prime

prevailing

adj. most frequent, widespread, or currently dominant, usually referring to a particular opinion, attitude, or trendsynonym: dominant, prevalent, current

hero

 a person who is admired or idealized for courage, outstanding achievements, or noble qualities; a character in literature or history who is central to the plot and who exhibits heroic qualities

synonym: champion, protagonist, savior

The soldier who sacrificed his life for his country is considered a national **hero**.

guru

 a spiritual teacher or leader, notably in Hindu and Sikh traditions; a person who has knowledge and expertise in a particular area

synonym: sage, mentor, master

He was considered a **guru** in economics and consulted by many leaders.

proclamation

- n. an official announcement or statement synonym: announcement, declamation, edict

economy

norm

- *n.* something that is regarded as usual, typical, or standard *synonym*: criterion, mean, standard

asylum

n. protection granted to someone who has left their home country as a political refugee

synonym: refuge, shelter, haven

archives
