#### nation

 a large organized community of people living in a particular country or region and having a particular culture

synonym: country, state, sovereign entity

(1) nation-state, (2) a seafaring nation

The **nation** of Japan is known for its unique culture and advanced technology.

### sacrifice

n. the act of killing an animal or person or surrendering a possession as an offering to a deity; (verb) to give up something important or valuable to help another person or get or do something that seems more important

synonym: forfeit, immolation, gift

(1) small **sacrifice** for a great cause, (2) **sacrifice** anything to get ahead

You cannot accomplish great things without a **sacrifice** of your time or money.

### befriend

- v. to become a friend of someone, especially when in need synonym: support, advise, patronize
- (1) **befriend** a young boy, (2) **befriend** other members I'm willing to **befriend** the weak and the poor.

### pride

 a feeling of deep pleasure or satisfaction derived from one's achievements

synonym: vanity, conceit, egotism

pride of a company, (2) hide his pride
 She took great pride in her work, always striving for

perfection.

bet

v. to risk money on the result of an event or a competition, such as a race or game, to get more money; to have faith or confidence in something

synonym: stake, wager, gamble

(1) **bet** on a race, (2) **bet** my future

### immersion

 the act of putting someone or something into a liquid completely; the state of being completely involved in a subject or activity

synonym: submergence, involvement, engagement

(1) baptism by **immersion**, (2) **immersion** in acid I felt like I was in a different world because of the **immersion** experience of virtual reality.

### untouched

adj. not touched or disturbed by anyone or anything; not having been altered, changed, or affected in any way

synonym: untarnished, pristine, intact

(1) **untouched** wilderness, (2) **untouched** landscape The abandoned house was **untouched** for years, with vines growing all over it.

### daring

adj. brave and taking risks

synonym: audacious, bold, venturesome

(1) daring escape, (2) make a daring face

Her choices become increasingly **daring** and creative.

# privilege

 a special right or advantage that only one person or group of people has, usually because they are rich and powerful in a society synonym: benefit, authorization, advantage

(1) a breach of **privilege**, (2) **privilege** of membership In the Middle Ages, the right to hunt in the wild was the **privilege** of royalty and nobility.

# extraordinary

adj. exceptional, unexpected, very unusual; surpassing the ordinary or usual

synonym: exceptional, noteworthy, astonishing

(1) **extraordinary** ability, (2) **extraordinary** weather He narrated the **extraordinary** story of his adventure.

### fellow

adj. someone who has the same job or interests as you, or is in the same class, profession, or situation as you

synonym: buddy, mate, affiliate

(1) junior **fellow**, (2) nice **fellow** 

He is the kind of **fellow** who only works for his success.

### foundation

n. the lowest load-bearing part of a building, typically below ground level; a fundamental basis or principle upon which something is built or established; an organization that provides funding or support for charitable or educational purposes

synonym: base, support, groundwork

(1) foundation course, (2) weak foundation

The **foundation** of the building was cracked and needed to be repaired.

#### tribe

 a social group made up of members who live together, sharing the same language, culture, religion, etc., especially those who do not live in towns or cities

synonym: family, clan, kinsfolk

(1) aboriginal tribe, (2) mountain tribe

The **tribe** had distinctly defined gender roles.

#### native

adj. connecting with or describing someone's birth country or place of birth, or someone born in a specific country or place synonym: endemic, domestic, aboriginal

The vegetation here is almost wholly **native**.

### decision

 the act or process of making up someone's mind about something; a choice or judgment reached after considering options

synonym: choice, determination, judgment

(1) **decision** authority, (2) a selfish **decision**She was struggling to make a **decision** between two job offers.

### visualize

v. to form a mental image or concept of something; to make something visible

synonym: imagine, picture, envision

(1) **visualize** data, (2) **visualize** flying through space She tried to **visualize** the layout of the new house in her mind.

steward

n. a person responsible for the management and care of another's property or for the supervision of the domestic staff of a large household or organization; a person in charge of arranging for the supply of food to a college, club, etc.

synonym: caretaker, manager, custodian

The **steward** on the flight was very helpful in assisting passengers with their needs.

planet

 any of the nine large celestial bodies that circle in the solar system; any celestial body that revolves around a star

*synonym*: earth, world, globe

### tragic

adj. causing great sadness or suffering; very unfortunate synonym: calamitous, disastrous, catastrophic

(1) tragic love stories, (2) tragic death

The **tragic** events of the war left many families torn apart.

# preserve

v. to keep or maintain a particular quality, feature, etc., especially to prevent it from decaying, being damaged, or being destroyed

synonym: conserve, care for, maintain

(1) **preserve** my strength, (2) **preserve** a country's heritage They worked hard to **preserve** the nature of their native lands.

