Your **conversation** reflects your thoughts.

suddenly

adv. quickly and unexpectedly

synonym: abruptly, unexpectedly, unawares

(1) **suddenly** attacked by an enemy, (2) die **suddenly**

Who answers suddenly knows little.

thunder

- n. the loud, deep sound made by air expanding along the path of a bolt of lightning; a deep, prolonged loud noisesynonym: detonation, rumble, roar
- (1) **thunder** cloud, (2) deafening **thunder** of applause The roaring **thunder** was so loud that it woke me from sleep.

recollection

the act of remembering or the state of being remembered

synonym: memory, reminiscence, remembrance

(1) a vague **recollection**, (2) **recollection** of a traumatic event

The older man's **recollections** of his youth were filled with stories of adventure and romance.

pregnant

- adj. having a baby or young animal developing in the uterussynonym: expectant
- (1) needs of **pregnant** women, (2) a silence **pregnant** with suspense

She vacated the position when she got pregnant.

destine

v. to determine or set the course of something in advance, often in a way that seems predetermined or inevitable; to specify or choose someone or something for a particular fate or outcome

synonym: ordain, doom, predestine

(1) **destine** us to meet again, (2) be **destined** to become a great artist

Some people believe that we are all **destined** for greatness.

paranoid

- adj. unreasonably or obsessively believing that other people do not like you or want to harm you
- (1) **paranoid** about issues, (2) **paranoid** disorder A **paranoid** person may have delusions that people want to harm.

schizophrenia

 a severe mental disorder in which a person has a distorted view of reality and may experience hallucinations, delusions, and disordered thinking and behavior

synonym: psychosis, disorder, mental illness

(1) **schizophrenia** spectrum disorder, (2) **schizophrenia** treatment

The **schizophrenia** patient was experiencing severe auditory hallucinations.

butcher

 a person who prepares and sells meat, especially at a retail shop; a person who kills or slaughters animals, especially for food; a person who engages in the relentless or brutal treatment of others

synonym: butcherer, meat cutter, slaughterer

(1) **butcher** knife, (2) local **butcher**

He's a vegetarian and was shocked to see so much meat in the **butcher** shop.

psychiatric

adj. of or relating to the treatment or study of mental illness or disorders

synonym: mental, psychological, psychotherapeutic

(1) people with **psychiatric** disorders, (2) **psychiatric** hospital

The **psychiatric** evaluation revealed that the patient had been suffering from anxiety.

committed

adj. willing to put in a lot of effort, time, and energy into something; firmly believing in something

synonym: devoted, faithful, attached

(1) in a **committed** relationship, (2) strong and **committed** sales staff

Our company is strongly **committed** to meeting customers' needs.

suicide

n. the act of killing yourself intentionally

synonym: self-destruction, self-annihilation, felo-de-se

(1) commit **suicide**, (2) **suicide** attack

In an economically prosperous country, most male **suicide** is due to child support problems.

bounce

v. to cause to move up or away after hitting a surface; to spring back

synonym: bound, leap, spring

(1) **bounce** across the floor, (2) **bounce** back from failure They will **bounce** between various emotional states.

essentially

adv. relating to the essential features or concepts of anything synonym: fundamentally, basically, virtually

(1) **essentially** correct, (2) become **essentially** same **Essentially**, a society is an organism.

eventually

adv. finally, particularly after a long time or a lot of struggle, complications, and so on

synonym: finally, someday, ultimately

(1) **eventually** become obsolete, (2) **eventually** succeed The corporation **eventually** dominated the entire tobacco business.

gang

a group of people who organize and engage in criminal activity

synonym: crew, posse, group

(1) a motorcycle gang,(2) gang memberThe street gang was known for its violent behavior.

horrible

adj. extremely unpleasant or bad; causing fear or disgust synonym: dreadful, terrible, awful

horrible accident, (2) horrible smell
 The experience was horrible and left a lasting impression.

