- (1) **bury** in the earth, (2) **bury** emotion There is plenty of space to **bury** everyone.

patriotism

- n. love and loyalty to one's countrysynonym: nationalism, loyalty, devotion
- the spirit of patriotism, (2) fanatic patriotism
 actions were a testament to his deep love and patriotism for his country.

weep

- v. to cry tears because of sadness, rage, or pain synonym: cry, sob, mourn
- weep bitter tears, (2) weep for joy
 I'm easily moved to tears, so I would weep in sympathy if I saw that movie.

 a humorous play on words or use of words that sound similar but have different meanings, often for a comedic effect; a form of wordplay

synonym: joke, quip, wordplay