# colleague

 one of a group of a coworker, especially in a profession or a business

synonym: coworker, associate, fellow

collaborate with colleagues,
 former colleague
 decided to seek counseling on the advice of my colleague.

abduct

- v. to take someone away illegally to an undisclosed location by force, usually to extract a ransomsynonym: kidnap, seize, snatch
- (1) abduct a girl, (2) abduct at gunpoint

The passerby witnessed the moment the boy was **abducted**.

#### torture

 the act of causing intense pain or suffering to someone to punish them, extract information from them, or for some other reason

synonym: torment, abuse, mistreatment

(1) a **torture** chamber, (2) an instrument of **torture**The use of **torture** is strictly prohibited under international law.

spirit

n. the part of a person which is the seat of their mind, feelings, and character rather than their physical body; the general atmosphere of a place or situation and the effect that it has on people

synonym: soul, attitude, enthusiasm

(1) **spirit** and the letter of the law, (2) an indomitable **spirit** Despite their tragic loss, the family is showing great **spirit**.

# jersey

 a knitted garment typically made of wool or cotton, worn as a shirt or pullover

synonym: shirt, sweater, top

# integrate

v. to combine one thing with another so that they form a whole or work together; to accept equal participation for members of all races and ethnic groups

synonym: mix, merge, combine

He found that it is difficult to **integrate** socially.

#### wisdom

 the quality of being wise, or the ability to use your knowledge and experience to make sensible decisions

synonym: sagacity, discernment, insight

The community greatly respected and sought after the older adult's **wisdom**.

### fulfill

v. to meet the requirements or expectations; to achieve or realize

synonym: satisfy, complete, accomplish

### tradition

 a belief, custom, or way of doing something that has been passed down from generation to generation within a group or society

synonym: custom, practice, ritual

(1) a tradition of a culture, (2) against tradition

It is a **tradition** in many families to have a big Thanksgiving dinner with all their relatives.

# regime

 the organization, a system, or method that is the governing authority of a political unit

synonym: administration, establishment, government

(1) a puppet regime, (2) exercise regime

Totalitarian **regimes** are less likely to innovate because they deprive individuals of economic incentives.

### elite

adj. belonging to the wealthiest, most potent, best-educated, or best-trained group in a society

synonym: privileged, favored, elect

(1) earn **elite** status, (2) **elite** athlete

Very few educational **elites** go to Oxford or Cambridge.

### intellect

 the ability to think logically and comprehend information, especially at an advanced level

synonym: mind, brightness, cleverness

(1) enrich my intellect, (2) human intellect

Your **intellect** is capable of distinguishing among similar objects.

### survivor

a person who remains alive after an event in which others have died

synonym: subsister

(1) ovarian cancer **survivor**, (2) a single **survivor**The shipwreck **survivor** was rescued after floating in the ocean for three days.

cot

 a small bed for a baby or child, typically with high sides to prevent the child from falling out

synonym: bed, bunk, pallet

(1) cot in the tent, (2) baby's cot

The hospital provides **cots** for patients' families who want to stay overnight.

# refugee

 a displaced person who has crossed national borders and who cannot or is unwilling to return home due to political, religious, or economic reasons or because of a war

synonym: emigrant, evacuee, exile

(1) global **refugee** crisis, (2) the **refugee** camp The community warmly welcomed the **refugees**.

# fragment

- n. a small piece or part broken off or detachedsynonym: piece, shard, segment
- (1) **fragment** of a text, (2) a broken **fragment**The archaeologist carefully pieced together the tiny **fragments** of pottery found at the dig site.

### reunion

 a social occasion or party for a group of people who have not seen each other for a long time; the act of coming together again

synonym: social gathering, alum association

### decide

### studio

 a room or building where creative or artistic work is produced; a television or radio production company

# lift

synonym: workshop, atelier, room

(1) a photo **studio**, (2) music **studio** 

She works at a recording **studio** in Los Angeles.

clap

v. to hit your hands together and make a short and loud noise, mainly to show your approval or praise

synonym: applaud, spat, acclaim

(1) **clap** my hands, (2) **clap** a book shut We **clapped** along with the singer's song.

rhythm

 a strong regular repeated pattern of sounds, words, or musical notes that are used in music, poetry, and dancing

synonym: beat, cadence, tempo

- (1) in samba **rhythm**, (2) irregular heart **rhythm** He beat out a jazz **rhythm** on the cajones.
- a mythical being of folklore and romance usually depicted as having magic powers

synonym: sprite, pixie, elf

(1) fairy tale, (2) a water fairy

The mischievous **fairy** flew gracefully through the forest, spreading magic wherever she went.