tragic

adj. causing great sadness or suffering; very unfortunatesynonym: calamitous, disastrous, catastrophic

(1) tragic love stories, (2) tragic death

The **tragic** events of the war left many families torn apart.

murder

- n. the crime of killing somebody intentionallysynonym: slaying, killing
- (1) **murder** in the second degree, (2) attempted **murder** This intriguing **murder** mystery remains unsolved.

ultimate

- adj. furthest or highest in degree or ordersynonym: highest, maximum, foremost
- (1) the **ultimate** goal in life, (2) the **ultimate** luxury Management must take **ultimate** responsibility for the accident.

execute

- v. to kill someone, especially as a legal punishment; to carry out or perform an action, duty, etc.
- *synonym*: direct, conduct, enforce

punishment

- a penalty or consequence inflicted for wrongdoing or offense; a means of enforcing discipline or preventing further wrongdoing
- synonym: penalty, discipline, retribution
- (1) **punishment** for a crime, (2) humiliating **punishment** The judge gave severe **punishment** to the criminal who committed the heinous crime.

morality

- n. principles of right and evil or good and bad behaviorsynonym: decency, rectitude, righteousness

penalty

- n. a punishment for violating a law, rule, or contractsynonym: punishment, sentence, fine

entirely

adv. completely

controversial

adj. causing a lot of hot public discussion and dispute synonym: contentious, disputed, questionable

debate

n. a formal discussion or argument of opposing viewpoints, often to persuade others to adopt a specific position; a public discussion, often on an issue of current interest, in which participants offer opinions and differing perspectives

ardent

adj. having or showing a strong enthusiasm or devotion; passionate

synonym: passionate, fervent, eager

vociferous

adj. characterized by loud, insistent, or attention-grabbing verbal expression

synonym: loud, noisy, clamorous

(1) vociferous protest, (2) vociferous criticism

The **vociferous** fans cheered loudly for their team during the game.

abolitionist

 a person who advocates for the abolition (the act of doing away with something) of slavery or some other practice considered unjust synonym: antislavery activist, emancipator, liberator

(1) slavery **abolitionist**, (2) women's rights **abolitionist**Harriet Tubman was a well-known **abolitionist** who fought for the freedom of enslaved people.

unfold

 to open up or spread out something that is folded or rolled up; to reveal or disclose something that was previously hidden or unknown

synonym: open, spread out, expose

(1) **unfold** the story, (2) **unfold** the stroller

The mystery **unfolded** as the detectives gathered more clues.

chapter

 a separate section of a written work usually numbered and titled

synonym: section, phase, episode

(1) an introductory **chapter**, (2) **chapter** of a political party. The final **chapter** provides a summary of the discussion.

innocent

adj. not guilty of a crime, offense, etc.; not having an evil mind or knowledge

synonym: blameless, honest, harmless

(1) an **innocent** child, (2) thousands of **innocent** people My husband was found **innocent** of any crime.

convict

- v. to prove or declare someone to be guilty of a crime; (noun) a person serving a sentence in a jail or prison synonym: condemn, sentence, judge
- (1) **convict** him of manslaughter, (2) **convict** in a jail He was **convicted** on fraud charges and sentenced to five years in prison.

row

- n. an arrangement of objects or people side by side in a line; (verb) to propel a boat through the water using oarssynonym: line, sequence, layer
- (1) criminal on death **row**, (2) a **row** of cherry trees

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He was the leader of the demonstrators and spoke out against the war in the front **row**.

uphold

v. to support or defend something, such as a law, idea, decision, etc.

synonym: defend, maintain, sustain

(1) **uphold** the law, (2) **uphold** tradition

The judge may **uphold** the decision of the lower court.

appellate

- adj. relating to or having the power to hear appeals from lower courts or tribunals; referring to a court that primarily hears appeals

consist

- v. to be composed or made up of
- synonym: lie in, comprise, exist

complicated

- adj. involving a lot of different things or parts in a way that is difficult to understand or analyze
- synonym: complex, convoluted, intricate
- (1) a **complicated** process, (2) become increasingly **complicated**

