airborne

adj. moved or conveyed by or through the air; in the air synonym: flying, aerial, floating

The amount of **airborne** pollen this year is higher than usual.

ventilate

to supply fresh air to a room, building, etc.; to remove stale air from it

synonym: air out, circulate, freshen

It's important to **ventilate** the room to avoid the buildup of harmful gases.

pry

to force open or to try to get information from someone by asking too many questions

synonym: probe, investigate, inquire

outdo

- to do better than someone; to surpass *synonym*: excel, surpass, outshine
- (1) **outdo** him in trickery, (2) **outdo** the competition He tried to **outdo** his rival by breaking the world record.

probabilistic

adj. characterized by the influence of chance or probability; involving the use of statistical models or methods to estimate likelihoods or risks

synonym: probable, statistical, likely

(1) probabilistic model, (2) probabilistic approach In a **probabilistic** system, the outcome is uncertain and can

vary based on chance.

pathogen

a bacterium, virus, or other microorganism that causes disease

synonym: germ, microbe, bacterium

spit

germ
