#### introduction

n. a preliminary explanation or remarks given before the start of a text, performance, or event; the act of bringing something new into existence or introducing something to a wider audience or new market

synonym: initiation, preamble, prologue

(1) introduction education, (2) self-introduction

The **introduction** to the new class was informative and engaging.

#### ken

n. knowledge, perception, understanding, or range of sight;(verb) to be aware of or know

synonym: knowledge, understanding, familiarity

(1) within my ken, (2) ken of the person

He had a good **ken** of the city and could easily find his way around.

### dissatisfy

v. to fail to satisfy someone

synonym: disappoint, disgruntle, dishearten

(1) **dissatisfy** the users with bugs, (2) **dissatisfy** people with service

The company's results dissatisfy everyone.

#### institutionalize

v. to establish or make something a part of an institution (= a place such as a university, hospital, etc.)

synonym: formalize, establish, regularize

(1) **institutionalize** a system, (2) **institutionalize** customary laws

The new policy aims to **institutionalize** the use of renewable energy sources.

hell

n. the place thought to be where bad people go and are punished after death, often depicted as being located beneath the earth; an extraordinarily unpleasant or difficult place

synonym: inferno, agony, misery

(1) run like hell, (2) hell broke loose

The battlefield became **hell** on earth.

### brokerage

n. the business of buying and selling goods or services on behalf of others, often for a commission or fee; the activity of acting as an intermediary or agent in negotiations or deals between two parties

synonym: agency, firm, house

(1) mortgage **brokerage**, (2) international **brokerage** I need to contact a **brokerage** firm to help me invest my money.

### profitable

adj. making or likely to make material gain or profit synonym: advantageous, beneficial, thriving

(1) a profitable job, (2) profitable trade

The Prohibition amendment made bootlegging profitable.

### procedure

 a way of doing something, especially the official or well-known way

synonym: action, approach, course

(1) undergo a surgical **procedure**, (2) standard **procedure**The pilot and flight attendant ran through the check-out **procedure**.

### script

a written text of a film, play, broadcast, or speech;something written by hand

synonym: writing, penmanship, article

(1) a hand **script**, (2) the **script** of a play

The archaeologist found a hieratic Egyptian **script** on a stone monument.

#### welfare

*n.* the general health, happiness, and prosperous of a person or group

*synonym*: well-being, benefit, health

(1) child welfare, (2) a welfare state

She struggled for years to survive without welfare.

#### educated

*adj.* having received a high standard of education *synonym*: knowledgeable, erudite, enlightened

(1) educated adult, (2) educated speech

Excellent speech is a characteristic of an **educated** man.

### judge

 a person who makes decisions in a court of law; (verb) to determine the result of or form a critical opinion of something

synonym: arbiter, justice, (verb) deduce

(1) judge a competition, (2) an associate judge

The strict **judge** ruled in favor of the plaintiff in the case.

### mandatory

*adj.* required by a rule or law, compulsory *synonym*: compulsory, obligatory, required

(1) a mandatory clause, (2) mandatory training

Attendance at the meeting is mandatory for all employees.

#### impose

v. to officially force a new law, tax, duty, etc. to be obeyed or received

synonym: charge, levy, foist

(1) **impose** harsher sanctions, (2) **impose** tariffs

The problem with achievement tests is the narrowness they **impose** on students.

rely

v. to require a specific thing or the assistance and support of someone or something to continue, run properly, or succeed.

synonym: depend, count, lean

 rely on convenience stores, (2) rely entirely on him Babies heavily rely on others for food.

### judgment

the ability to form valuable opinions and make reasonable decisions

synonym: conclusion, decision, determination

(1) an emotional **judgment**, (2) deliver a **judgment** Her **judgments** are consistently rational and sensible.

#### creditor

- n. a person, company, etc. to whom a debtor owes money
- the creditor's claims, (2) bankrupt creditor
   asked the lawyer to initiate creditor negotiations for voluntary liquidation.

fee

- n. a sum of money charged for a particular servicesynonym: charge, cost, expense
- (1) **fee** calculation, (2) service **fee**The lawyer's **fee** for the case was \$10,000.