He did complicated pen-and-ink drawings in just a few days.

proceeding

 an event or series of events that happen as part of a larger process or action; an official record of legal or administrative action or meeting

synonym: procedure, steps, action

(1) **proceeding** in bankruptcy, (2) **proceeding** in bankruptcy

The legal **proceeding** took several months to conclude.

habeas-corpus

n. (a legal term originating from Latin, meaning "you shall have the body") a writ or legal action that ensures a person's right to challenge the lawfulness of their detention or imprisonment, typically used as a protection against arbitrary or unlawful imprisonment

synonym: legal protection

(1) **habeas-corpus** violation, (2) **habeas-corpus** hearing The lawyer filed a **habeas-corpus** petition to challenge the legality of his client's detention.

corpus

 a collection of texts or documents, usually used in research or analysis

synonym: collection, body, compilation

(1) corpus callous, (2) written corpus

The **corpus** of ancient Greek literature includes many famous works.

appeal

 a serious, earnest, or urgent request for money, information, or help; a quality that makes somebody or something attractive or interest

synonym: request, charm, attraction

(1) draw out your **appeal**, (2) an **appeal** for help He needed to resolve the problem as soon as possible, so he made an **appeal** directly.

clemency

 mercy or leniency shown to someone who has committed a crime or is being punished; forgiveness or pardoning of an offense or wrongdoing

synonym: leniency, mercy, compassion

(1) clemency plea, (2) clemency decision

The judge showed **clemency** towards the defendant and gave a more lenient sentence than expected.

complexity

 the state or quality of being complicated or intricate and difficult to understand

The project's **complexity** made it difficult for the team to complete it on time.

litigation

 the process of resolving legal disputes through the court system

synonym: lawsuit, legal action, court case

execution

 the act or process of carrying out a plan, order, or course of action; the act or process of carrying out the death penalty

synonym: carrying out, implementation, completion

(1) compulsory **execution**, (2) **execution** by injection The **execution** of the plan was flawless, resulting in a record-breaking profit for the company.

represent

v. to speak, act, or be present on behalf of another person or group; to form or constitute

synonym: depict, express, describe

inmate

a person who is confined to an institution such as a prison, hospital, or mental health facility

synonym: prisoner, convict, detainee

(1) inmate population, (2) inmate rights

The prison implemented a new educational program for **inmates** to learn skills and prepare for life after release.

acquire

v. to buy or obtain something such as an asset, object, knowledge, etc., for oneself

synonym: attain, earn, catch

(1) acquire knowledge,	(2) acquire a new company
Children acquire langua	ge at a fantastic rate.

rely

v. to require a specific thing or the assistance and support of someone or something to continue, run properly, or succeed.

synonym: depend, count, lean

(1) **rely** on convenience stores, (2) **rely** entirely on him Babies heavily **rely** on others for food.

volunteer

- a person who performs or offers to perform a job or service without being paid for or forced to do
- synonym: unpaid worker, draftee, enlistee
- (1) seek **volunteers**, (2) my **volunteer** work

 The teachers make full use of **volunteer** assistance.

handle

- v. to deal with a situation, problem, or strong emotion synonym: control, manage, deal with
- (1) **handle** a precious object, (2) **handled** the incident We all should learn how to **handle** stress.

proceed

ν. to move forward or to continue with a process or action; to advance or progress

synonym: advance, progress, move ahead

(1) **proceed** with caution, (2) **proceed** to the next step We can now **proceed** with the next item on our agenda.

inevitably

adv. in a manner that cannot be avoided or prevented synonym: unavoidably, necessarily, surely

(1) **inevitably** decline with age, (2) **inevitably** reach the consumer

Because of his excellent performance, he will **inevitably** be promoted.

