## genetics

## embryo

 an animal organism in the early stages of growth, either in its mother's womb or in an egg, or a plant that is developing in a seed

## dissociation

 n. the separation of ideas, emotions, or memories from a person's consciousness; a process by which molecules or compounds separate into smaller units or individual atoms

## gland

breast

#### acinus

## nipple

#### electron

- n. a tiny particle with the negative electrical chargesynonym: negatron

### microscope

 an instrument used to see objects or substances that are too small to be seen with the naked eye

synonym: lens, magnifier, eyepiece

## gob

 a lump or chunk of a substance; a large amount of something, especially in the sense of an excess or surplus; a colloquial term for mouth

## pregnant

adj. having a baby or young animal developing in the uterussynonym: expectant

## droplet

n. a small drop of liquid

synonym: bead, drip, dewdrop

#### nucleus

the central and most important part of something;
 (biology) a part of the cell containing DNA and RNA and responsible for growth and reproduction; (physics) the very dense central region of an atom

synonym: core, heart, middle

(1) form a **nucleus**, (2) the **nucleus** of a team DNA is stored in the **nucleus** of a cell.

#### override

v. to use one's authority or power to cancel or disregard something, especially a decision or rule made by someone else

synonym: overrule, annul, nullify

#### insane

## skepticism

sect

 a group of people who follow a particular religious or philosophical belief system, especially one that is regarded as outside the norm or mainstream

synonym: group, faction, cult

The minority **sect** believed in a set of unconventional religious practices.

#### structural

adj. associated with the way on construction or organization of anything

synonym: architectural, basic, anatomical

#### matrix

goo

#### behold

v. to look at and observe with attention

synonym: see, observe, watch

## reorganize

v. to change to a more sufficient or suitable form of organization

synonym: rearrange, reconstruct, reshuffle

(1) **reorganize** a department, (2) **reorganize** his debts

The new CEO was appointed to **reorganize** their business.

#### vivo

adj. alive or existing in a living organism or system; relating to or involving "live" organisms or systems, particularly in scientific research or experimentation

synonym: alive, living, animate

## hypothesis

 a proposed idea or explanation that is based on a few known facts but has not yet been proven to be true or accurate

*synonym*: assumption, conjecture, theory

This evidence supports the big-bang hypothesis.

## distinguish

v. to notice or understand the difference between two people or things

synonym: determine, differentiate, characterize

## dimension

 a measurable extent of a particular kind, such as width, height, or length

synonym: extent, measurement, size

gel

## magnify

## phenotype

## fuzzy

adj. having a soft and indistinct outline or covered with fine, soft, and hairlike fibers

#### inhibitor

 a substance or agent that slows down or prevents a chemical reaction or biological process from occurring at normal rates, often used in medicine or industrial applications to control or regulate various functions or reactions