#### indifferent

adj. having no strong feelings or preferences one way or the other, neutral

synonym: apathetic, disinterested, unmoved

(1) an **indifferent** glance, (2) emotionally **indifferent** Despite the good news, she remained **indifferent** to the situation.

#### addition

the act or process of adding something to something else; the process of adding numbers

synonym: accumulation, expansion, addendum

(1) chemical **addition**, (2) **addition** of vectors In **addition**, private corporations provide healthcare services.

#### incentive

*n.* something, such as a punishment, reward, etc., that encourages a person to do something

synonym: encouragement, inducement, enticement

(1) financial **incentives**, (2) an **incentive** to work hard They have no **incentive** to win the game.

### magic

 beliefs and actions employed to influence supernatural beings and forces; any art or performance that invokes supernatural powers

synonym: fascination, illusion, wizardry

(1) a magic spell, (2) she is magic

He performed **magic** tricks with sophisticated moves.

#### bonus

an extra amount of money that is added to payment as a present or reward for good work

synonym: extra, perk, compensation

(1) **bonus** appraisal, (2) annual **bonus** 

The committee abolished the controversial **bonus** system.

#### grade

n. a particular level of quality, size, importance, etc.

synonym: score, rate, degree

(1) boys in the twelfth **grade**, (2) students at all **grade** levels Departments may set requirements for a higher **grade** point average.

#### evaluate

v. to assess or estimate the quality, significance, quantity, or value of something

synonym: assess, estimate, consider

(1) **evaluate** the grant proposal, (2) **evaluate** a situation The meeting aims to **evaluate** possible choices.

stick

v. to put something, usually a sharp object, into something; to restrict yourself to doing or using one certain thing and not change; (noun) a thin piece of wood or other material

synonym: pierce, adhere, stay

(1) **stick** a key in a lock, (2) fire **stick** 

You **stick** a bill in the change machine, and the coins pop out.

#### bunch

 a grouping of several similar things which are growing or fastened together

synonym: group, assemblage, bundle

(1) a **bunch** of trees, (2) a **bunch** of schoolgirls One bad apple spoils the whole **bunch**.

#### industrious

adj. hardworking, diligent, and persistent in effort synonym: diligent, hardworking, assiduous

(1) **industrious** worker, (2) **industrious** student He was known to be very **industrious** and would often work late into the night.

### collapse

v. to fall down or give way suddenly, often after breaking apart

synonym: tumble, spill, bankruptcy

(1) the stock market **collapsed**, (2) ready to **collapse**The roof finally **collapsed** after three days and three nights of heavy snowfall.

#### consume

v. to spend something, especially fuel, energy, or time, in a large amount

synonym: absorb, ingest, use up

(1) **consume** a large of alcohol, (2) **consume** electricity A smaller car will **consume** less fuel.

### agency

n. an organization or business that is responsible for specific activities or services, especially when representing other organizations or businesses; the capacity or power to act or exert influence; the ability to make decisions and take action

synonym: organization, bureau, institution

(1) real estate **agency**, (2) intelligence **agency**The government **agency** regulated the country's food and drug safety standards.

#### temporarily

adv. for a limited time only or not permanently

synonym: for a time

(1) a hut made **temporarily**, (2) **temporarily** suspend the production

Some athletes take anabolic steroids to increase muscle size **temporarily**.

#### backdoor

 adj. a term used to describe an unauthorized or concealed means of accessing a computer system or network, typically through a loophole or vulnerability in the system

synonym: hidden, secret, covert

(1) backdoor access, (2) backdoor software

The public was outraged to discover that the company had made a **backdoor** deal with the government to avoid taxes.

### improve

v. to make or become better

synonym: enhance, ameliorate, enrich

(1) **improve** a process, (2) **improve** the test score We want to **improve** ties between our two countries.

### struggle

v. to make a great effort to do something when it is difficult, or there are a lot of problems; to use force or violence to break away from restraint or constriction

synonym: toil, strive, compete

(1) **struggle** against discrimination, (2) **struggle** to get the iob

He could not **struggle** against temptation.

#### profit

*n.* money that is earned in business or by selling things after deducting the costs involved

synonym: earnings, gain, proceeds

(1) gross profit, (2) make a profit

This business yields little profit.