drift

v. to move smoothly and slowly in water or air, especially as a result of outside forces, with no control over the direction

synonym: float, wander, freewheel

(1) **drift** down the stream, (2) **drift** away on a raft I **drifted** around for years in Europe before going to university.

urgent

adj. requiring immediate attention or action; pressing synonym: pressing, critical, immediate

(1) an **urgent** telegram, (2) **urgent** situation It is **urgent** that we leave for the airport now to catch our flight.

extend

- v. to broaden in scope, range, or area synonym: prolong, lengthen, advance
- (1) **extend** the warranty, (2) **extend** a line Her visit will **extend** from Monday to Friday.

sustained

- adj. lasting for a long time or continuing for a long time without becoming weaker or less intensesynonym: prolonged, extended, continual
- (1) **sustained** economic growth, (2) **sustained** release medication

The company experienced **sustained** growth over the past decade.

decline

v. to become gradually smaller, fewer, worse, etc.; to refuse to accept

synonym: descend, drop, deny

(1) **decline** a job offer, (2) **decline** in quality
As people age, their digestive capacity also gradually **declines**.

graph

 a picture consisting of a line, lines, points, etc., that shows how two or more sets of certain quantities are related to each other

synonym: chart, diagram, figure

(1) graph theory, (2) a graph sample

This bar **graph** shows sales over the past five years.

apparatus

the equipment, materials, or tools that are used to perform a specific task, often in a scientific, technical, or industrial setting

synonym: equipment, device, gear

(1) apparatus malfunction, (2) respiratory apparatus The laboratory **apparatus** made it possible for the scientist to experiment.

efficient

adj. performing at the highest level of productivity with the least wasted effort or resources; capable of achieving maximum output with minimum wasted effort, time, or materials

synonym: productive, effective, competent

- (1) **efficient** operation, (2) energy- **efficient** appliances The new washing machine is much more **efficient** than the old one.
- to put something into a liquid for a short time and take it out again

synonym: dunk, dive, plunge

(1) **dip** a pen in ink, (2) **dip** a chip in the sauce Please **dip** up a bucketful of water from the well.

adj. having the usual characteristics or traits of a specific group of things

synonym: characteristic, usual, distinctive

(1) **typical** leader, (2) fairly **typical** symptoms This artwork is **typical** of her work.

basis

the most important facts, ideas, or events from which n. something is developed; the way how things are organized or arranged

synonym: foundation, base, ground

(1) on an equal **basis**, (2) **basis** for calculation This evidence will form the **basis** for our discussion.

dip

typical

steep

adj. having a sharp inclination or slope synonym: sheer, precipitous, abrupt

(1) a **steep** staircase, (2) **steep** discount

The **steep** cliff made it difficult to climb.

paradox

 a statement, situation, or person that has two opposite facts or features and therefore seems impossible, is difficult to understand, or is strange;

synonym: incongruity, dichotomy, contradiction

(1) French **paradox**, (2) the **paradox** of the heap There are many theories to explain this **paradox**.

attribute

v. to say or regard that something is the result of a particular thing; (noun) a quality or feature that someone or something possesses;

synonym: ascribe, blame, (noun) feature

(1) **attribute** the change to their marriage, (2) **attribute** directly to sales

He **attributes** the disappointing results to the economic downturn.

jury

 a group of people called upon to render a verdict or judgment in a legal trial; a group of people chosen for a special purpose or task

synonym: panel, tribunal, adjudicators

(1) jury verdict, (2) jury duty

The judge instructed the **jury** on the law and the evidence presented in the trial.

possibility

- n. a chance that something may happen or be truesynonym: chance, prospect, likelihood
- (1) **possibility** for growth, (2) **possibility** of a major earthquake

The **possibility** of getting the disease will drastically increase.

parole

 the conditional release of a prisoner before the completion of a sentence on the promise of good behavior

synonym: probation, conditional release, supervised release

(1) parole board, (2) medical parole

The prisoner was granted **parole** after serving 20 years of his life sentence.

