## centigrade

- a system of temperature measurement in which the freezing point of water is 0 degrees and the boiling point of water is 100 degrees; also known as the Celsius scale
- (1) **centigrade** scale, (2) **centigrade** thermometer The temperature reached a peak of 35 degrees **centigrade**.

## dither

v. to be indecisive or unsure about something; to tremble or shake with nervousness or excitement

synonym: hesitate, waver, vacillate

(1) **dither** over a decision, (2) **dither** in negotiations I couldn't decide what to wear to the party, so I **dithered** over my outfit for hours.

## intellect

 the ability to think logically and comprehend information, especially at an advanced level

synonym: mind, brightness, cleverness

enrich my intellect, (2) human intellect
 Your intellect is capable of distinguishing among similar objects.

## untenable

 adj. cannot be supported or defended against attack or criticism; indefensible

synonym: indefensible, unsustainable

(1) **untenable** situation, (2) **untenable** amount of debt The proposal was deemed **untenable** due to financial constraints.

## dubious

- *adj.* having doubts or reservations; uncertain *synonym*: uncertain, questionable, skeptical
- (1) **dubious** credibility, (2) direct a **dubious** look
  The evidence presented in court had a **dubious** origin, raising questions about its authenticity.

## bygone

adj. belonging to an earlier time; from a previous era or period

*synonym*: past, former, old-fashioned

(1) bygone civilization, (2) bygone traditions

The historian studied the **bygone** era with great detail.

#### astronomical

 adj. relating to astronomy or the study of celestial bodies and phenomena; very large or immense in scale or magnitude

synonym: huge, vast, enormous

(1) **astronomical** observation, (2) **astronomical** numbers The cost of the new equipment was **astronomical** and beyond the company's budget.

to give someone the right to have or do something; to

give a title to someone or something

synonym: allow, permit, enable

(1) **entitle** him to a pension, (2) **entitle** the company to use the logo

The employee was **entitled** to a week of vacation time.

#### indebted

entitle

adj. owing money or having financial obligations to another person or organization; feeling grateful or obligated to someone for their help, support, or kindness

synonym: owing, obligated, beholden

- (1) **indebted** to creditors, (2) financially **indebted**He felt **indebted** to his parents for all the sacrifices they had made for him.
- a tool with a metal blade that is usually attached to a wooden handle and is used for chopping wood or other materials

*synonym*: hatchet, chopper, tomahawk

(1) chop wood with an **ax**, (2) an **ax** in the toolbox He used an **ax** to chop the firewood for the campfire.

#### doom

*n.* death, destruction, or some other terrible situation that cannot be avoided

synonym: judgment, destiny, fate

(1) economic **doom**, (2) prophet of **doom** 

Everyone was aware of the impending **doom** but was unable to prevent it.

#### solvable

adj. capable of being solved or resolved; able to be fixed or resolved with effort, skill, or knowledge

synonym: attainable, resolvable, achievable

(1) **solvable** problem, (2) mathematically **solvable** equation The engineers found the technical glitch in the system was quite **solvable** with a software update.

## beehive

 a structure or container where bees live and store their honey

synonym: hive, apiary, honeycomb

(1) disturb a **beehive**, (2) get rid of a **beehive**The beekeeper checked the **beehive** for any signs of disease.

termite

 a small, pale social insect that feeds on wood and can cause significant damage to wooden structures and furniture

synonym: woodworm, white ant, insect

(1) **termite** damage, (2) **termite** inspection

The house was infested with **termites** and required extensive repairs.

#### mound

 a raised area of ground or dirt, often used for burial, construction, or as a fortification; a large, rounded pile or heap

synonym: hill, knoll, rise

The team discovered a hidden **mound** in the desert.

## sibling

 a brother or sister; member of a family born to the same parents

*synonym*: brother, sister, relative

(1) have a **sibling** quarrel, (2) play with my **siblings** Children often copy their parents or elder **siblings**.

