strap

synonym: prey, target, sufferer

unquenchable

adj. unable to be satisfied or appeased; impossible to extinguish or put an end to

synonym: insatiable, never-ending

(1) **unquenchable** enthusiasm, (2) **unquenchable** desire Her **unquenchable** thirst for knowledge motivated her to pursue a research career.

thirst

 a feeling of needing something to drink; a strong desire for something

synonym: craving, desire, appetite

(1) a burning thirst, (2) thirst for authority

He read books to quench his **thirst** for knowledge.

digest

v. to transform food into absorbable substances; break down

synonym: absorb, condense

(1) digest information, (2) help digest food

Most babies can readily digest a wide variety of foods.

backpack

 a bag or pack that is worn on the back, often used for carrying books, equipment, or supplies

synonym: knapsack, rucksack, pack

(1) backpacker's hostel, (2) backpacking trip

I packed my **backpack** with all the necessary camping gear for our trip.

rag

 a piece of cloth, especially an old one, torn or cut into strips and used for cleaning

synonym: cloth, fragment

puddle

 a small pool of water, especially on a flat surface; a small and usually shallow accumulation of any liquid substance

synonym: pool, pond, small lake

emergency

 a sudden unforeseen crisis usually involving danger that requires immediate action

synonym: crisis, trouble, difficulty

diagnose

v. to determine or distinguish the nature of a problem or an illness through a careful analysis

synonym: identify, analyze, interpret

diabetes

- a medical condition in which the body cannot produce enough insulin to control the glucose levels in the blood
- (1) juvenile diabetes, (2) diabetes patient

My father was tested for diabetes.

full-blown

adj. fully developed or manifesting in its complete form, often used to describe a difficult situation or condition

synonym: complete, total, absolute

(1) full-blown crisis, (2) full-blown epidemic

The hurricane hit the coast at **full-blown** force, causing widespread destruction.

ketoacidosis

 a metabolic condition caused by the excess production of ketone bodies, which leads to a build-up of acids in the blood and can cause serious health complications, particularly in individuals with diabetes

synonym: diabetic ketoacidosis, metabolic acidosis, ketoacidotic coma

- (1) **ketoacidosis** treatment, (2) **ketoacidosis** management The nurse monitored the patient's blood glucose levels closely to prevent the onset of **ketoacidosis**.
- v. to return to a former condition, health, mind, or strength synonym: come back, convalesce, heal
- recover a loss, (2) recover approval ratings

- an act or occurrence that is not explicable by natural or scientific laws and is therefore believed to be caused by God

synonym: wonder, marvel, phenomenon

- adj. of or belonging to the present time or recent times synonym: contemporary, stylish, current
- (1) **modern** poetry, (2) pre-**modern** agricultural society Their headquarters are in a **modern** skyscraper.
- adj. of or relating to the treatment or cure of disease synonym: curative, therapeutic, healing
- (1) **medicinal** chemistry, (2) traditional **medicinal**The **medicinal** properties of this herb have been known to help with various ailments.
- a hormone produced in the pancreas that controls the amount of sugar in the blood, or a similar artificial substance used for the treatment of diabetes

disease

exposure

 the state of being in a particular situation or place where there is no protection from or guarantee to something harmful; the disclosure of something secret

pathogen

a bacterium, virus, or other microorganism that causes disease

trigger

someone who helps or supports someone else to do a iob

synonym: acknowledge, identify, admit

apologize

skip

nation

to express regret for committing wrongdoing or causing a problem

synonym: excuse, justify, atone

- to move along lightly and quickly, making a step from one foot to the other with a hop or bounce; to intentionally fail to do something which would normally do

synonym: bounce, spring, neglect

- a large organized community of people living in a n. particular country or region and having a particular culture

synonym: country, state, sovereign entity

academy

a school for special training; a type of official organization that aims to encourage and develop standards in its particular field

synonym: school, institute, college

microscope

 an instrument used to see objects or substances that are too small to be seen with the naked eye

synonym: lens, magnifier, eyepiece

mass

 a large amount of a substance with no definite shape or form; a large number of people or things grouped or crowded together

synonym: abundance, crowd, mob

(1) a mass of molten rock, (2) critical mass

The **mass** of people who do not own property is politically

impotent.

brain

- *n*. the organ inside the head that is responsible for one's movement, thought, memory, and feeling
- synonym: intellect, mind, encephalon
- (1) basic **brain** function, (2) permanent **brain** damageX-rays revealed a small tumor in his **brain**.