chamber

 a large room used for a formal, public, or particular purpose; one of the parts of a parliament

synonym: association, cabin, legislature

(1) a gas **chamber**, (2) the lower **chamber**The surgeon made an incision in the **chambers** of the patient's heart.

dissolution

n. the act of breaking up or dissolving something, often referring to a contract, a relationship, or a substance; the process of disintegrating or decomposing over time; the ending or termination of a group or organization

synonym: disintegration, decay, breakup

(1) **dissolution** of a company, (2) **dissolution** of the sugar The **dissolution** of the partnership was a difficult and emotional process.

opponent

 a person against whom you are playing or fighting in a game, competition, debate, etc.

synonym: adversary, competitor, enemy

(1) computer **opponent**, (2) death-penalty **opponent** He was attempting to confuse his **opponent**.

solace

 n. comfort or consolation in a time of distress, sadness, or disappointment; (verb) to comfort or console someone in a time of distress, loss, or suffering

synonym: comfort, condolence, peace

(1) solace in music, (2) offer solace

The grieving widow found **solace** in reading her late husband's letters.

excess

 an amount or quantity beyond what is acceptable, expected, or reasonable

synonym: exuberance, glut, surplus

(1) lose **excess** weight, (2) an **excess** of exports

The road of **excess** leads to the palace of wisdom.

affinity

 a natural liking or attraction to something; kinship by marriage or adoption

synonym: liking, attraction, fondness

(1) affinity group, (2) have a high affinity

He has a strong **affinity** for music and plays multiple instruments.

erosion

the wearing away of rock, soil, or land by natural processes such as wind or water

synonym: corrosion, weathering, decay

(1) **erosion** control, (2) wind **erosion**

The **erosion** of the coastline has accelerated due to rising sea levels.

phenomenon

 something that exists and can be perceptible, especially one that is not fully understood

synonym: marvel, wonder, splendor

(1) natural **phenomenon**, (2) historical **phenomenon** A rainbow is a natural **phenomenon**.

shift

n. a slight transition in position, direction, or trend

synonym: transition, change, modification

(1) Doppler shift, (2) major paradigm shift

Could you help me **shift** some furniture?

intervene

ν. to intentionally get involved in a situation to improve it or prevent it from getting worse

synonym: interfere, mediate, intercede

(1) **intervene** in a dispute, (2) **intervene** between quarreling parties

Following international law, our country does not **intervene** in the internal affairs of our neighbors.

likelihood

 the probability or chance that something will happen or be the case

synonym: probability, chance, possibility

(1) **likelihood** of the success, (2) improve the **likelihood** of a cure

The **likelihood** of the project being completed on time is uncertain.

biography

- n. the story of a person's life written by someone elsesynonym: bio, memoir, life history
- (1) **biography** of an actor, (2) medical **biography** This is a well-recorded **biography**.

accurate

adj. correct and exact in all details

synonym: exact, precise, proper

(1) provide **accurate** information, (2) **accurate** measurements

The official transcript contains accurate academic records.

dysfunction

 a problem or fault in a system, organism, or part of the body or machine

synonym: malfunction, disorder, disfunction

(1) dysfunction of kidneys, (2) brain dysfunction
The dysfunction in the relationship was causing problems for both partners.

exposure

 the state of being in a particular situation or place where there is no protection from or guarantee to something harmful; the disclosure of something secret

synonym: vulnerability, disclosure, uncovering

(1) a southern **exposure**, (2) the **exposure** of a fraud The long **exposure** to the air tarnished the antique tableware.

juvenile

adj. relating to or characteristic of youth or young people; immature

synonym: youthful, boyish, childlike

(1) exhibit juvenile behavior, (2) juvenile justice

The detective suspected that the vandalism was the work of **juvenile** delinquents.

cusp

 a pointed end, especially the pointed end of a crescent moon or the part of a curve that is most curved

(1) cusp of change, (2) a single cusp

The project was on the **cusp** of success and needed a little more funding.

