ontogeny

The **ontogeny** process in amphibians is marked by distinct stages, from egg to tadpole to adult.

allometry

 the study or analysis of the proportional or relative growth of different parts of an organism or object about each other

synonym: scaling, proportion, growth ratio

(1) allometry equation, (2) bone length allometry

The **allometry** curve of this dinosaur species suggests a drastic change in its feeding habits as it grew.

duck-billed

The **duck-billed** platypus is a unique mammal found in Australia.

subadult

determinant

 a factor, circumstance, or condition that contributes to the shaping, influencing, or determining of a particular outcome or result

synonym: cause, factor, element

gnarl

a rough knotted swelling on a tree, knot in wood; a contorted or twisted shape or feature

synonym: knot, twist, bump

inflate