teem

- v. to be abuzz; to move in large numbers; to fall heavily synonym: brim, swarm, overflow

ecosystem

- all the plants and living creatures in an area and the way they affect each other and the environment

microorganism

- a very small living thing that may exist in its single-celled form or as a colony of cells and is too small to be seen without a microscope

sufficient

 a series of related events, actions, numbers, etc., which have a particular order

amazing

adj. extremely surprising, especially in a way that you like or admire

synonym: exceptional, extraordinary, wonderful

microbiome

 the community of microorganisms (= living things too small to be seen) that can usually be found living together in any given environment or the human body

synonym: flora

(1) skin **microbiome**, (2) have a diverse **microbiome**The gut **microbiome** is a major producer of serotonin, which is necessary for human mental stability.

diversity

 the quality or fact of many different types of things or people being included in something; a range of different things or people

synonym: variety, multiplicity, variousness

(1) the **diversity** policy of the university, (2) lingual **diversity** He was impressed by the range and **diversity** of the collection.

variation

n. the act or state of changing; a difference or change in the way something is done, made or said

synonym: fluctuation, change, variation

responsible

adj. answerable or accountable for something within one's power, control, or management

synonym: accountable, answerable, liable

service

communicate

 to share or exchange information with others by speaking, writing, moving your body, or using other signals

synonym: convey, share, transmit

communal

adj. belonging to or used by a group rather than individuals; for common use

technique

a particular way or art of doing something that needs skill

synonym: approach, procedure, strategy

dean

n. a person in charge of a college, faculty, or other academic departments, tasked with overseeing its operations, policies, and staff; a senior member of a profession or organization who is highly respected for their knowledge and experience

synonym: head, director, chancellor

(1) dean's list, (2) dean of faculty

The university's **dean** was responsible for overseeing the academic programs and policies.

medical

adj. relating to the treatment of illness or injuries; relating to the practice of medicine

synonym: health, disease, treatment

afterward

adv. after the time mentioned

synonym: later, thereafter, following

transplant

v. to move or transfer something from one place or person to another; to take living tissue or an organ from one person, animal, part of the body, etc. and put it into or onto another

synonym: relocate, emigrate, graft

(1) **transplant** a heart, (2) **transplant** my family to America He tried to **transplant** the seedling into a larger pot.

collaboration

 the act or situation of working together to create or produce something

synonym: affiliation, alliance, coalition

(1) **collaboration** between companies, (2) **collaboration** platform

The partnership program requires a mutual **collaboration** between both agencies.

colon

- n. the punctuation mark (:) used to introduce a list, summary, explanation, etc., or before reporting what someone has said; a significant part of the large intestine, the final section of the digestive system

Consumption of vegetables may aid in the prevention of **colon** cancer.

ileum

 the third and final segment of the small intestine, located between the jejunum and the large intestine, where absorption of nutrients takes place

recipient

n. a person who receives something

synonym: receiver, beneficiary

synonym: sawbones, doctor

 a skilled surgeon that has many years of training and experience.

decide

- v. to make up someone's mind about something; to come to a conclusion or judgment after considering options
 synonym: choose, determine, settle
- (1) **decide** a question, (2) **decide** on a course of action She couldn't **decide** whether to order the pizza or the pasta for dinner.

theoretical

adj. relating to the concepts and principles upon which a particular topic is founded, rather than practice and experience

synonym: conceptual, conjectural, ideal

(1) **theoretical** models, (2) **theoretical** physicist Absolute zero is the lowest **theoretical** temperature.

expansion

n. the process of becoming larger or more extensive, or the result of this process

synonym: growth, enlargement, development

(1) industrial **expansion**, (2) **expansion** project

The company is undergoing an **expansion**, opening new locations in several states.

statistics

- n. the discipline that concerns the collection, organization, analysis, interpretation, and presentation of data
- (1) **statistics** for cancer, (2) official **statistics**The **statistics** demonstrate that poverty and unemployment are genuine problems.

vagina

- n. the passage in the body of a woman or female animal that connects her outer sex organs to her uterussynonym: genitalia, vulva, pudenda
- (1) **vagina** cancer care, (2) infection of the **vagina**The muscle around the **vagina** is elastic enough to allow the passage of a fetus.

delivery

- the act of taking or sending something to a destination;
 the bringing of a baby during childbirth
- synonym: sending, transporting, bringing

associate

- v. to mentally connect someone or something with someone or something else
- synonym: tie in, link, consociate
- (1) **associate** alcohol with gambling, (2) **associate** with people widely

The majority of consumers **associate** this brand with quality.

cesarean

- adj. (also known as "C-section") relating to the delivery of a baby through a surgical incision made in the mother's abdomen and uterus rather than through vaginal birth
- synonym: C-section, surgical birth
- (1) **cesarean** delivery, (2) emergency **cesarean**The **cesarean** recovery period can be longer and more challenging than a vaginal birth recovery.

sect

a group of people who follow a particular religious or philosophical belief system, especially one that is regarded as outside the norm or mainstream

synonym: group, faction, cult

(1) **sect** beliefs, (2) secret **sect**

The minority **sect** believed in a set of unconventional religious practices.

