# keystroke

 a single press or strike of a key on a computer keyboard or other electronic device

synonym: keypress, type

accidental keystroke,
 random keystroke
 accidentally hit the wrong keystroke and lost all of my

unsaved work.

#### creditor

- n. a person, company, etc. to whom a debtor owes money
- (1) the **creditor's** claims, (2) bankrupt **creditor** I asked the lawyer to initiate **creditor** negotiations for voluntary liquidation.

infect

v. to affect a person, an animal, or a plant with a disease-causing organism

*synonym*: pollute, contaminate, affect

(1) **infect** other animal species, (2) **infect** a computer with a virus

Children often **infect** parents with this head cold.

#### motto

a phrase or slogan that expresses a guiding principle or goal

synonym: slogan, catchphrase, phrase

(1) the **motto** for safe traffic, (2) company **motto** 

The company's **motto** is "Innovation and Service," which is reflected in its products and customer support.

#### hacktivism

n. (the combination of "hacking" and "activism") the use of hacking or cyber-attacks to promote or advance a particular social or political cause or agenda synonym: cyberactivism, digital activism

# (1) hacktivism threats, (2) online hacktivism

The rise of **hacktivism** movements has led to an increased focus on cyber defense by governmental organizations.

## encrypt

v. to convert information or data into a code, thereby making it unreadable without a key or password; to conceal or obscure information in a way that makes it inaccessible to unauthorized persons

synonym: encode, cipher, scramble

(1) encrypt data, (2) encrypt message

To protect their sensitive information, many businesses **encrypt** their files.

#### totalitarian

adj. of or relating to a system of government in which a single political party has complete control and power

synonym: dictatorial, authoritarian, oppressive

(1) totalitarian ideology, (2) totalitarian state

The government was criticized for having a **totalitarian** regime.

## dissident

 a person who opposes the policies or actions of a government or other authority, often publicly and openly; a rebel or revolutionary

synonym: dissenter, rebel, protester

(1) dissident activities, (2) outspoken dissident

The government's security forces constantly monitored the **dissident** politician.

# trustworthy

adj. reliable and dependable

synonym: reliable, dependable, honest

(1) trustworthy ally, (2) trustworthy source

People tend to believe trustworthy friends with their secrets.

#### snoop

v. to investigate or pry into something in a stealthy or nosy manner; to snoop through someone else's possessions or property

synonym: spy, pry, eavesdrop