#### cliff

 a steep rock face, especially one at the edge of the sea or a river

*synonym*: crag, escarpment, precipice

(1) a bold cliff, (2) cliff diving

He stood at the edge of the **cliff** and looked out to sea.

#### reign

n. the period of time during which a monarch or government holds power; (verb) to be the king or queensynonym: rule, governance, sovereignty

(1) **reign** of a dictator, (2) **reign** as sovereign

The dictator's **reign** was characterized by widespread human rights abuses and suppression of political opposition.

### argue

v. to express differing opinions or points of view, often in a heated or contentious manner; to present a case or reasoning to persuade or convince others

synonym: debate, dispute, quarrel

(1) argue a case, (2) argue passionately

The couple began to **argue** over which restaurant to go to for dinner.

### specific

adj. clearly defined or particular to a certain thing or situation; distinct, explicit, and precise

synonym: particular, definite, distinct

(1) **specific** instructions, (2) industry- **specific** regulations The scientist conducted a study that provided **specific** details about the species' behavior.

#### monitor

v. to observe, check, and track the progress or quality of something over a period of time

synonym: proctor, check, observe

(1) **monitor** an exam, (2) **monitor** the data carefully They used a special receiver to **monitor** police radio channels.

#### enforce

v. to make sure that people obey a particular law, rule, or situation

*synonym*: execute, implement, administer

(1) **enforce** the law, (2) **enforce** a contract

Governments make rules, and police **enforce** them.

#### crack

v. to break or cause to break without dividing into separate parts; (noun) a line on the surface of something along which it has separated without breaking

synonym: snap, burst, break

(1) **crack** an eggshell, (2) a **crack** in a board He that would eat the kernel must **crack** the nut.

#### naive

adj. showing unaffected simplicity and lack of experience, wisdom, or judgment

synonym: innocent, unsophisticated, gullible

(1) **naive** belief, (2) **naive** mistake

The con artist's lies quickly took in the **naive** young man.

#### marvel

 someone something that causes feelings of wonder or surprise

synonym: wonder, phenomenon, amazement

(1) a **marvel** of beauty, (2) technical **marvel** 

The space shuttle is a modern engineering **marvel**.

### desperately

adv. in a way that shows a lack of hope and a willingness to do anything because of the problematic situation; with great urgency

synonym: urgently, perilously, seriously

(1) **desperately** anxious, (2) **desperately** ill patient The baby clung **desperately** to her mother.

#### virtue

- n. high moral standards in behavior or attitudessynonym: integrity, probity, goodness
- (1) virtue of frugality, (2) acquire a virtue

She had many good **virtues** and few faults.

### practical

adj. of or connected with actual use or real situation rather than with theory and ideas

synonym: applicable, functional, realistic

(1) practical English, (2) gain practical experience

Her concept is highly **practical** and helpful.

#### wisdom

 the quality of being wise, or the ability to use your knowledge and experience to make sensible decisions

synonym: sagacity, discernment, insight

(1) a fountain of wisdom, (2) wisdom literature

The community greatly respected and sought after the older adult's **wisdom**.

#### moral

adj. concerned with the principles of what is right and wrong, fairness, honesty, etc.

synonym: honest, ethical, conscientious

(1) moral hazard, (2) moral burden

Ethics deals with moral conduct.

#### craftsman

 a skilled worker who creates handmade objects, especially one who works with wood, metal, or other materials

synonym: artisan, mechanic, workman

(1) craftsman skill, (2) a subtle craftsman

The adept **craftsman** carefully carved the wooden figurine with precision and skill.

### impressive

*adj.* arousing admiration due to size, quality, or skill *synonym*: impactful, remarkable, exceptional

(1) **impressive** performances, (2) an **impressive** array of facts

The budget reduction was an **impressive** feat for our nation.

### improvise

 to create or perform something on the spot, without preparation or planning; to use what one has available to do or create something

synonym: ad-lib, extemporize

(1) **improvise** a joke, (2) **improvise** an escape plan We had to **improvise** a tent using a tarp and sticks since we didn't have a proper one.

#### novel

 an extended fictional work in prose; usually in the form of a story; (adjective) original and of a kind not seen before

synonym: fiction, story, (adjective) innovative

(1) historical **novel**, (2) **novel** effect

The **novel** has largely gotten positive feedback.

