#### strike

- to wallop somebody or something with the hand, fist, or weapon; to have an emotional or cognitive impact upon
   synonym: hit, impact, influence
- (1) strike up a conversation, (2) strike a blow We strike to achieve more wages and safer working conditions.

#### deflect

v. to cause something, especially a criticism or attack, to be directed away from someone

synonym: deter, redirect, sidetrack

(1) **deflect** a blow, (2) **deflect** his criticism

The soccer player was able to **deflect** the ball away from the goal.

### threat

 a strong indication or likelihood of harm, danger, or adverse consequences; an expression of intent to inflict harm or injury on someone or something, often made as a means of coercion or intimidation

synonym: menace, danger, hazard

(1) economic **threat**, (2) environmental **threat**The **threat** of severe weather prompted the city to issue an evacuation warning.

wrap

v. to cover or enclose something entirely with paper, cloth, or other material

synonym: surround, cover, bandage

### polar

adj. relating to, or close to, the North or South Pole; characterized by complete opposites

### paralyze

v. to cause a person or part of the body to become unable to move or feel

#### confer

 v. to have a meeting or discussion to come to a decision or agreement or exchange ideas; to bestow something

#### alarm

 a loud noise or an automatic signal that warns people of danger; a device that signals the occurrence of some undesirable event or particular danger

synonym: notice, warning, panic

The **alarm** announcing an enemy attack went off this morning.

### prediction

 the act of predicting the future by reasoning; a statement made about the future

synonym: forecast, anticipation, foretelling

### temperature

- n. the degree of hotness or coldness of a thing or placesynonym: climate, warmth, degree
- (1) extreme **temperatures**, (2) the atmospheric **temperature**

### degree

 a unit of measurement for angles, temperature, or level of proficiency or achievement; a rank or level of

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academic or professional attainment

synonym: level, qualification, diploma

She received her **degree** in psychology from the university.

### centigrade

meter

- a system of temperature measurement in which the freezing point of water is 0 degrees and the boiling point of water is 100 degrees; also known as the Celsius scale
- centigrade scale, (2) centigrade thermometer
   The temperature reached a peak of 35 degrees centigrade.
- a device used to measure the amount of a particular substance or attribute, such as length, volume, or time; (prosody) the accent in a metrical foot of verse

*synonym*: gauge, indicator, rhythm

(1) a gas **meter**, (2) poetic **meter** 

The **meter** on the wall showed that the room was three meters long.

### low-lying

adj. situated at or near ground level; located in an area that is susceptible to flooding or inundation; having a position, status, or condition that is humble or inferior in relation to others

synonym: close to the ground, flat, sea-level

The **low-lying** area near the river is prone to flooding during heavy rain.

### disappear

### dither

synonym: ask, request, summon

#### conservative

 adj. holding traditional views and values and opposed to change or innovation

synonym: traditional, reactionary, cautious

He always makes a **conservative** estimation when predicting future sales.

#### intellect

n. the ability to think logically and comprehend information, especially at an advanced level

*synonym*: mind, brightness, cleverness

#### nation

 a large organized community of people living in a particular country or region and having a particular culture

synonym: country, state, sovereign entity

#### affair

 event, situation, or subject that is significant from a political or public perspective; a secretive or illicit sexual relationship

synonym: matter, incident, fling

(1) current **affairs**, (2) domestic **affairs** 

Some critics say this exhibition will be a big affair.

### welfare

the general health, happiness, and prosperous of a person or group

synonym: well-being, benefit, health

(1) child welfare, (2) a welfare state

She struggled for years to survive without welfare.

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### democracy

 a form of government in which the people have the authority to deliberate and decide legislation, or to choose governing officials to do so

synonym: self-government, republic, commonwealth

(1) **democracy** advocate, (2) principles of **democracy Democracy** often entails inclusive capitalism as well.