## kinship

n. the state or fact of being related to someonesynonym: family, relationship, connection

(1) **kinship** ties, (2) **kinship** relations

She felt a sense of **kinship** with her new colleagues.

## miraculous

adj. very effective or lucky, or completely unexpected synonym: amazing, astonishing, awesome

#### mecca

 a city and administrative center of the Mecca Province of Saudi Arabia and the holiest city in Islam

synonym: cynosure, center

#### distort

v. to change something's shape, appearance, or sound so that it appears weird or unclear

synonym: fudge, deform, contort

(1) distort the facts, (2) distort the economy

Economists contend that taxes **distort** consumer behavior in general.

## polarization

 the division or separation of something into two opposing or contrasting groups or factions; the condition of being polarized or having poles

synonym: polarity, division, separation

(1) polarization effect, (2) dielectric polarization

The polarization of political views has created a deep divide

in the country.

## bipartisanship

- agreement or collaboration between two political parties whose policies are normally opposed to one other's
- (1) spirit of **bipartisanship**, (2) **bipartisanship** legislation The prime minister's sister has called for **bipartisanship** to pass the legislation on same-sex marriage.

## rearrange

v. to change the order or position of things already made; to change the time, date, or place of an event already planned

synonym: readjust, reorganize, reconstruct

(1) **rearrange** the furniture, (2) **rearrange** his schedule Please **rearrange** these files as we start a new project tomorrow.

## bipartisan

adj. involving or supported by both of the main political parties in a country

synonym: neutral, impartial, nonpartisan

(1) promote **bipartisan** cooperation, (2) **bipartisan** agreement

The legislation was passed with **bipartisan** support from both parties.

#### crank

 a mechanical device that converts rotary motion into linear motion or vice versa; an eccentric or unpredictable person

synonym: eccentric, oddball, kook

(1) crank handle, (2) crank caller

The fishing reel had a **crank** that made it easy to reel in the catch.

## republican

n. a person who supports or advocates for a particular form of government, typically one that has an elected head of state rather than a monarch; a member or supporter of the Republican Party in the United States

synonym: conservative, right-winger, rightist

(1) **republican** ideology, (2) **Republican** party Many **republican** lawmakers are advocating for stricter immigration policies.

## retiring

adj. withdrawing from a position or activity, or becoming more secluded or reserved

synonym: shy, leaving, quitting

(1) near **retiring** age, (2) a **retiring** pension

The **retiring** CEO passed on the reins to his successor.

#### thermometer

n. a device used to measure temperature, typically consisting of a glass or plastic tube containing a column of liquid, such as mercury, that rises and falls with changes in temperature

synonym: thermos, gauge, climate gauge

(1) digital **thermometer**, (2) clinical **thermometer**My mother always used a mercury **thermometer** to check our temperature when we were sick.

## plummet

v. to fall or drop suddenly and steeply; to decline rapidly or sharply

synonym: drop, plunge, fall

(1) **plummeting** sales, (2) **plummet** against other major currencies

The stock prices have **plummeted** in the last hour, causing concern for investors.

## anomalous

adj. deviating from what is standard or expected; unexpected or unusual in a way that is difficult to explain

synonym: unusual, peculiar, abnormal

The data from the study was **anomalous** and unexpected.

#### institutionalize

v. to establish or make something a part of an institution (= a place such as a university, hospital, etc.)

synonym: formalize, establish, regularize

laws

The new policy aims to **institutionalize** the use of renewable energy sources.

## polarize

 to cause or become divided into two contrasting or opposite groups, opinions, or positions; to create or intensify a sharp division or conflict

synonym: divide, separate, split

(1) polarize society, (2) polarize opinions

The controversial new law has the potential to **polarize** the entire nation.

## nominate

 to propose someone for a position, especially in politics or an organization, or some honor

*synonym*: appoint, designate, elect

(1) **nominate** him for an award, (2) **nominate** government representatives

The organization **nominated** her to be the next president.