#### anticipate

 to expect or predict that something will happen; to tell in advance

synonym: forecast, predict, expect

(1) **anticipate** your kind cooperation, (2) **anticipate** a black future

We anticipate heavy snowfall tomorrow.

#### stonemason

 a person who works with stone, particularly in the construction and crafting of stone structures, such as buildings, walls, or statues

synonym: mason, stonecutter

(1) skilled **stonemason**, (2) apprentice **stonemason**The talented **stonemason** carved intricate designs into the cathedral's facade.

#### isle

- n. a small island, especially one in the seasynonym: island, atoll, cay
- (1) isle of paradise, (2) tiny isle

I love to spend my vacations on a beautiful **isle** with pristine beaches.

#### column

n. one of the vertical blocks that split content on a page or screen from top to bottom; an upright pillar that often supports an arch, entablature, or other structure or stands alone as a monument

synonym: line, pillar, cue

(1) the spinal **column**, (2) a **column** of water

The newspaper devoted several **columns** to the affair.

#### fashion

 a style that is popular at a particular time or place; the state of being popular

synonym: style, manner, fad

(1) go out of **fashion**, (2) new **fashion** trends

That style is no longer in **fashion**.

### tap

v. to hit someone or something quickly, gently, and often repeatedly; to use existing resources, such as energy, knowledge, etc.

synonym: knock, exploit, use

(1) **tap** a new market, (2) **tap** keyboard with an index finger To expand the company, we must **tap** new human resources.

#### flexible

 adj. able to change or be changed to suit new conditions or situations; able to bend easily

synonym: adaptable, elastic, pliable

(1) flexible schedules, (2) a flexible wire

You can be more **flexible** and creative in your approach.

### appreciate

- v. to value and acknowledge the worth of someone or something; to be grateful for something or someonesynonym: acknowledge, admire, enjoy
- (1) **appreciate** her feedback, (2) **appreciate** the value We would **appreciate** an early reply.

### flexibility

the quality of changing or being changed easily according to new conditions or situations

synonym: elasticity, adaptability, resilience

(1) mental **flexibility**, (2) the **flexibility** of the body We dealt with those problems with speed and **flexibility**.

### encompass

- v. to surround or cover something completely; to include a large number of or different types of things entirely
   synonym: surround, encircle, include
- (1) **encompass** a broad range, (2) **encompass** the enemy The optimal solution that would **encompass** all these elements has yet to be proposed.

#### jazz

n. a type of music that originated in the African-American community in the United States and that is characterized by improvisation, syncopated rhythms, and a strong emphasis on self-expression

synonym: swing, blues, bebop

(1) jazz club, (2) a school jazz band

He listened to jazz music to relax after a long day at work.

#### combination

a collection of things that have been combined; an assemblage of separate parts or qualities

synonym: blend, hybrid, compounding

(1) genic **combinations**, (2) **combination** number The **combination** to the safe was a secret.

#### fellow

adj. someone who has the same job or interests as you, or is in the same class, profession, or situation as you

synonym: buddy, mate, affiliate

(1) junior **fellow**, (2) nice **fellow** 

He is the kind of **fellow** who only works for his success.

### exception

 something that is not included in a general rule or pattern; a person or thing that is excluded or stands apart from others

synonym: anomaly, rarity, exemption

(1) make an **exception**, (2) without **exception**She was the **exception** to the rule, as she managed to graduate college in only two years.

### improvisation

 the act of making something up on the spot or creating or performing something without preparation

synonym: spontaneity, ad-lib, extemporization

(1) **improvisation** on stage, (2) jazz **improvisation** He created a beautiful piece of music using only **improvisation**.

#### interaction

 the act of connecting with someone, mainly when working, playing, or spending time with them synonym: dealings, exchange, relations

- (1) the **interaction** between man and his environment,
- (2) **interaction** among human beings

The **interaction** of the two groups is good for brainstorming.

#### aim

- v. to try or plan to get or achieve something synonym: aspire, direct, target
- (1) **aim** at a specific target, (2) **aim** to be a nurse We **aim** for an overseas expansion.