#### untenable

 adj. cannot be supported or defended against attack or criticism; indefensible

synonym: indefensible, unsustainable

### affordable

adj. not expensive and able to paysynonym: cheap, reasonable, inexpensive

### dubious

 the branch of social science that deals with the production, consumption, and transfer of goods and services

synonym: social science, finance, business

### demographic

- n. a statistic characterizing that describes people or groups of people based on their age, sex, income, etc.
- (1) demographic analyses, (2) demographic policy

Several **demographic** indicators correlate with care admission.

### bygone

adj. belonging to an earlier time; from a previous era or period

synonym: past, former, old-fashioned

(1) **bygone** civilization, (2) **bygone** traditions

The historian studied the **bygone** era with great detail.

### scary

adj. causing fear or fright; frightening; intimidating synonym: terrifying, frightening, alarming

### graph

n. a picture consisting of a line, lines, points, etc., that shows how two or more sets of certain quantities are related to each other

synonym: chart, diagram, figure

### debt

- n. something, especially money, goods, or services owed by one person to another; the state of owing something synonym: liability, obligation, deficit

### percentage

the number, amount, or rate of something, which is usually the amount per hundred

synonym: rate, ratio, portion

### revolutionary

adj. relating to or characterized by a complete or dramatic change

synonym: radical, innovative, groundbreaking

(1) **revolutionary** change, (2) enforce **revolutionary** justice The **revolutionary** leader inspired others to join the fight for freedom and democracy.

### bang

 to hit or cause to hit something in a way that makes a loud noise

synonym: crash, hit, smash

(1) **bang** his fist on a desk, (2) **bang** a phone down My father tried to **bang** mathematics into my head since childhood.

### process

n. a series of actions or operations performed to achieve a particular outcome or goal; a systematic procedure or approach used to accomplish a specific task or objective; a method of treating milk to make it suitable for consumption or use in other dairy products

synonym: procedure, method, system

(1) **process** improvement, (2) decision-making **process**The **process** for applying for a visa can be lengthy and complicated.

### depression

 a mental condition in which a person feels very unhappy and without hope for the future; a severe recession in an economy or market

synonym: recession, slump, despair

(1) the Great **Depression**, (2) the root problem of her **depression** 

**Depression** symptoms might include a decrease in appetite and weight loss.

### astronomical

 adj. relating to astronomy or the study of celestial bodies and phenomena; very large or immense in scale or magnitude

synonym: huge, vast, enormous

(1) **astronomical** observation, (2) **astronomical** numbers The cost of the new equipment was **astronomical** and beyond the company's budget.

#### sustainable

adj. able to continue or be continued for a long time synonym: continuable, endurable, tolerable

The government should do more to support environmentally **sustainable** agriculture.

### primarily

adv. mainly

synonym: largely, mainly, mostly

(1) intended **primarily** for young people, (2) **primarily** affect adults

All peaceful cooperation is based primarily on mutual trust.

### entitle

v. to give someone the right to have or do something; to give a title to someone or something

synonym: allow, permit, enable

(1) **entitle** him to a pension, (2) **entitle** the company to use the logo

The employee was **entitled** to a week of vacation time.

#### indebted

adj. owing money or having financial obligations to another person or organization; feeling grateful or obligated to someone for their help, support, or kindness

synonym: owing, obligated, beholden

He felt **indebted** to his parents for all the sacrifices they had made for him.

### boom

 a sudden increase in economic activity, or a sudden happening that brings good fortune; a deep, loud, and prolonged sound

The high-technology industry is enjoying a **boom**.

#### retire

v. to withdraw from one's position or occupation, especially because of age

synonym: relinquish, step down, withdraw

### congressional

adj. of or relating to Congress, especially to the Congress of the United States

### realistic

 adj. having or showing a sensible and practical idea that is possible to achieve

synonym: practical, pragmatic, down-to-earth

#### forecast

 a prediction or statement about how something, such as the weather, will develop or what will happen in the future; (verb) to predict the future in advance

synonym: prediction, outlook, (verb) guess

Their team specializes in demand forecasts for our products.

