synonym: insect, bug, flea

dengue

 n. (also "breakbone fever") a viral disease transmitted by mosquitoes, characterized by fever, severe joint and muscle pain, and a rash

synonym: breakbone fever, infectious tropical disease

infect

synonym: pollute, contaminate, affect

(1) **infect** other animal species, (2) **infect** a computer with a virus

phenomenally

adv. extremely or exceptionally, especially in a way that is surprising

synonym: exceptionally, amazingly, remarkably

(1) **phenomenally** quick, (2) **phenomenally** gifted He became **phenomenally** successful in the entertainment industry.

threefold

adj. three times as great or as many

synonym: three, triple, three times

rise nearly threefold, (2) threefold increase
 The price of the item was reduced threefold after the sale.

hemorrhage

- n. profuse bleeding, often caused by a ruptured vessel synonym: heavy bleeding
- (1) **hemorrhage** from a breast, (2) **hemorrhage** control He had a severe brain **hemorrhage** that left him paralyzed.

hitchhike

to obtain a ride in a passing vehicle by signaling to the driver or waving one's thumb; to travel by getting a free ride in someone else's vehicle

synonym: thumb a ride, bum a ride

(1) **hitchhike** a ride, (2) **hitchhike** across the country
She had to **hitchhike** to the nearest gas station when her car broke down.

puddle

 a small pool of water, especially on a flat surface; a small and usually shallow accumulation of any liquid substance

synonym: pool, pond, small lake

(1) puddle of water, (2) step in a puddleThe rain had formed a large puddle on the sidewalk.

infest

v. to swarm or overrun with a large number of something undesirable, such as pests or parasites

synonym: invade, overrun

(1) infest a building, (2) infest a garden

The old storage shed was **infested** with rats and had to be torn down.

larva

n. the immature free-living form of insect or an animal, which at hatching from the egg, is fundamentally unlike its parent and must metamorphose

synonym: caterpillar, grub, maggot

(1) larva of a butterfly, (2) a moth larva

The butterfly emerged from its **larva** stage.

invade

v. to enter aggressively into another's territory by military force for conquest and occupation

synonym: intrude, raid, overrun

(1) invade other tissues, (2) invade his privacy

I have no intention to **invade** your privacy.

sterile

adj. free from living microorganisms, especially bacteria, fungi, and viruses; incapable of reproducing

synonym: clean, germ-free, hygienic

(1) **sterile** environment, (2) a **sterile** man

Surgeons must use **sterile** instruments to prevent infection during an operation.

fertile

adj. capable of producing abundant vegetation or crops; intellectually productive

synonym: fruitful, productive, rich

(1) **fertile** ground, (2) **fertile** market

Herbs require fertile soil in a sunny, sheltered location.

caiman

 a type of predatory reptile that belongs to the crocodilian family which resembles alligators and crocodiles but are smaller in size, typically found in Central and South America

synonym: alligator, crocodile, reptile

(1) **caiman** conservation, (2) **caiman** population

The **caiman's** diet mainly consists of fish and small mammals.

societal
