#### mover

n. a person or company that specializes in moving goods or possessions from one location to another; a professional moving service or an individual who performs this task for friends, family members, or customers

synonym: removalist, proposer

#### intern

 to put someone in prison, especially for political or military reasons; (noun) a student or trainee who works, sometimes for free, to get work experience or to fulfill qualification criteria

*synonym*: apprentice, trainee, student

The navy **interned** ships of defeated nations.

#### extrapolate

v. to guess or think about what might happen or estimate something using the facts that you have now

synonym: deduce, reason, infer

(1) **extrapolate** the results, (2) **extrapolate** animal dose

This predictive model mechanically **extrapolates** past trends



into the future.

#### opportune

adj. suitable or happening at a time that is suitable or convenient for a particular purpose

synonym: suitable, timely, practical

(1) **opportune** occasion, (2) an **opportune** remark The phone rang at the most **opportune** time.

### unequal

adj. different in amount, size, degree, or value; not fairsynonym: unfair, uneven, imbalanced

(1) **unequal** distribution, (2) **unequal** opportunity

The income inequality in the country is becoming increasingly **unequal**.

# quadrant

 a quarter of a circle or sphere or any of the four parts of an area divided by two intersecting lines or planes

synonym: section, division, sector

(1) Northeast **quadrant**, (2) **quadrant** chart The map was divided into four **quadrants** to examine the geographical region closely.

# disparity

 a significant difference or inequality between two or more things

*synonym*: difference, inequality, gap

(1) the **disparity** between theory and reality, (2) income **disparity** 

There is a significant **disparity** in pay between men and women in the company.

# mediocrity

n. the state or quality of being average or of having only moderate ability, success, or value; the state or quality of being uninspired or unoriginal

synonym: averageness, ordinariness, unoriginality

sink into mediocrity, (2) escape mediocrity
 was content with living a life of mediocrity.

### policymaker

 a person in charge of or involved in developing action plans for a political party, business, etc.

synonym: lawmaker, legislator

(1) education **policymaker**, (2) regional **policymaker Policymakers** struggle to develop various laws and regulations to address international trade conflicts.

## disappoint

v. to fail to meet someone or their hopes or expectations; to make someone feel sad

synonym: sadden, dismay, frustrate

- (1) **disappoint** the audience, (2) don't **disappoint** me She worked very hard not to **disappoint** her boss's expectations.
- v. to make a person or an animal unconscious or dizzy, especially by hitting them on the head; to make someone surprised or shocked greatly

synonym: shock, amaze, astound

(1) **stun** fish, (2) **stun** an audience

This sprinter **stunned** the world with his speed.

#### germ

stun

 a very tiny living that causes the disease; a piece of something such as an organism, concept, etc., capable of growing into a new one or part of one

synonym: bacterium, microbe, pathogen

(1) antibiotic-resistant **germ**, (2) a **germ-free** environment The **germ** of his idea came from watching birds flying in flocks.

deem

- v. to consider or decide something in a particular way synonym: believe, consider, suppose
- (1) **deem** socially responsible, (2) **deem** wrong or inappropriate

Regarding earthquakes, some commercial buildings were **deemed** unsafe.

#### socioeconomic

adj. relating to the social and economic factors that shape an individual, group, or community, particularly in terms of income, occupation, education, and social class

synonym: social, economic, financial

(1) **socioeconomic** status, (2) **socioeconomic** issues The **socioeconomic** conditions of a country can significantly affect its political stability.

#### overhaul

n. a thorough examination, evaluation, or inspection of something, often with the intent of making necessary improvements; a major reorganization or restructuring of a system or process; (verb) to thoroughly examine, repair, and improve something to ensure that it is functioning properly and up to standard

*synonym*: renovation, revamp, modernization

(1) **overhaul** process, (2) vehicle **overhaul**The mechanic suggested an **overhaul** of the engine to improve performance.

#### artifact

 a person-made object, especially one of historical or cultural interest

synonym: antique, relic, heirloom

(1) paleolithic **artifacts**, (2) Peruvian **artifacts**The museum has a vast collection of Greek **artifacts**.

# homogeneity

*n.* the quality or state of being homogeneous; uniformity in composition or character

synonym: uniformity, similarity, sameness

(1) soil **homogeneity**, (2) genetic **homogeneity**The lack of diversity in the boardroom highlights the **homogeneity** of the company's leadership.

#### concede

 to acknowledge or admit the truth or existence of something often reluctantly

synonym: admit, acknowledge, allow

(1) **concede** a territory, (2) **concede** a point He had to **concede** defeat after losing the game.

#### segregate

v. to separate or set apart from others, often based on race, gender, or some other characteristic

synonym: isolate, separate, divide

(1) **segregate** by race, (2) **segregate** boys and girls The school board decided to **segregate** students by the ability to meet their needs better.

## pedagogy

 the method or art of teaching or instructing, especially as an academic subject or profession

*synonym*: teaching, instruction, education

(1) modern **pedagogy**, (2) student-centered **pedagogy** The teacher's innovative **pedagogy** helped her students learn in fun and engaging way.

## bureaucracy

 a system of government in which most of the important decisions are made by state officials rather than by elected representatives

synonym: administration, government, system

(1) government **bureaucracy**, (2) arbitrary **bureaucracy**The bumbling **bureaucracy** made it difficult to get the permits we needed.

#### inventive

*adj.* able to come up with novel and unique ideas *synonym*: imaginative, creative, innovative

(1) have the **inventive** talent, (2) **inventive** approach All language around the world is consistently **inventive** but not intrusive.

# graveyard

n. a cemetery, especially one in a churchyardsynonym: cemetery, burial ground, churchyard

(1) **graveyard** of life, (2) bodies in a **graveyard**The ancestral **graveyard** was peaceful, with rows of headstones and tall trees.

# complacent

adj. satisfied with the status quo and not wishing to make changes

synonym: content, satisfied, self-satisfied

(1) **complacent** attitude, (2) **complacent** with past successes

He became **complacent** in his job and stopped trying to improve.
