folk

representation

rhinoceros

 (also rhino) a large, thick-skinned mammal with one or two horns on the nose, typically found in Africa and Asia.

synonym: rhino, horned beast, pachyderm

elect

v. to choose someone for a specific position by voting for them; to decide or choose to do something

industrious

- adj. hardworking, diligent, and persistent in effort synonym: diligent, hardworking, assiduous

surveillance

 the act of carefully monitoring a person suspected of a crime or a place where a crime may be committed or expected

synonym: administration, overseeing, control

a part of the psyche that represents the unconscious n. desires and instincts of an individual; in psychoanalytic theory, it is believed to be the most basic and primal part of the human psyche; (also ID, short for identification) a document or card that proves a person's identity, such as a driver's license, passport, or national ID card

synonym: identity, ego, persona
