (2) watchful meerkat

The famous **meerkat** posture, where they hold their forelegs up and out to the sides, is called "sentinel" behavior and is used to watch for approaching predators.

### fascinating

adj. extremely interesting

synonym: alluring, intriguing, captivating

(1) **fascinating** story, (2) completely **fascinating** to me The museum houses a **fascinating** collection of Celtic artifacts.

#### creature

n. a living being, especially an animal

synonym: being, animal, organism

(1) creature of habit, (2) artificial creature

#### strict

adj. strongly limiting someone's freedom; allowing no deviation from a standard, rule, belief, etc.

synonym: rigorous, inflexible, relentless

### hierarchy

 a system in which people or things are organized into different levels of importance from highest to lowest

synonym: ranking, order, scale

### dominant

adj. more important, influential, or easy to notice than anything else of the same type

synonym: chief, predominant, prevailing

(1) achieve a **dominant** share, (2) **dominant** force Her company soon won a **dominant** market share.

#### subordinate

adj. of lower rank or importance, often used to describe a person in a position of inferiority or inferior status; serving as a secondary or supporting element to something else

synonym: inferior, secondary, subservient

The CEO's **subordinate** employees were expected to follow his instructions without question.

### sentinel

n. a person or thing that stands guard or keeps watch; a soldier or guard who stands watch to provide securitysynonym: guard, watchman, lookout

### babysitter

pup

collar

movement

 a group of people working together to achieve a shared goal, especially a political, social, or artistic one; the process of moving or being moved, physically or figuratively

synonym: motion, progression, action

The **movement** of the dancers on stage was graceful and elegant.

#### reserve

v. to keep something for future use or contingency; to obtain or arrange something, such as a meeting, seat, etc., in advance

synonym: keep, hold, preserve
