bond

 a close emotional connection between two or more people; a certificate of debt that a government or corporation issues to raise money

synonym: bind, adhesion, attachment

(1) **bond** as a family, (2) global **bond** market They had formed a friendship **bond**.

celebrate

v. to acknowledge a memorable or good day or event with a social gathering or enjoyable activity

synonym: praise, glorify, honor

convince

v. to persuade someone or make someone believe that something is true

primary

adj. first or highest in rank, order, or importance; most fundamental or essential; pertaining to the initial or introductory stage of something, such as a school year or election cycle

certificate

an official document stating that the information contained within is true

discovery

 the act or process of finding information, a place, or an object, or learning about something that was previously not known

synonym: finding, uncovering, detection

(1) a scientific **discovery**, (2) the great **discovery** of the century

magical

adj. produced by or containing supernatural powers *synonym*: enchanting, occult, supernatural

(1) magical place, (2) magical powers

When I was a child, my mother often cast **magical** spells to ease my pain whenever I was injured.

fascinating

adj. extremely interesting

synonym: alluring, intriguing, captivating

(1) **fascinating** story, (2) completely **fascinating** to me The museum houses a **fascinating** collection of Celtic artifacts.

magic

 beliefs and actions employed to influence supernatural beings and forces; any art or performance that invokes supernatural powers

synonym: fascination, illusion, wizardry

(1) a magic spell, (2) she is magic

He performed **magic** tricks with sophisticated moves.

dye

v. to color a textile or hair by immersing it in a colored liquid or substance

synonym: color, tint, stain

(1) dye a T-shirt red, (2) dye patterns

She **dyed** her hair purple for a change.

chemistry

- the branch of the natural sciences dealing with the composition of substances and their properties and reactions
- (1) professor of chemistry, (2) the chemistry of soil

He is familiar with **chemistry** and biology.

coincide

- to take place at or near the same time
- *synonym*: overlap, coexist, concur
- (1) partly **coincide**, (2) **coincide** with reality

consolation

the comfort received by a person after misfortune or disappointment

synonym: comfort, condolence, solacing

bleach

to remove color or stains, whiten, or sterilize using a solution of chemicals or other substances, such as bleach

an unfortunate event, especially one causing damage or injury

survive

- v. to live or exist despite a dangerous event or period synonym: endure, persist, stay

indelible

adj. cannot be removed, erased, or forgot synonym: enduring, lasting, unforgettable

immediately

adv. now or without delaysynonym: directly, instantly, promptly

(1) **immediately** recall a product, (2) write him an answer **immediately**

A suspension order from the court is effective **immediately**.

impressive

adj. arousing admiration due to size, quality, or skill synonym: impactful, remarkable, exceptional

(1) **impressive** performances, (2) an **impressive** array of facts

The budget reduction was an **impressive** feat for our nation.

formula

 a group of symbols, letters, or numbers that represent a rule, law, or mathematical statement

synonym: expression, recipe, procedure

(1) structural formula, (2) a binomial formula

The teacher told the students to memorize the math **formula**.

recruit

v. to persuade someone to work for a company; to find new members for an organization, the armed forces, etc.

synonym: raise, enroll, enlist

(1) recruit a good worker, (2) recruit a new hire

The colonial government **recruited** militia support when civil war broke out.

unknowingly

adv. without intention or being aware of what is happening synonym: inadvertently, unwittingly

(1) **unknowingly** commit a crime, (2) **unknowingly** avoid him

She became ill after **unknowingly** taking rotten food.

invention

 the creation of a new device or process resulting from study and experimentation; the act of inventing

synonym: creation, design, innovation

(1) the **invention** of new techniques, (2) common **invention** Necessity is the mother of **invention**.

lab

 a workplace for the conduct of scientific research; a laboratory

synonym: workshop, laboratory, research chamber

(1) lab instrument, (2) medical lab

The Prime Minister will pay a courtesy visit to the Nobel laureate's **lab**.

falsify

v. to alter or manipulate information, data, or evidence to deceive or mislead; to prove to be false or incorrect

synonym: fudge, distort, manipulate

(1) falsify data, (2) falsify documents

The scientist was caught attempting to **falsify** the results of the study.

