synonym: workforce, staff, labor force

counseling

n. the process of providing guidance and support to someone, often in a therapeutic or professional context, to help them overcome personal or emotional difficulties and improve their mental health and well-being

synonym: therapy, guidance, advice

(1) **counseling** about risk management, (2) career **counseling**

I am going to **counseling** to work through my anxiety and depression.

release

v. to set free or allow to escape from confinement synonym: free, let go, discharge

deport

- v. to force someone to leave a country, typically on the grounds of illegal status or for having committed a crime

merit

 the quality of being particularly good or worthy, especially to deserve praise or reward

infect

v. to affect a person, an animal, or a plant with a disease-causing organism

disclose

individual

communal

transmission

practical

disease

 a disorder or illness that affects the body or mind, often characterized by specific symptoms or abnormal functioning of organs or systems

banish

v. to expel or send away from a place or situation, especially permanently

leprosy

 a chronic infectious disease that affects the skin, nerves, and mucous membranes and is caused by the

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bacterium Mycobacterium leprae, characterized by disfiguring skin lesions, nerve damage, and the loss of sensation in affected areas

synonym: Hansen's disease

policy

a set of rules, guidelines, principles, or procedures that govern decision-making or action, often used in the context of business or government; a course of action or plan of action adopted or followed by an organization or individual to achieve a goal or objective

synonym: strategy, plan, guideline

The company's new **policy** on remote work has made it a more inclusive workplace.

superstition

- a belief or practice that is not based on science or reason and that is often connected with a religion

virus

 a tiny infectious organic material that causes disease in people, animals, and plants

colleague

 one of a group of a coworker, especially in a profession or a business

synonym: coworker, associate, fellow

decide

- to make up someone's mind about something; to come to a conclusion or judgment after considering options synonym: choose, determine, settle
- (1) **decide** a question, (2) **decide** on a course of action She couldn't **decide** whether to order the pizza or the pasta for dinner.

relate

to establish a connection or association between two or more things; to narrate or tell about an event, experience, or relationship; to empathize or feel sympathy with someone or something

synonym: connect, link, associate

a condition in which pathogenic microorganisms or viruses have entered the body

synonym: contagion, disease, transmission

inject

synonym: aggressive, intense, turbulent

discriminate

v. to treat a person or particular group of people worse or better than another, especially in an unfair way; to recognize or perceive the difference between people or things

synonym: show prejudice, segregate, differentiate

You should not **discriminate** against minorities.

unfortunately

adv. by bad luck; unluckily

synonym: regrettably, unluckily, alas

counterbalance

mass

judgment

 the ability to form valuable opinions and make reasonable decisions

synonym: conclusion, decision, determination

misinformation

 information that is false or inaccurate, or the act of giving wrong information, especially deliberately

synonym: falsity, misreport, misstatement

specifically

adv. only associated with or meant for one thing

pun

 a humorous play on words or use of words that sound similar but have different meanings, often for a comedic effect; a form of wordplay

synonym: joke, quip, wordplay

prejudice

 a thought or feeling that is unfair and makes no sense, mainly when it is formed without enough thought or knowledge

synonym: bias, preconception, predisposition

ignorance

 n. lack of knowledge or information about a particular subject or fact

synonym: unintelligence, inexperience, unawareness

rewrite

 to write something such as a book or speech again in a different way, usually to improve it or add new information

synonym: revise, edit, rework

tradition

 a belief, custom, or way of doing something that has been passed down from generation to generation within a group or society

synonym: custom, practice, ritual

a tradition of a culture, (2) against tradition
 a tradition in many families to have a big Thanksgiving dinner with all their relatives.

religion

 a deep conviction in a supernatural power that controls human destiny

synonym: faith, creed, belief

(1) **religion** sociology, (2) freedom of **religion**Their **religion** strictly prohibits them from drinking or gambling.

nick

- n. a small cut, notch, or indentation in a surface or an edge synonym: incision, dent, indentation
- (1) a **nick** on the fender of a car, (2) **nick** on my hand. The interviewer arrived in a **nick** of time.

convict

to prove or declare someone to be guilty of a crime;
 (noun) a person serving a sentence in a jail or prison

synonym: condemn, sentence, judge

(1) **convict** him of manslaughter, (2) **convict** in a jail He was **convicted** on fraud charges and sentenced to five years in prison.

exposure

 the state of being in a particular situation or place where there is no protection from or guarantee to something harmful; the disclosure of something secret

synonym: vulnerability, disclosure, uncovering

(1) a southern **exposure**, (2) the **exposure** of a fraud The long **exposure** to the air tarnished the antique tableware.

offense

 an illegal act; a feeling of anger caused by a perceived insult to or disregard for oneself; the action of attacking an enemy

synonym: crime, violation, insult

(1) minor traffic **offenses**, (2) a first **offense**Parental indifference to their children leads to juvenile **offenses**.

committed

adj. willing to put in a lot of effort, time, and energy into something; firmly believing in somethingsynonym: devoted, faithful, attached

(1) in a **committed** relationship, (2) strong and **committed** sales staff

Our company is strongly **committed** to meeting customers' needs.

unacceptably

adv. in a way that is not acceptable or satisfactory *synonym*: improperly, unsatisfactorily, inadequately

severity

- n. the quality or condition of being severe, strict, or harsh synonym: harshness, rigidity, austerity

punishment

a penalty or consequence inflicted for wrongdoing or offense; a means of enforcing discipline or preventing further wrongdoing

synonym: penalty, discipline, retribution

- a person convicted of a serious crime; an offender of the most serious kind

lifetime

stem

n. the central part of something from which other parts can develop or grow; the part of a word common to all its inflected variants; (verb) to grow out of, have roots in, or originate in

synonym: branch, limb, (verb) come from

- (1) **stem** from a belief, (2) the **stem** of a matchstick A rose has thorns on its **stem**.
- the cyclical rise and fall of sea level caused by the moon's gravitational pull

synonym: ripple, surge, swell

(1) **tide** cycle, (2) ride the **tide** of change Red **tide** is often harmful to the local ecosystem.

flout

tide

- to openly disregard or disobey a rule, law, convention, or authority; to mock or ridicule something or someone
 synonym: defy, disobey, disregard

stigma

 a mark of shame or disgrace associated with a particular circumstance, quality, or person

unofficial

 adj. not authorized or recognized by an authority or organization; informal; not having an official status or position

license

an official permission or authorization to do, use, or own something; a legal document that grants the holder the right to perform certain activities, such as driving a car, practicing a profession, or using a particular product or service

pregnant

adj. having a baby or young animal developing in the uterussynonym: expectant

checkup

 an examination of a person's health by a medical professional, typically including a physical examination, laboratory tests, and diagnostic imaging

announce

labor

n. productive work, especially physical work done for wages; the people who do manual or physical work in a country or company for wage; (verb) to work hard or to strive and make an effort to reach a goal

synonym: toil, moil, donkeywork

In several countries, child **labor** is a serious social problem.

strength

 the quality or state of being physically, or sometimes mentally, strong

synonym: resilience, power, muscles

tragic