#### ruthless

adj. lacking in pity or compassion; willing to do whatever it takes to achieve their goals, regardless of the consequences for others

synonym: heartless, pitiless, merciless

(1) show **ruthless** behavior, (2) **ruthless** brutality
The dictator was known for his **ruthless** tactics and had no qualms about using violence to maintain power.

### manipulate

- v. to influence or control something or someone to your advantage, often in an unfair or dishonest way
   synonym: control, exploit, abuse
- (1) **manipulate** figures, (2) vulnerable to **manipulate** Please tell me how to **manipulate** this computer.

### comprise

v. to include or consist of something; the act of making up or forming something

synonym: consist of, include, be composed of

(1) **comprise** a large percentage, (2) **comprise** the recent past

The team **comprises** players from different countries.

#### wage

- n. a particular amount of money that somebody earns, usually every week or every month, for work or servicessynonym: payment, compensation, salary
- (1) unpaid **wages**, (2) increase in the minimum **wage** His **wages** continued to rise as his skills improved.

### parochial

adj. related to or characteristic of a small or narrow-minded community, often referring to a geographic location or mindset; having limited or narrow knowledge or experience of the world outside one's immediate surroundings

synonym: narrow-minded, insular, provincial

(1) parochial views, (2) parochial community

The **parochial** attitude of the small town made it difficult for outsiders to feel welcome.

### panic

 a sudden strong feeling of fear that cannot be controlled and prevents reasonable thought and action

synonym: confusion, hysteria, consternation

(1) a panic reaction, (2) panic buying

The participation of oil-producing countries in the war caused **panic** in the financial markets.

#### cab

 a taxi or other vehicle that can be hired for transportation; the compartment from which a vehicle, such as a train or truck, is driven

synonym: taxi, hack, cabriolet

(1) taxi cab, (2) yellow cab

I hailed a **cab** to take me to the airport.

### gunpoint

the point of a gun, used as a threat or in an armed robbery

*synonym*: point, muzzle

(1) held at gunpoint, (2) gunpoint robbery

The robbers demanded money from the store clerk at **gunpoint**.

toy

 a thing, typically a small model or replica of something that is played with, especially by children

*synonym*: plaything, game, trinket

(1) **toy** store, (2) **toy** box

He gave his daughter a new toy for her birthday.

#### convict

v. to prove or declare someone to be guilty of a crime;(noun) a person serving a sentence in a jail or prisonsynonym: condemn, sentence, judge

(1) **convict** him of manslaughter, (2) **convict** in a jail He was **convicted** on fraud charges and sentenced to five years in prison.

### guideline

n. a general rule or principle that provides guidance to appropriate behavior; a piece of advice or instructions that tell you how something should be done or what something should be

synonym: policy, direction, protocol

(1) an education **guideline**, (2) **guideline** for clinical trial This book will be a practical **guideline** when coding.

#### committed

adj. willing to put in a lot of effort, time, and energy into something; firmly believing in something

synonym: devoted, faithful, attached

(1) in a **committed** relationship, (2) strong and **committed** sales staff

Our company is strongly **committed** to meeting customers' needs.

### responsible

adj. answerable or accountable for something within one's power, control, or management

synonym: accountable, answerable, liable

(1) **responsible** action, (2) **responsible** for a customer service

She's a **responsible** pet owner who ensures her dog gets enough exercise and a healthy diet.

### desperate

adj. feeling or showing a lack of hope and a willingness to do anything because of the problematic situation

synonym: anguish, frantic, hopeless

her desperate screams, (2) desperate attempt
 He was desperate when he lost all his money by gambling.

#### circumstance

the specific conditions or events that surround a particular situation or occurrence

*synonym*: condition, context, environment

(1) **circumstance** of birth, (2) **circumstance** of injury

She explained the **circumstances** surrounding the accident.

#### wreck

 a ship that has sunk or has been destroyed; a vehicle that has been badly damaged in an accident

synonym: collapse, destruction, devastation

(1) the house was a wreck, (2) a worthless wreck
The divers accidentally discovered a wreck on the ocean floor.

#### release

- v. to set free or allow to escape from confinement synonym: free, let go, discharge
- (1) **release** a prisoner, (2) **release** CO2 into the air

  The animal rights group worked to **release** the dolphins back into the wild.