tamper

v. to interfere with something in a way that causes damage or unauthorized alteration; to meddle with or manipulate something without permission or authority; (noun) a tool or device used for interfering with or altering something in a way that is unauthorized or illegal

synonym: meddle, fiddle, monkey

- (1) **tamper** with evidence, (2) **tamper-resistant** It's important not to **tamper** with the settings on your computer unless you know what you're doing.
- v. to cut or damage the surface of something or the skin with a sharp or pointed object

synonym: claw, rub, scrape

(1) **scratch** off a name, (2) **scratch** my signature Don't **scratch** your mosquito bites.

engraving

 a design or picture made by cutting lines into a metal plate or stone, especially for printing

synonym: etching, carving, printing

- (1) a wood **engraving**, (2) **engraving** tools

 The intricate **engraving** on the silver vase was a work of art.
- v. to move one's hand or an object over the surface of something with pressure

synonym: scrub, massage, stroke

(1) rub shoulders, (2) rub a glass windowShe rubbed the sore spot on her leg to ease the pain.

centrifuge

n. a machine that uses centrifugal force (= a type of inertial force that appears to act on an object moving in a circular path and is directed away from the center) to separate substances of different densities, especially to separate liquids from solids

synonym: separator, extractor, spinner

scratch

rub

(1) **centrifuge** tube, (2) ultra-high-speed **centrifuges**The laboratory technician placed the blood samples in the **centrifuge** to separate the different components.

obsess

v. to fill the mind of someone continually so that one can't think of anything else

synonym: torment, beset, engross

(1) **obsess** over her weight, (2) he is **obsessed** with the fear

He's utterly **obsessed** with his promotion.

calculation

the act or process of using numbers to judge an amount of something

synonym: analysis, computation, estimate

(1) make a **calculation**, (2) **calculation** of loss and gain The error in the **calculation** was attributable to rounding.

responsible

adj. answerable or accountable for something within one's power, control, or management

synonym: accountable, answerable, liable

(1) **responsible** action, (2) **responsible** for a customer service

She's a **responsible** pet owner who ensures her dog gets enough exercise and a healthy diet.

guilt

 the fact of having committed something illegal; the negative feelings caused by believing or knowing that you have done something wrong

synonym: regret, remorse, blame

(1) criminal guilt, (2) feeling of guilt

Shame and **guilt** have significant social influences.

survivor

 a person who remains alive after an event in which others have died

synonym: subsister

(1) ovarian cancer **survivor**, (2) a single **survivor**

The shipwreck **survivor** was rescued after floating in the ocean for three days.

sacrifice

n. the act of killing an animal or person or surrendering a possession as an offering to a deity; (verb) to give up something important or valuable to help another person or get or do something that seems more important

synonym: forfeit, immolation, gift

(1) small **sacrifice** for a great cause, (2) **sacrifice** anything to get ahead

You cannot accomplish great things without a **sacrifice** of your time or money.

obvious

adj. easy to see, discover or understand synonym: apparent, conspicuous, evident

(1) **obvious** reasons, (2) his conclusion was **obvious** There are **obvious** differences between the two wine-producing regions.

refuse

- v. to show that one is not willing to do or accept something synonym: turn down, deny, decline
- (1) **refuse** a request, (2) **refuse** the company My initial reaction was to **refuse**.

deem

- v. to consider or decide something in a particular way synonym: believe, consider, suppose
- (1) **deem** socially responsible, (2) **deem** wrong or inappropriate

Regarding earthquakes, some commercial buildings were **deemed** unsafe.

unjust

adj. not fair or equitable; lacking in justice or impartiality; morally unacceptable or wrong

synonym: unfair, inequitable

(1) unjust verdict, (2) unjust accusation

The ruling was considered unjust by many people in the

community.

emotional

adj. relating to people's feelings

synonym: affecting, impactful, impressive

(1) emotional health, (2) emotional distress

Human **emotional** responses vary widely depending on the society to which they belong.

involve

v. to include or affect someone or something as a necessary part of something else

synonym: implicate, include, engage

(1) **involve** a lot of paperwork, (2) **involve** a high degree of risk

The investigation **involves** several government agencies and is expected to take several months.

disappear

v. to cease to exist or be visible

synonym: fade, evaporate, vanish

(1) **disappear** without a trace, (2) **disappear** after a week They watched the train **disappear** into the distance.