pixie

fairy

a mythical creature, often depicted as a small,
 mischievous, and playful fairy-like being with pointed ears, sometimes associated with forests or nature

synonym: imp, fairy, sprite

The little girl dressed up as a mischievous **pixie** for Halloween.

silk

 a fine, strong, soft, lustrous fiber produced by silkworms in making cocoons and collected to make thread and fabric

# atrocity

- n. brutal act; an extremely wicked or cruel actsynonym: evil, horror, iniquity

# pray

# absolute

adj. perfect or complete or to the most considerable degree possible

# opportune

- adj. suitable or happening at a time that is suitable or convenient for a particular purposesynonym: suitable, timely, practical

# provider

 a person or an organization that supplies somebody with something needed or wanted

*synonym*: supplier

(1) an information **provider**, (2) the **provider** of the family People select Internet **providers** not only in terms of price but also in terms of transmission speed.

#### finance

n. the management of money, credit, banking, and investments, especially by a government or commercial organization; the branch of economics that studies the management of money and other assets

synonym: banking, investment, fund

(1) finance act, (2) manage my finances

Our company decided to hire an advisor who specializes in **finance**.

### extreme

adj. very great in amount or degree

synonym: farthermost, outermost, fierce

(1) extreme sports, (2) extreme weather events

Solar gravity creates **extreme** pressures and temperatures.

### parliament

 a legislative body, especially the one that represents the people of a country or state

synonym: congress, assembly, legislature

(1) disband **parliament**, (2) event of a hung **parliament** He was a member of **parliament**.

### institutionalize

v. to establish or make something a part of an institution (= a place such as a university, hospital, etc.)

synonym: formalize, establish, regularize

(1) **institutionalize** a system, (2) **institutionalize** customary laws

The new policy aims to **institutionalize** the use of renewable energy sources.

### gender

n. the range of characteristics of femininity and masculinity and differentiating between them, especially when considering social and cultural differences rather than differences in biology

*synonym*: sexuality

(1) **gender-blind** policies, (2) dual **gender** 

Cultural norms strongly influence gender expectations.

### equity

n. the value of the shares issued by a company

synonym: fairness

(1) private **equity** firm, (2) **equity** capital market

trap

 a piece of equipment or hole for catching animals or people; (verb) to catch animals or people and prevent them from escaping

synonym: catch, snare, pinfall

(1) set a **trap**, (2) **trap** an animal

The enemy fell right into the trap.

# principle

 a fundamental law or truth that explains or controls how something happens or works

synonym: rule, creed, code

(1) **principle** of treatment, (2) **principle** in business Efficiency isn't an essential **principle** here; fairness is.

diversity

 the quality or fact of many different types of things or people being included in something; a range of different things or people

synonym: variety, multiplicity, variousness

(1) the **diversity** policy of the university, (2) lingual **diversity** He was impressed by the range and **diversity** of the collection.

### tolerance

 the willingness to accept or tolerate something, especially something that is different or unpleasant

synonym: acceptance, patience, forbearance

religious tolerance, (2) tolerance for risk
 The school's diversity program aimed to promote tolerance

and understanding among the students.

# genocide

n. the intentional killing of a large group of people,especially those of a particular ethnic group or nationsynonym: mass murder, extermination, annihilation

(1) **genocide** victims, (2) **genocide** resolution

The international community condemned the **genocide** in the country.

#### extremist

 a person who holds extreme political or religious views and who is willing to use violent or illegal methods to promote those views

synonym: radical, fanatic, zealot

(1) **extremist** political views, (2) radical **extremist**The **extremist** group planned a series of violent attacks to push its agenda.

### minister

a person appointed to or a job of a head of a government department

*synonym*: bishop, official, ambassador

(1) **Minister** for Education, (2) deputy prime **minister** The **minister** occasionally preaches at this church.

# justice

 the quality of being fair and reasonable and treating people equally according to their due

synonym: fairness, equity, impartiality

(1) criminal **justice**, (2) **justice** of Heaven

The judge's ruling was based on the principles of **justice** and fairness.

#### incite

v. to encourage, stir up, or provoke someone to do something; to urge, instigate, or stimulate someone to take action, often negative or aggressive

synonym: provoke, stimulate, encourage

(1) incite violence, (2) incite rebellion

The politician's speech seemed designed to **incite** anger and unrest among the crowd.

### convict

- to prove or declare someone to be guilty of a crime; (noun) a person serving a sentence in a jail or prison synonym: condemn, sentence, judge
- (1) **convict** him of manslaughter, (2) **convict** in a jail He was **convicted** on fraud charges and sentenced to five years in prison.