## hyperpartisanship

n. a state of extreme or excessive loyalty and support for a particular political party or ideology, often to the extent that it becomes difficult to engage in constructive dialogue or compromise with those who hold different views

synonym: polarization, partisanship, factionalism

(1) **hyperpartisanship** politics, (2) **hyperpartisanship** on democracy

The media's sensationalism has fueled **hyperpartisanship** in recent years.

#### pun

 a humorous play on words or use of words that sound similar but have different meanings, often for a comedic effect; a form of wordplay

synonym: joke, quip, wordplay

(1) witty pun, (2) silly pun

The comedian's pun had the audience laughing out loud.

#### counteract

v. to act against something to reduce its bad or harmful effects or neutralize it

*synonym*: balance, offset, compensate

(1) **counteract** the effect of poison, (2) **counteract** global warming

Our body's immune system produces antibodies to **counteract** disease.

#### aisle

 a passage between rows of seats in a theater, airplane, or other public building, typically one of two or more running parallel with the main body of the structure

synonym: corridor, passageway, gangway

(1) **aisle** seat, (2) the center **aisle** of a church. She walked down the **aisle** to the front of the church.

#### extrovert

- n. a person who is outgoing, sociable, and confidentsynonym: outgoing, sociable, gregarious
- (1) **extrovert** social skills, (2) natural **extrovert** She intentionally acts like an **extrovert**.

## cajole

- v. to persuade or coax someone through flattery, coaxing, or gentle pleading; to convince someone to do something by using sweet talk or deceptive promises
   synonym: persuade, coax, wheedle
- (1) **cajole** him into an agreement, (2) **cajole** a child into eating vegetables

He tried to cajole his little sister into sharing her toy with him.

## congressperson

 a person who belongs to a congress, especially a member of the US House of Representatives; congressman (congressperson is used to avoid gender discrimination)

synonym: lawmaker, politician, representative

(1) hawkish **congressperson**, (2) former **congressperson**The term of a **congressperson** is two years.

#### descend

v. to move downward and lower; to come from, or to be connected by a relationship of blood

synonym: dip, drop, come down

(1) **descend** a steep hill, (2) **descend** by elevator She was **descended** from an old Italian noble family.

## paralysis

 a condition in which you are unable to move or lose control of part or most of the body because of illness or injury

*synonym*: immobility, stiffness, palsy

(1) moral **paralysis**, (2) **paralysis** in the leg Massive demonstrations lead to total **paralysis** of transportation.

## cling

v. to hold onto something tightly; to be closely attached to someone or something

synonym: stick, adhere, attach

(1) **cling** onto power, (2) **cling** tightly to the skin He **clings** to the hope that he will find a job soon.

## driftwood

 wood that has been carried along by the current of a river or ocean and washed up on shore, often used for decorative purposes or as fuel

synonym: floatwood, beachwood, logwood

A large **driftwood** branch provided a perfect perch for the seagull to rest on.

#### wedlock

n. the state of being married; matrimony

synonym: marriage, union, matrimony

#### unmarried

 adj. not married; single; having not entered into the legal or socially recognized state of marriage

#### whit

- n. a very small or insignificant amount or quantity, often used in the phrase "not a whit," meaning not at all synonym: bit, atom, smidgen

## evangelical

- adj. relating to or advocating a form of Protestant Christianity that emphasizes personal conversion and faith over religious rituals and central authority within the church
   synonym: proselytizing, evangelistic, missionary
- (1) **evangelical** mission, (2) **evangelical** Christian group The **evangelical** pastor delivered a powerful sermon to his congregation.

## **Christ**

 n. the man that Christians believe is the prophet and the son of God, and whose life and sermons form the basis for Christianity

synonym: Savior, Jesus Christ, Jesus

(1) teaching of Christ,(2) before ChristChristmas is the day to celebrate the birth of Christ.

#### smack

- v. to hit something or someone with force, often making a loud noise; to deliver a sharp criticism or rebukesynonym: hit, slap, strike