disagree

v. to have or express a different opinion, idea, etc.

synonym: discord, oppose, dissent

synonym: point, apex, tip

(1) **disagree** about a particular issue, (2) **disagree** with a plan

I disagree for reasons already stated above.

gnarl

a rough knotted swelling on a tree, knot in wood; a contorted or twisted shape or feature

synonym: knot, twist, bump

(1) gnarl bark, (2) gnarl-edged branch

The **gnarl** of the tree trunk provided a natural seat for the weary traveler.

slice

 a flat, often thin, piece of bread, meat, cheese, etc., that has been cut from a larger piece; a wound made by cutting

synonym: piece, portion, slit

(1) a **slice** of the company's revenue, (2) **slice** a tomato thin The children complained because one **slice** of cake was slightly larger than the other.

physics

n. the science of matter and energy and their interactions

(1) nuclear physics, (2) laws of physicsHe studied the physics of radiation.

policy

n. a set of rules, guidelines, principles, or procedures that govern decision-making or action, often used in the context of business or government; a course of action or plan of action adopted or followed by an organization or individual to achieve a goal or objective

synonym: strategy, plan, guideline

(1) health **policy**, (2) foreign **policy**

The company's new **policy** on remote work has made it a more inclusive workplace.

nudge

v. to push someone or something gently, especially with your elbow, to attract the person's attention; (noun) a small push or prod to encourage a desired action or behavior

synonym: bump, elbow, (noun) prod

- (1) **nudge** price levels up, (2) give a person a **nudge** The teacher **nudged** the student to get his attention and asked him a question.
- a large tube-shaped object that moves very first by a stream of gases let out behind it, used for space travel or as a weapon

synonym: projectile, missile

- (1) **rocket** attack against the enemy, (2) **rocket** fuel The **rocket** launch platform is visible from this hill.
- v. to push or drive forcibly; to impose or insert; (noun) the force used in pushing

synonym: push, shove, prod

intervention

 the action or process of being done to improve or help a circumstance, often they have not been asked to do so

synonym

rocket

thrust

: interference, intercession, treatment

(1) **intervention** by foreign powers, (2) surgical **intervention**

This **intervention** does not require the patient's consent.

consequence

n. the outcome of a particular action or event, especially relative to an individual

synonym: result, impact, outcome

(1) unintended **consequences**, (2) the **consequence** of an argument

These economic activities had disastrous environmental **consequences**.

strategy

 a detailed plan of action designed to achieve a long-term or overall goal.

synonym: approach, procedure, scenario

(1) military **strategy**, (2) develop a **strategy**

Our plan includes a comprehensive marketing **strategy**.

embrace

v. to accept something willingly and enthusiastically; (noun) the act of clasping another person in the arms as in greeting or affection

synonym: grasp, hold tightly, accept

(1) **embrace** an opportunity, (2) a warm **embrace**The woods **embrace** the house.

mention

- v. to speak or write about something or someone briefly synonym: reference, allude, cite
- (1) **mention** name, (2) **mention** in a report I **mentioned** to him that I had seen his sister at the grocery store earlier that day.

reform

 the act of improving or correcting something that is wrong or bad; a change made to correct a flaw or problem

synonym: change, modify, improve

(1) economic **reform**, (2) **reform** movement The government is proposing a **reform** to the healthcare system to make it more accessible and affordable for all citizens.

topic

- n. a subject that is being discussed or written aboutsynonym: subject, theme, issue
- (1) a serious **topic**, (2) the **topic** of the book

 The **topic** of the discussion was the current state of the economy.

judge

 a person who makes decisions in a court of law; (verb) to determine the result of or form a critical opinion of something

synonym: arbiter, justice, (verb) deduce

(1) judge a competition, (2) an associate judgeThe strict judge ruled in favor of the plaintiff in the case.

accomplish

- v. to finish or achieve something successfully synonym: achieve, complete, execute