#### trend

 a general direction in which something is changing or developing

synonym: direction, movement, tendency

#### extended

adj. longer than usual or anticipated

synonym: extensive, prolonged, elongated

(1) extended vacation, (2) extended payment

The **extended** airport runways may accommodate larger jets.

### identical

adj. being the exact same one

synonym: duplicate, exact, analogous

(1) pair of **identical** twins, (2) an **identical** equation Infant formulas are nutritionally almost **identical** to a mother's breast milk.

ax

 a tool with a metal blade that is usually attached to a wooden handle and is used for chopping wood or other materials

*synonym*: hatchet, chopper, tomahawk

(1) chop wood with an **ax**, (2) an **ax** in the toolbox He used an **ax** to chop the firewood for the campfire.

moral

adj. concerned with the principles of what is right and wrong, fairness, honesty, etc.

synonym: honest, ethical, conscientious

(1) moral hazard, (2) moral burden

Ethics deals with moral conduct.

### implication

 something that is inferred or indirectly stated; the act or fact of being involved in something

synonym: suggestion, association, conclusion

(1) the **implication** in a crime, (2) the **implication** of a word His poem has a very significant **implication**.

translate

- v. to convert or change words into another language synonym: convert, transcribe, render
- (1) **translate** a document into English, (2) **translate** the emotion to a movement

**Translate** the text from Italian into English.

doom

 death, destruction, or some other terrible situation that cannot be avoided

synonym: judgment, destiny, fate

(1) economic **doom**, (2) prophet of **doom** 

Everyone was aware of the impending **doom** but was unable to prevent it.

hell

the place thought to be where bad people go and are punished after death, often depicted as being located beneath the earth; an extraordinarily unpleasant or difficult place

synonym: inferno, agony, misery

(1) run like hell, (2) hell broke loose

The battlefield became **hell** on earth.

### technique

a particular way or art of doing something that needs skill

*synonym*: approach, procedure, strategy

(1) a **technique** in martial arts, (2) the **technique** applied to construction

Jockey's superior technique brought him victory.

### solvable

adj. capable of being solved or resolved; able to be fixed or resolved with effort, skill, or knowledge

synonym: attainable, resolvable, achievable

(1) **solvable** problem, (2) mathematically **solvable** equation The engineers found the technical glitch in the system was quite **solvable** with a software update.

tragedy

n. an event or situation causing great loss, misfortune, or destruction; a play or literature that deals with a severe and sad event and often ends with the death of the main character

*synonym*: disaster, adversity, calamity

(1) a **tragedy** during work, (2) the aftermath of this **tragedy** Macbeth is a famous **tragedy** by Shakespeare.

### partisan

adj. biased or prejudiced in favor of a particular cause,
 group, or political party; displaying strong support or
 allegiance to a particular side or viewpoint

synonym: biased, prejudiced, one-sided

(1) **partisan** politics, (2) bridge **partisan** differences Her **partisan** beliefs made it difficult for her to consider opposing viewpoints.

mere

adj. used to emphasize how insignificant or minor someone or something is

*synonym*: bare, minor, sheer

(1) **mere** acquaintance, (2) **mere** incident He lost the election by **mere** votes.

### psychology

- n. the scientific study of mind and behavior
- (1) **psychology** experiment, (2) **psychology** of crowd She had a master's degree in **psychology**.

### morality

- n. principles of right and evil or good and bad behaviorsynonym: decency, rectitude, righteousness
- (1) business **morality**, (2) sense of **morality**She found fault with the **morality** of politicians.