colonize

to establish a colony in or on a specific place; to settle or occupy in large numbers

synonym: settle, occupy, inhabit

(1) colonize planets, (2) colonize for cultivation European powers colonized much of the Americas in the 16th and 17th centuries.

carve

to create something by cutting wood or stone; to turn sharply

synonym: sculpt, engrave, cut

- (1) carve a statue, (2) carve my name on the plate This statue is **carved** from a single tree trunk.
- to grow or expand; to improve or refine through a process of progress and refinement, often to achieve greater sophistication or complexity; to elaborate or add detail to something that is in the process of being

created

synonym: evolve, progress, advance

(1) develop a strategy, (2) develop a skill

We must **develop** a new system to streamline our workflow and increase efficiency.

metabolism

- the set of chemical reactions in cells or organisms that are necessary for life-sustaining
- (1) metabolism enzyme, (2) hemoglobin metabolism Better sleep leads to increased **metabolism**.

develop

determinant

 a factor, circumstance, or condition that contributes to the shaping, influencing, or determining of a particular outcome or result

synonym: cause, factor, element

(1) environmental **determinant**, (2) a **determinant** of crop yields

One **determinant** of success is having a positive attitude and a strong work ethic.

odor

n. a distinctive or unpleasant smell; a scent or aroma that can be sensed through the sense of smell

synonym: smell, aroma, fragrance

(1) odor control, (2) pleasant odor

The **odor** from the trash can was unbearable, so I had to take it out.

function

n. the purpose or use of an object, system, or process; a particular activity or operation that is designed to serve a specific purpose; a mathematical concept that describes a relationship between two sets of values, called the input and output sets; (verb) to operate or work in a specific way, or to perform a particular task or purpose

synonym: purpose, mapping, job

(1) function properly, (2) immune function

The brain is an incredibly complex organ that controls the body's **function**.

phobia

 an extreme or irrational fear of a particular object, person, situation, or activity; a type of anxiety disorder

synonym: fear, dread, terror

(1) **phobia** treatment, (2) social **phobia**

She has a **phobia** of spiders and always avoids them.

cleanliness

 the state of being clean or free from dirt, dust, or foreign substances; the practice of maintaining good hygiene and cleanliness

synonym: neatness, hygiene, sanitation

(1) **cleanliness** standards, (2) **cleanliness** of the kitchen We must prioritize our workplace's **cleanliness** for our employees' safety.

antibiotic

 a substance or drug that kills or slows down the growth of bacteria

synonym: antimicrobial, chemotherapeutic, germicide

(1) antibiotic resistance, (2) antibiotic allergyHe has been prescribed an antibiotic to treat his infection.

pump

v. to cause water, air, gas, etc. to move from one place to another by using mechanical equipment; to get or supply something such as money, information, etc. in significant quantities

synonym: drain, inject, send

(1) **pump** a secret out of success, (2) **pump** blood throughout the body

He was alert and could not **pump** any critical information out of him.

excessive

adj. greater than what seems necessary, normal, or desirable

synonym: unreasonable, exorbitant, inflated

(1) an **excessive** force, (2) take **excessive** care It would be best if you did not demand such an **excessive** charge.

chemical

adj. relating to or connected with chemistry;

synonym: chemic, synthetic

(1) toxic **chemicals**, (2) a **chemical** compound

The firm has grown into a large **chemical** manufacturing.

obesity

 the condition of being significantly overweight, typically defined as having a body mass index (BMI) of 30 or greater.

synonym: overweight, corpulence, fattiness

(1) obesity-related diseases, (2) suffer from obesity

disrupt

v. to prevent or stop something, especially an event, activity, or process, from continuing in the usual way by causing a problem or disturbance

necrosis

n. the death of cells or tissues in a localized area of the body caused by injury, infection, or disease often results in the formation of scar tissue

synonym: decay, sphacelus, mortification

- (1) **necrosis** treatment, (2) **necrosis** of the liver The cancer treatment caused **necrosis** in the surrounding healthy tissues, causing complications.
- inflammation of the colon; a condition that results in diarrhea, abdominal pain, and cramping

coprophagy

the consumption of feces, particularly by animals or insects

synonym: feces eating, dung eating, coprophilia

(1) **coprophagy** behavior, (2) **coprophagy** in animals Some animals, such as rabbits, practice **coprophagy**, which is eating their own feces to obtain nutrients that they may have missed during the initial digestion process.

veterinarian

 n. (formal for a vet) a medical professional who specializes in the care and treatment of animals, especially those that are domesticated or kept as pets

synonym: vet, animal doctor, pet doctor

(1) **veterinarian** clinic, (2) experienced **veterinarian** I took my pet to the **veterinarian** for a routine check-up.

booty

 valuable or stolen goods, especially that taken in war or other conflicts; a person's bottom

synonym: loot, plunder, hip

The pirates buried their treasure on the deserted island, including a large amount of **booty**.

colic