### jail

 a facility where criminals are kept to be punished for their crimes; a prison

synonym: prison, slammer, penitentiary

(1) county jail, (2) be in jail

The police escorted the prisoner to the **jail**.

#### restitution

 n. the act of restoring something that has been lost or stolen to its rightful owner; compensation or reimbursement for loss or damage suffered by someone
 synonym: compensation, restoration, reimbursement

(1) **restitution** of stolen goods, (2) **restitution** for damages The judge ordered the defendant to pay full **restitution** to the victims of the crime.

#### decent

adj. satisfactory, acceptable, or good in a general sense synonym: respectable, honorable, good

(1) yearn for the **decent** living, (2) a **decent** education

He earned a **decent** salary at his job.

#### involve

v. to include or affect someone or something as a necessary part of something else

synonym: implicate, include, engage

(1) **involve** a lot of paperwork, (2) **involve** a high degree of risk

The investigation **involves** several government agencies and is expected to take several months.

#### prosecutor

 a lawyer or official who conducts legal proceedings against someone accused of a crime; a person who brings a criminal case to court on behalf of the state or government

*synonym*: district attorney, state attorney

(1) a public **prosecutor**, (2) deputy **prosecutor**The **prosecutor's** opening statement set the tone for the entire trial.

### ignore

- v. to intentionally not listen or pay attention to synonym: neglect, disregard, shun
- (1) **ignore** her advice, (2) **ignore** a ban Since independence, the area has been completely **ignored**.

#### invention

*n.* the creation of a new device or process resulting from study and experimentation; the act of inventing

*synonym*: creation, design, innovation

(1) the **invention** of new techniques, (2) common **invention** Necessity is the mother of **invention**.

#### appeal

 a serious, earnest, or urgent request for money, information, or help; a quality that makes somebody or something attractive or interest

*synonym*: request, charm, attraction

(1) draw out your **appeal**, (2) an **appeal** for help He needed to resolve the problem as soon as possible, so he made an **appeal** directly.

### robbery

 the taking of property or money from a person, business, or institution by force, threat, or intimidation; a crime that involves theft or stealing

synonym: theft, larceny, burglary

(1) armed **robbery**, (2) petty **robbery** 

The convenience store was the scene of a **robbery** last night.

### quitter

 a person who gives up easily or does not have the determination to finish what they have started

synonym: coward, deserter, surrender

(1) easy quitter, (2) serial quitter

He was labeled as a **quitter** after he abandoned the project halfway.

#### bench

 a long, flat surface, often elevated and supported by legs, used for sitting, working, or displaying objects; persons who administer justice

synonym: seat, terrace, judiciary

(1) bench conference, (2) bench board

I sat on the **bench** in the park and enjoyed the beautiful scenery.

### disappear

- v. to cease to exist or be visible
- synonym: fade, evaporate, vanish
- (1) **disappear** without a trace, (2) **disappear** after a week They watched the train **disappear** into the distance.

#### subversion

the act or process of undermining, overthrowing, or sabotaging a system or government, often through covert or manipulative means; the effort to weaken or destroy established authority or social norms

synonym: undermining, sabotage, treason

(1) subversion tactics, (2) political subversion

The rebel group's **subversion** of the government was successful.

#### consultant

- n. a person who provides professional or expert advicesynonym: expert, advisor, specialist
- (1) consultant firm, (2) chief consultant

We hired a management **consultant** to help us improve our business strategy.

#### boost

- $\nu$ . to improve, raise, or increase something
- *synonym*: raise, advance, promote
- (1) boost the economy, (2) boost flexibility

The new service helped **boost** net income by 10%.

#### elite

- adj. belonging to the wealthiest, most potent, best-educated, or best-trained group in a society
- synonym: privileged, favored, elect
- (1) earn **elite** status, (2) **elite** athlete

Very few educational elites go to Oxford or Cambridge.

### percentage

n. the number, amount, or rate of something, which is usually the amount per hundred

synonym: rate, ratio, portion

(1) the **percentage** of the gold content, (2) a high **percentage** 

What is the **percentage** of the consumption tax in the United States?

### compete

v. to strive to achieve more success than someone or something

synonym: contend, contest, vie

(1) **compete** against a friend, (2) **compete** fiercely

You must **compete** with others to obtain this position.

#### achieve