### principle

 a fundamental law or truth that explains or controls how something happens or works

synonym: rule, creed, code

(1) **principle** of treatment, (2) **principle** in business Efficiency isn't an essential **principle** here; fairness is.

bind

v. to tie or fasten someone or something tightly with rope, string, etc. so that they cannot move or are held together strongly

synonym: tie, stick to, adhere

(1) **bind** the man's hands, (2) **bind** old letters into a bundle The company's rules **bind** the employee's working hours.

blind

adj. unable to see; unable or unwilling to perceive or understand the true nature of something

synonym: sightless, unseeing, random

(1) **blind** to the beauties, (2) **blind** spot

She was nearly **blind** due to severe diabetes.

#### sacred

 adj. connected with religion or religious purposes; worthy of respect or dedication because of a connection with a god

*synonym*: holy, inviolable, hallowed

(1) sacred music, (2) the halo of a sacred image

This space is a private office **sacred** to the President

### thereby

adv. as a result; consequence of a particular action or set of conditions

synonym: thus, hence, as a result

(1) **thereby-obtained** data, (2) **thereby** improving overall health

The new software will streamline the workflow, **thereby** increasing productivity.

### large-scale

adj. involving many people or things and involving a lot of change or activity

synonym: big, massive, grand

(1) large-scale project, (2) large-scale agriculture

The company is planning to make a **large-scale** expansion of its factory.

### cooperation

 the act or situation of working together with someone towards a shared purpose, benefit, etc.

synonym: collaboration, affiliation, alliance

(1) **cooperation** with strategic partners, (2) thoroughgoing **cooperation** 

The **cooperation** between businesses and universities created this groundbreaking product.

### planet

 any of the nine large celestial bodies that circle in the solar system; any celestial body that revolves around a star

synonym: earth, world, globe

(1) **planet** like the Earth, (2) save the **planet** Mercury is the closest **planet** to the sun.

### beehive

 a structure or container where bees live and store their honey

*synonym*: hive, apiary, honeycomb

(1) disturb a **beehive**, (2) get rid of a **beehive**The beekeeper checked the **beehive** for any signs of disease.

### termite

 a small, pale social insect that feeds on wood and can cause significant damage to wooden structures and furniture

synonym: woodworm, white ant, insect

(1) **termite** damage, (2) **termite** inspection

The house was infested with **termites** and required extensive repairs.

### mound

 a raised area of ground or dirt, often used for burial, construction, or as a fortification; a large, rounded pile or heap

synonym: hill, knoll, rise

(1) mound of dirt, (2) burial mound

The team discovered a hidden **mound** in the desert.

### sibling

 a brother or sister; member of a family born to the same parents

synonym: brother, sister, relative

(1) have a **sibling** quarrel, (2) play with my **siblings** Children often copy their parents or elder **siblings**.

### kinship

- n. the state or fact of being related to someonesynonym: family, relationship, connection
- (1) kinship ties, (2) kinship relationsShe felt a sense of kinship with her new colleagues.

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#### reconstruction

 the process of rebuilding or repairing something that has been damaged or destroyed or of restoring something to its original condition

*synonym*: rebuilding, remodeling, renovation

(1) reconstruction aid, (2) reconstruction aid

The government announced a plan for the **reconstruction** of the city's infrastructure.

#### ancient

adj. relating to the long ago, particularly the historical period preceding the fall of the Western Roman Empire; very old

synonym: archaic, age-old, obsolete

(1) pre-Christian ancient, (2) ancient stories

They have been living near water since **ancient** times.

### hunt

v. to go after and try to catch wild animals to kill them for food, sport, or profit

synonym: chase, pursuit, quest

(1) hunt a job, (2) hunt after knowledge

Hounds hunt their prey by using their keen scent.

### gigantic

adj. extremely large

synonym: huge, enormous, immense

(1) gigantic proportions, (2) gigantic monsters

He was so hungry from the long journey that he had a **gigantic** appetite.

#### miraculous

*adj.* very effective or lucky, or completely unexpected *synonym*: amazing, astonishing, awesome

(1) a **miraculous** encounter, (2) go through a **miraculous** change

He made a miraculous recovery.

