ontology

 a branch of metaphysics concerned with the nature of being and the existence

synonym: metaphysics, philosophy of being, study of existence

promiscuous

 adj. having casual sexual relations frequently with different partners; indiscriminate in the choice of sexual partners; not selective of a single class or person

synonym: indiscriminate, loose, promiscuous