# side-by-side

adj. describing two or more things that are positioned next to each other, in close proximity, and typically in a parallel manner; (adverb) next to each other, with one thing positioned close to the other

synonym: adjacent, parallel, adjoining

- (1) **side-by-side** comparison, (2) working **side-by-side** The **side-by-side** comparison of the two products revealed significant differences in quality and features.
- an imaginary creature that is large and has various n. human and animal parts; someone or something large and powerful

synonym: giant, freak, behemoth

(1) horde of monsters, (2) monster film This car has a **monster** engine.

#### sham

something that is not as good or true as it seems to be n. and is intended to deceive people; a person who pretends to be something they are not

synonym: bogus, counterfeit, fraudulent

(1) a **sham** battle, (2) turn out to be all **sham** The data he prepared was completely **sham**.

#### ultimate

- adj. furthest or highest in degree or order *synonym*: highest, maximum, foremost
- (1) the **ultimate** goal in life, (2) the **ultimate** luxury Management must take **ultimate** responsibility for the accident.

# monster

# demagogue

 a political leader who gains power and popularity by appealing to people's emotions, prejudices, and biases, often by making false and misleading claims

*synonym*: agitator, rabble-rouser, provocateur

(1) religious **demagogue**, (2) charismatic **demagogue** The **demagogue's** divisive rhetoric was meant to stir up anger and hatred.

# prey

the object of a hunt; an animal hunted or trapped for eating

synonym: target, quarry, chase

(1) **prey** of beast, (2) become **prey** to terrorists The majority of snakes swallow their **prey** whole.

### vulnerable

adj. capable of being hurt or influenced physically or mentally

*synonym*: susceptible, exposed, weak

(1) a **vulnerable** bridge, (2) **vulnerable** parts of the body Infants and pregnant women are particularly **vulnerable**.

# manipulate

- v. to influence or control something or someone to your advantage, often in an unfair or dishonest way synonym: control, exploit, abuse
- (1) **manipulate** figures, (2) vulnerable to **manipulate** Please tell me how to **manipulate** this computer.

### adolescent

 a young person who is in the process of developing from a child into an adult

synonym: teen, preadult, youth

(1) **adolescent** girl, (2) pre- **adolescent** children Timely education about birth control might help reduce **adolescent** pregnancies.

#### critic

 someone who expresses opinions about the quality of books, music, etc.

synonym: pundit, analyst, attacker

(1) art critic, (2) severe critic

Advocates for legal reform hear less harsh words from their **critics**.

#### invest

v. to put money, effort, time, etc. into something to make a profit or achieve a result

*synonym*: fund, sponsor, support

(1) invest in stocks, (2) invest capital

The government should view children as national assets and actively **invest** in them.

#### isolate

v. to physically or socially separate someone or something from other people or things

synonym: separate, sequester, insulate

(1) **isolate** a compound, (2) **isolate** a patient

You should not **isolate** them from the community.

#### viol

 a stringed instrument, typically with six strings and frets, played with a bow, also called a viola da gamba

synonym: viola, viola da gamba, string instrument

(1) viol instrument, (2) viol music

The viol player was rehearsing for an upcoming concert.

### victim

 a person who has been harmed, injured, or otherwise negatively affected by a particular action, circumstance, or event

synonym: prey, target, sufferer

(1) **victim** support, (2) **victim** compensation

The **victim** of the crime deserves justice and support to recover from the trauma.

### invisible

adj. impossible or nearly impossible to see

*synonym*: hidden, imperceptible, unseen

(1) an invisible asset, (2) invisible stars

The phenomenon is **invisible** at optical wavelengths.

# disempower

 to deprive of power, authority, or influence, to make someone or something less powerful or effective

# possibility

#### enormous

adj. extremely large or greatsynonym: huge, giant, gigantic

# infinite

adj. unlimited or very great; impossible to measure synonym: boundless, countless, limitless

infinite appetite, (2) infinite in supply

#### acumen

 the ability to make sound judgments and quick decisions, especially when it comes to business or financial matters

synonym: keenness, insight, sagacity

#### moral

adj. concerned with the principles of what is right and wrong, fairness, honesty, etc.

synonym: honest, ethical, conscientious

# imaginary

adj. existing only in someone's mindsynonym: fictional, ideal, fantastical

# perspective

a confident attitude toward something; a particular style of thinking about something

synonym: viewpoint, standpoint, outlook

- slum n. a heavily populated urban area characterized by poor, run-down housing and infrastructure, often associated

# graffiti