### temple

 a place of worship, especially one that is associated with a particular religion or faith; the flat area on either side of the forehead

synonym: shrine, mosque, synagogue

(1) temple complex, (2) a tour guide at the templeHe visited the temple to pray and make offerings to the gods.

#### mecca

 a city and administrative center of the Mecca Province of Saudi Arabia and the holiest city in Islam

synonym: cynosure, center

(1) tourist **mecca**, (2) **mecca** for surfers

The building has become a **mecca** for fans of the movie.

#### electrical

adj. relating to electricity

(1) an **electrical** storm, (2) degree in **electrical** engineering Actuators convert **electrical** pulses into motion.

### magnetic

adj. having the properties of attracting or repelling certain materials containing iron or steel

synonym: attractive, drawing, hypnotic

(1) magnetic field, (2) a magnetic tape

The magnetic force of the earth keeps our planet spinning.

#### distort

v. to change something's shape, appearance, or sound so that it appears weird or unclear

synonym: fudge, deform, contort

(1) distort the facts, (2) distort the economy

Economists contend that taxes **distort** consumer behavior in general.

### separate

- v. to force, take, or pull apart; mark as different synonym: disunite, isolate, ramify
- (1) **separate** video into chapter, (2) **separate** cream from milk

We need to **separate** the aspect of his personality from the part of his competence when making an investment decision.

evil

 adj. profoundly immoral, cruel, and wicked; having or exerting a harmful effect on people

synonym: malign, corruption, immorality

(1) **evil** ways, (2) a charm against **evil** Corruption is an **evil** act for any reason.

### satisfy

v. to make somebody pleased by giving them what they want or need

synonym: please, amuse, meet

(1) **satisfy** a desire, (2) **satisfy** a user's needs Did this response **satisfy** your request?

### gross

adj. being the total amount of something before any deductions; obese and ugly or unpleasant

*synonym*: before tax, total, abhorrent

(1) the gross amount, (2) gross injustice

The drastic reorganization has significantly increased this company's **gross** profits.

### distortion

 the alteration or misrepresentation of something so that it is no longer true or accurate; the way in which a sound or image is changed or distorted

synonym: twist, deformity, misrepresentation

(1) **distortion** of the earth's surface, (2) horizontal **distortion** 

Her report was criticized as a gross distortion of the truth.

### electromagnetic

- adj. of or relating to the magnetism produced by electric charge in motion
- (1) **electromagnetic** radiation, (2) **electromagnetic** properties

His hypothesis concerns the role of an **electromagnetic** field in human health.

### congress

 a formal meeting of the representatives of different countries, constituent states, organizations, trade unions, political parties, or other groups

synonym: legislature, parliament, assembly

**Congress** must consider this proposal in an unusual situation.

#### strict

adj. strongly limiting someone's freedom; allowing no deviation from a standard, rule, belief, etc.

synonym: rigorous, inflexible, relentless

#### axis

 a real or imaginary straight line through a body or figure around which the object turns; a group of countries in special alliance

synonym: central, core, pole

The earth's **axis** of rotation is tilted 66.5 degrees to the ecliptic plane.

### extraordinary

adj. exceptional, unexpected, very unusual; surpassing the ordinary or usual

synonym: exceptional, noteworthy, astonishing

### historic

*adj.* famous or significant in history, or potentially so *synonym*: memorable, momentous, historical

### polarization

 the division or separation of something into two opposing or contrasting groups or factions; the condition of being polarized or having poles

synonym: polarity, division, separation

in the country.

### bipartisanship

- agreement or collaboration between two political parties whose policies are normally opposed to one other's
- (1) spirit of **bipartisanship**, (2) **bipartisanship** legislation The prime minister's sister has called for **bipartisanship** to pass the legislation on same-sex marriage.

### grand

*adj.* important and large in size, scope, or extent *synonym*: impressive, great, ambitious