stir

v. to mix a liquid or substance by using a spoon or something similar; to cause to be agitated, excited, or roused

synonym: mix, swirl, provoke

(1) stir a sauce, (2) stir up controversy

Topics related to that war may stir up a political hornets' nest.

abandon

v. to leave a place, thing, or person with no intention of returning; (noun) a feeling of extreme emotional intensity

synonym: relinquish, leave behind, disregard

The castle was **abandoned** several years later.

orphan

 a child whose parents are dead or have abandoned them

synonym: waif, stray, fatherless child

(1) **orphan** care, (2) asylum for **orphan** children

The little girl was a war **orphan** and lived in a group home.

concentration

n. the ability to focus all your time and energy on one thing without thinking about anything else.

synonym: attention, engagement, assiduity

(1) **concentration** of armaments, (2) his research area of **concentration**

This exam requires excellent **concentration** to pass.

immigrate

- v. to come to live permanently in a foreign country synonym: migrate, relocate, settle
- (1) **immigrate** to the country, (2) **immigrate** through available legal processes

He immigrated to the United States in search of a better life.

staunch

adj. firmly loyal and devoted, unyielding or resolute synonym: strong, loyal, firm

(1) **staunch** conviction, (2) **staunch** opponent She was a **staunch** supporter of the cause, always willing to speak out for her beliefs.

colonial

adj. of or relating to a colony (= a territory that is controlled by a more powerful country); to the period of time during which a country or region was a colony

synonym: imperial, immigrant, gregarious

(1) oppressive **colonial** rule, (2) **colonial** style The city has a rich **colonial** history, with many historic buildings and landmarks.

movement

 a group of people working together to achieve a shared goal, especially a political, social, or artistic one; the process of moving or being moved, physically or figuratively

The **movement** of the dancers on stage was graceful and elegant.

circulate

v. to move continuously or freely around a place or closed system

synonym: flow, disperse, rotate

independence

- n. freedom from another's or others' control or influencesynonym: freedom, liberty, autonomy
- (1) financial **independence**, (2) **independence** ceremony There is nothing more valuable than **independence** and freedom.

guinea

 a former British gold coin worth 21 shillings or a unit of currency used in some West African countries; (Guinea) a republic in western Africa on the Atlantic

synonym: coin, money, currency

(1) guinea coins, (2) guinea pig

The cost of the antique vase is three guineas.

apartheid

 a system of racial segregation and discrimination that was enforced in South Africa from 1948 to 1994; any similar system of discrimination or segregation based on race, ethnicity, or other factors

synonym: segregation, discrimination, oppression

(1) apartheid system, (2) apartheid policies

The South African government enforced **apartheid** laws that segregated people based on race.

resist

v. to refuse to accept something and attempt to prevent it from happening

synonym: fight, defy, revolt

dictator

 a political leader who has complete power over a country, especially one who has obtained control by force

synonym: autocrat, tyrant, despot

republic

 a state or country in which the people and their elected representatives hold supreme power and which has an elected or nominated president rather than a monarch

synonym: democracy, federation, commonwealth

(1) **republic** democracy, (2) the **republic** of art The United States is a federal presidential constitutional **republic**.

desert

- arid land with little or no vegetation often covered with sand or rocks
- (1) **desert** basin, (2) oasis in the **desert** This region is predominantly **desert**.

spare

adj. additional to what is necessary for ordinary use; (verb) to give time, money, space, etc. to someone

synonym: extra, excess, (verb) afford

(1) **spare** parts, (2) **spare** cost

dissident

 a person who opposes the policies or actions of a government or other authority, often publicly and openly; a rebel or revolutionary

synonym: dissenter, rebel, protester

colonel

a military rank above a lieutenant colonel and below a general

synonym: officer, military, ranking officer

benevolent

adj. well-meaning and kind; serving a charitable or philanthropic purpose

synonym: kindly, compassionate, philanthropic

demonstration

 a display or show, often of a particular skill or product, intended to convince or persuade others

synonym: manifestation, presentation, show

recognize

v. to acknowledge or realize something or someone; to identify, remember, or become aware of something that was previously known or encountered

synonym: acknowledge, identify, admit

(1) **recognize** talent, (2) **recognize** achievement It's important to **recognize** your strengths and weaknesses.

relevance
